A PROCLAMATION

DECLARING THAT MONDAY IN WHITSUN WEEK IN THE PRESENT YEAR SHALL NOT BE A BANK HOLIDAY OR A PUBLIC HOLIDAY IN ENGLAND AND WALES, AND IN IRELAND, AND APPOINTING TUESDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF AUGUST NEXT, A BANK HOLIDAY AND A PUBLIC HOLIDAY IN ITS STEAD.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear to Us in Council that in the present year, having regard to the exigencies of the war, it

is inexpedient that the Monday in Whitsun week should be a Bank Holiday or a Public Holiday in England and Wales, and in Ireland:

Now, THEREFORE, We, in pursuance of the provisions of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Acts aforesaid, declare that the Monday in Whitsun week shall not in the present year be a Bank Holiday or a Public Holiday in England and Wales, and in Ireland, and We do hereby, by and with the advice and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, appoint Tuesday, the 8th day of August next, to be observed as a Bank Holiday and a Public Holiday in England and Wales, and in Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Acts, instead of the Monday in Whitsun week, and We do by this Our Royal Proclamation command the said day to be so observed and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION

UNDER THE MUNITIONS OF WAR ACTS, 1915
AND 1916.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by section three of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, as amended by the Munitions of War (Amendment) Act, 1916, it is provided that the differences to which Part I of the first-mentioned Act applies are differences as to rates of wages, hours of work, or otherwise as to terms or conditions of or affecting munitions work, and also any differences as to rates of wages, hours of work, or otherwise as to terms or conditions of or affecting employment on any other work of any description, if that Part of that Act is applied to such a difference by His Majesty by Proclamation, on the ground that in the opinion of His Majesty the existence or continuance of the difference is directly or indirectly prejudicial to the manufacture, transport, or supply of Munitions of War; and it is also provided that the said Part of the said Act may be so applied to such a difference at any time, whether a lock-out or strike is in existence in connection with the difference to which it is applied or not: Provided that if in the case of any industry the Minister of Munitions is satisfied that effective means exist to secure the settlement without stoppage of any difference arising on work other than on munitions work, no Proclamation shall be made under the said section with respect to any such difference:

And whereas a difference within the meaning of the said section exists between employers and persons employed on the work of dock labourers in the Port of Liverpool as to rates of wages, hours of work, and otherwise as to terms and conditions of or affecting employment on the work carried on by such dock labourers:

And whereas the Minister of Munitions is not satisfied that effective means exist to secure the settlement of the said difference without stoppage, being a difference arising on work other than munitions work:

And whereas in Our opinion the existence or continuance of the said difference is directly and indirectly prejudicial to the manufacture, transport, and supply of Munitions of War:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, are pleased to proclaim, direct and ordain, that Part I of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, shall apply to the said difference.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of November nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make Regulations (called the

"Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said Regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said Regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said Regulations:

1. After Regulation 9A the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"9B. Where there is reason to apprehend that the holding of any race meeting will impede or delay the production, repair, or transport of war material or any work necessary for the successful prosecution of the war, it shall be lawful for the Minister of Munitions to make an order prohibiting the holding of the race meeting; and if the race meeting is attempted to be held in contravention of any such prohibition, it shall be lawful to take such steps as may be necessary to prevent the holding thereof.

"In the case of a race meeting to be held after the fifteenth day of June nineteen hundred and sixteen, before the meeting is held, at least seven clear days' notice in writing shall be sent to the Minister of Munitions.

"If any person takes part in the control, management, or organisation of any race meeting which is prohibited under this section or in respect of which such notice as aforesaid has not been given, or allows any horse to run at any such meeting, or brings any horse to a place where any such meeting is proposed to be held for the purpose of taking part in any race, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

"For the purpose of this regulation, 'race meeting' means any meeting for racing with horses open to the public, whether on payment or otherwise."

2. In Regulation 14B, after the words "guilty of an offence against these Regulations," there shall be inserted the words "and any person interned under such order shall be subject to the like restrictions and may be dealt with in like manner as a prisoner of war, except so far as the Secretary of State may relax such restrictions."

3. The Regulation which, by the Order in Council of the first day of June nineteen hundred and sixteen, was directed to be inserted after Regulation 39 shall, instead of being inserted after that Regulation, be inserted after Regulation 39A, and shall be substituted for the Regulation which, by the Order in Council of the twenty-second day of December nineteen hundred and fifteen, was directed to be inserted after Regulation 39A.

