SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising the county borough of Brighton; and also comprising the borough of Hove, and the parishes of Portslade-by-Sea, Portslade, Hangleton, West Blatchington, Preston Rural, Patcham, Stanmer, Falmer (including its detached part), Ovingdean and Rottlingdean, in the administrative county of East Sussex; and the parishes of Shoreham-by-Sea, Kingston-by-Sea, and Southwick, in the administrative county of West Sussex.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 17TH APRIL 1916.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Application of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914.

1.—(1.) The provisions of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") are hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, subject to the modifications contained in this Order.

(2.) While this Order remains in operation the Area described in the Schedule hereto shall not form part of any Dipping Area to which provisions requiring the general periodical dipping of sheep are applied by any other Order of the Board.

Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.

2. The dates between which all sheep in the Area described in the Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the principal Order, are hereby fixed to be the fourteenth day of August and the first day of October in each year.

Modification of Part I of Principal Order.

3. Part I of the principal Order shall, in its application to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, be read and have effect as if paragraph (3) of Article 2 of that Order were omitted.

Modification of Part II of Principal Order.

4. Part II of the principal Order shall, in its application to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, be read and have effect as if the following paragraph were inserted in Article 5:—

"(6) The Local Authority may in any case where they think such procedure desir-

able for the purpose of securing the dipping required by this Article serve a notice on the owner or person in charge of any sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. Where such notice is served paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Article shall not apply.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and sixteen.

SCHEDULE.

Area referred to in this Order.

An Area in the administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire, comprising the parishes of Haylewood with Storiths, Blubberhouses, Denton, Middleton, Ikley, Nesfield with Langbar, Beamsley, and Burley in Wharfedale, and such parts of the parishes of Appletreewick, Beverley, Thornthwaite with Padside, Turnscross, Barden, Bolton Abbey, Draughton, Addingham, Silsden, Morton, Bingley, Hawksworth, Menston, Otley, Newall with Clifton, Weston, Askwith, Timble Great and Fewston as lie within the following boundary, namely, a boundary commencing at a point in the main road from Steeton to Silsden where it is crossed by the Leeds and Liverpool Canal and proceeding thence in a south-easterly direction along that Canal to Swine Lane Bidge; thence in a northerly and easterly direction along Swine Lane, Carr Lane, Main Road (East Morton), Otley Road and the road in continuation thereof (*via Graincliff reservoir and Mount Hill*) to Intake Gate; thence in a south-easterly direction along Old Lane and Hawksworth Lane to the road leading from Shipley to Otley; thence in a northerly direction along that road (*via White Cross, Fox and Hounds Inn*) to Bradford Road; thence in an easterly direction along that road and Piper Lane, Westgate, Beech Hill and Clapgate to Bridge Street (Otley); thence in a northerly direction along Bridge Street, Billiam's Hill and Newall Carr Road to its junction with Weston Moor Road; thence in a north-westerly and northerly direction along Weston Moor Road, Askwith Moor Road, Sourby Lane, Rues Lane and Cooper Lane, to the road leading from Skipton to Harrogate near St. Andrew's Church, Blubberhouses; thence in an easterly and north-westerly direction along the road (*via Blubberhouses Bridge and Hardisty Hill*) to Stone House Inn; thence continuing in a north-westerly direction along Green How Hill Road, Sandy Gate, Redlish Road or Black Gate and Duck Street Lane to the Post Office near the Church in the main road leading from Pateley Bridge to Hebden; thence in a south-westerly direction along that road *via* Grouse Inn to its junction with New Road, near Fan-carl House; thence in a southerly direction along New Road, Hayler Lane and Stang
