COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice, that on the 15th May, 1916, he made an Order entitled "The Safety Lamps Order of the 15th May, 1916," in pursuance of section 33 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911. The effect of the Order is—

(a) to approve the following safety lamps:—

- Best's "Excelsior" Lamp, No. 3.
- Best's "Gauzeless" Lamps, No. 1 and No. 1A.
- "Prestwich Patent Protector 08" Lamp.
- Rothwell and Co.'s "A3," "B3," "C3," "D3," and "E3" Lamps.
- Teale's Mueseler or Thornburry No. 6 and No. 6A. Lamps.
- Teale's No. 1 Miners' Electric Safety Lamp.

(b) to make certain amendments to the Schedules to previous Safety Lamps Orders.