4. Regulation 58D shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as if the proviso hereinafter mentioned were added thereto, and accordingly at the end of the

said regulation the following proviso shall be inserted:—

“ Provided that nothing in this regulation shall be construed as affecting the powers of commanding officers to deal summarily with offences under the Army Act, or of courts of summary jurisdiction to deal with offences punishable on summary conviction.”

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 18th day of May, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (herein-after called ‘The said Benefice’) of Hanley, in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

“ Whereas under and by virtue of a Local Act of the 29th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hanley was vested in a Body of Trustees, which is now composed of the following persons (herein-after called ‘The said Trustees’) namely:—The Reverend John Watson, Canon of York; William Dunnett Spanton, of Ripon Lodge, Hastings, Esquire; John Keen, of Alsager, Cheshire, Esquire; George Smith, of Bryancroft, Boscombe, Esquire; John Clare, of Hanley aforesaid, Doctor of Medicine; Elijah Jones, of Etruria, Stoke-on-Trent, Architect; Robert Hammersley, of Hanley aforesaid, Manufacturer; Isaac Finn, of Hanley aforesaid, Draper; Herman Finn, of Hanley aforesaid, Draper; Samuel Montford, of Hanley aforesaid, Retired Water Rate Collector; Henry Johnson, of Leek, Manufacturer; Thomas Twyford, of Newcastle, Staffordshire, Manufacturer; Harry Hughes, of Basford Park, Stoke-on-Trent, Clerk; William Alfred Hughes, of Hanley aforesaid, Hosier; Charles John Brown, of Hanley aforesaid, Stationer; Henry Faulds, of Hanley

aforesaid, Doctor of Medicine; Homer Roden, of Burslem, Tailor; Philip George Crosby, of Hanley aforesaid, House Agent; George Nicholas, of Hanley aforesaid, Potter's Manager; Alfred Stanway, of Hanley aforesaid, Tailor's Manager; John William Walmsley, of Hanley aforesaid, Schoolmaster; Frederick Charles Barker, of Hanley aforesaid, Coal Merchant; Edward Corner, of Hanley aforesaid, Pharmacist; Montague Cartledge, of Hanley aforesaid, Confectioner; The Reverend Walter Swanbrow Knowles, Rector of Hanley aforesaid; and George Frank Paddock, of Hanley aforesaid, Solicitor:

“ And whereas the said Trustees are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hanley, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend John Augustine, now Bishop of Lichfield, and his Successors in the same Bishopric:

“ And whereas the said John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the herein-before mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Hanley, which is herein-before mentioned, and herein-after recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the Right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Hanley:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Trustees, (in testimony whereof they have severally signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hanley, now vested in them, the said Trustees, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1916, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by an Order of Council, dated the 25th day of May, 1916, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day

of May, 1916, as amended and added to by the Order of Council, dated the 25th day of May, 1916, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

- (A) Acetone and its compounds and preparations;
- (B) Electric lamps;
- (C) Emery, corundum, natural or artificial (such as alundum) carborundum and crystolon and manufactures thereof;
- (C) Hemp, the following manufactures of:—
 - Binder and reaper twine;
- (C) Linen manufactures, the following:—
 - Ducks, woven;
- (C) Potatoes and potato flour;
- (B) Woollen scarves, jerseys, cardigan jackets, socks, and men's woollen gloves and underwear.

(2) That the following headings should be added:—

- (A) Acetones and their compounds and preparations;
- (B) Electric lamps, except carbon filament lamps and arc lamps for street lighting;
- (B) Emery, corundum, natural or artificial (such as alundum) carborundum and crystolon and manufactures thereof;
- Hemp, the following manufactures of:—
 - (B) Binder and reaper twine;
- Linen manufactures, the following:—
 - (B) Ducks, woven;
 - (A) Potatoes;
 - (C) Potato flour;
 - (B) Scarves, jerseys, cardigan jackets, socks, men's gloves and underwear, manufactured wholly or partly of wool;
- (B) Jute cordage and twine;
- (C) Talc;
- (B) Varnishes containing lac.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

The KING has been pleased to issue a Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect:—

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, To all to whom these Presents shall come. Greeting:—

Whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria did by a Warrant under Her Royal Sign Manual, countersigned by one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and bearing date at Her late Majesty's Court at Windsor the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, ordain that there should be certain Officers appertaining to the Royal Victorian Order, We, taking into Our Royal consideration the advantages of appointing a Registrar of Our said Royal Order, do make, ordain and establish the following Statutes and Ordinances:—

It is ordained that the following Officer in addition to the Chancellor and Secretary shall be appointed to the Royal Victorian Order, that is to say a Registrar.

