Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, (1) that the Summer Time Act, 1916, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:

In Sub-section (1) of Section 1 for the words "Great Britain" there shall be substituted the words "The Isle of Man."

In Sub-section (3) of Section 1 after the words "Act of Parliament" there shall be read the words "Act of Tynwald."

In Sub-section (3) of Section 1 the expression "Government Department" shall include the Lieutenant-Governor.

In Section 2 after the words "Summer Time" there shall be read the words "(Isle of Man).''

(2) That the said Act shall be deemed to have taken effect in the Isle of Man at the same time as it took effect in the United Kingdom.
