Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915: Extending Time for operation of Section 50 of the Corporation of London (Bridges) Act, 1911.

CITY OF LONDON.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled;—  
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 50 of the Corporation of London (Bridges) Act, 1911 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1911"), it is provided that the powers of the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London, Trustees of the Bridge House Estates (in the Act of 1911 and hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation"), for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of the Act of 1911 shall cease after the expiration of five years from the 18th day of August, 1911:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 1 of the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, and of any other powers in that behalf, by this Our Order extend for a period of one year the time limited by Section 50 of the Act of 1911.