It is further ordained that the Registrar of the said Royal Order who shall be nominated by Us, Our Heirs and Successors, shall wear around his neck, pendent to a chain of gold, the following oval shaped Badge, namely: A Maltese Cross of eight points with the representation of a book between the angles, all in white enamel; the centre of crimson enamel bearing Our Royal and Imperial Monogram in gold within a blue enamelled border inscribed in letters of gold with the motto of the Order, that is to say "Victoria," surmounted by an Imperial Crown; the whole surrounded by a blue enamelled circle inscribed in letters of gold "Royal Victorian Order."

It is also ordained that he shall assist the Secretary in his duty to keep full lists of the Members of this Royal Order; shall prepare and engross all warrants and instruments which require to be passed under the Seal of the Order; and shall deliver or cause to be delivered a copy of the Statutes to every Knight Grand Cross and Knight Commander at or immediately after his investiture and to every Commander and Member immediately after his nomination. And further it is ordained that the Registrar shall keep full lists of those persons to whom the Royal Victorian Medal has been granted and from time to time shall prepare certificates to be sealed with the Seal of the Order for delivery to those persons.

COURTS (EMERGENCY POWERS), ENGLAND.

THE COURTS (EMERGENCY POWERS) (No. 2) RULES, 1916, DATED THE 8TH DAY OF JUNE, 1916, MADE BY THE LORD CHANCELLOR UNDER THE COURTS (EMERGENCY POWERS) ACTS, 1914-1916.

1.—(1) For the purposes of Section 3 of the Courts (Emergency Powers) (No. 2) Act, 1916,

the Court to which application is made shall be in England, the High Court of Justice, Chancery Division, or in cases within the jurisdiction of the Court of Chancery of the County Palatine of Lancaster, that Court.

(2) Applications under the said section shall be made by way of originating summons and shall be dealt with in accordance with the practice of the Court applied to.

2.—(1) The following fees shall be payable under these Rules in respect of any application under Section 3 of the Courts (Emergency Powers) (No. 2) Act, 1916, that is to say:—

(2) Except as above provided such fees, if any, shall be payable on any proceeding as would be payable according to the ordinary practice of the Court dealing with the application.

(3) The Court dealing with any application under Section 3 of the Act may remit or excuse in whole or in part any Court fees paid or payable under either head of this rule.

3. These Rules may be cited as the Courts (Emergency Powers) (No. 2) Rules, 1916.

TRADING WITH THE ENEMY (VESTING AND APPLICATION OF PROPERTY) AMENDMENT RULES, 1916 (No. 2).

THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY (VESTING AND APPLICATION OF PROPERTY) AMENDMENT RULES, 1916 (No. 2), MADE BY THE LORD CHANCELLOR UNDER THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY AMENDMENT ACT, 1915, 5 GEO. 5, CAP. 12.

1. Rules 4 and 5 of the Trading with the Enemy (Vesting and Application of Property) Rules, 1915, are hereby annulled and the following Rules shall stand in lieu thereof:—

4. All applications under Section 5 (2) of the Act to authorise payment out of property vested in the custodian of any debt or debts shall be made to the Court of Judge by whose order the property was vested in the custodian. Any such application, if not made by the originating summons under Section 4, shall be deemed a subsequent application for the purpose of the last preceding Rule.

5. The Court or Judge may, on the hearing of any such application, direct all such accounts and inquiries as to debts or particular classes of debts as may seem to be requisite and, if thought fit, the property available for payment of any debts or claims, and may for that purpose direct the custo-

dian or any party to issue such advertisements and require such proof by statutory declaration, or otherwise, as to the Court or Judge may seem expedient: but the Court or Judge shall not in any case be bound to inquire into or take into account or require the custodian to inquire into or take into account debts and claims against the enemy to any greater extent than provided for by the proviso to Section 5 (2), and the custodian may, if he think fit, carry out the duties imposed on him by such proviso, under the direction of the Court or Judge.

2. These Rules may be cited as the "Trading with the Enemy (Vesting and Application of Property) Amendment Rules, 1916 (No. 2)," and shall come into operation forthwith.

And Whereas We are desirous that "Warrant Officers, Class II," shall be eligible for the said decoration:

It is Our Will and Pleasure and We do hereby ordain that, notwithstanding the aforesaid proviso of Our said Royal Warrant of 28th January, 1915, the term "Warrant Officer" in the third clause of Our said Royal Warrant of 28th December, 1914, shall be interpreted as meaning Warrant Officers, Class I and Class II.

Rivers Medway and Swale—Neutral Vessels prohibited.

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

1. All vessels, other than those of British Nationality or those of the Allied Nations, are prohibited from entering the Medway and Swale rivers.

2. All Neutral Aliens are prohibited from entering the Medway and Swale rivers in British vessels, and this applies to Aliens carried in British ships or barges as passengers or part of crew; the limits of the prohibited area are defined as from the Outer Bar buoy in the River Medway to Rochester bridge, and the whole of the River Swale from the light on Queenborough spit to Columbine spit buoy. Attention is drawn to the necessity of shipowners and charterers satisfying themselves that no Neutral Aliens are on board vessels sent to the Rivers Medway and Swale.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions

contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

CONWAY AND COLWYN BAY JOINT WATER SUPPLY BOARD.

(Construction by Water Board or the Aluminium Corporation Limited of Reservoir; Subsidiary Works; Powers of Deviation; Provision as to Construction and Maintenance of proposed Works by Aluminium Corporation; Powers to Water Board and Aluminium Corporation to take, &c., Water from Lake Cowlyd; Repeal of Section 5 of Conway and Colwyn Bay Joint Water Supply Act, 1908; Rights, &c., in Lake Cowlyd and the Afon Ddu; Increase of height of Dam; Compulsory Acquisition and User of Lands, &c.; Extension of Board's District and Increasing Members of Board; Confirmation of Agreement of 27th May, 1916, between the Water Board and the Aluminium Corporation; Provisions as to flow of Afon Ddu and River Conway and Compensation Water, and for Protection of Landowners and others affected; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts, and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made in the present Session of Parliament by the Conway and Colwyn Bay Joint Water Supply Board (hereinafter called "the Board") for an Act (hereinafter called "the intended Act") for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To empower the Board and the Corporation, or either of them, to make, maintain, alter, enlarge, extend, repair, renew and use the following works or some of them or some part or parts thereof, that is to say:—

A reservoir to be formed by enlarging and extending Lake Cowlyd by means of an embankment or dam 350 yards or thereabouts in length partly in the parish of Dolgarrog, in the rural district of Conway, and partly in the parish of Llanrhydydd, in the rural district of Geirionydd, all in the county of Carnarvon, situate across the river Afon Ddu at a point 300 yards or thereabouts measured in a straight line in a north-easterly direction from the centre line of the existing embankment or dam described in and sanc-

tioned and confirmed by the Conway and Colwyn Bay Joint Water Board Supply Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1908"), and the removal of the said existing dam. The reservoir will commence at and extend from the said proposed embankment or dam in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 3,150 yards or thereabouts measured in a straight line from such embankment or dam to and terminating at or near the south-western end of the said lake.

2. To empower the Board and the Corporation, or either of them, to make and maintain all such embankments, dams, walls, byewashes, weirs, overflows, outfalls, culverts, tunnels, discharge pipes, cuts, channels, telegraphic and telephonic apparatus, catchwaters, gauges, mains, pipes and other apparatus, appliances and works, and any alterations in the works sanctioned and confirmed by the Act of 1908, as may be necessary or convenient in connection with or subsidiary to the proposed works before mentioned (hereinafter referred to as "the proposed works").

3. To authorize the Board and the Corporation, or either of them, to deviate laterally and vertically from the lines and levels of the proposed works shown on the deposited plans and sections hereinafter mentioned to the extent shown upon the said plans and sections or to be defined in the intended Act.

4. To make provision for the construction and maintenance of the proposed works by and at the cost of the Corporation in such manner and on such terms as the intended Act may prescribe, and to vest such works when completed in the Board as part of their property and existing water undertaking.

5. To authorize the Board to collect, impound, take, use, divert, and appropriate from Lake Cowlyd and the Afon Ddu by means of the proposed works all the water they may from time to time require for the purposes of supplying their area of supply for the time being, and subject to the provisions of the Conway and Colwyn Bay Joint Water Supply Orders 1891, 1896, and 1898, and the Act of 1908, and the intended Act, and so far as may be necessary to define the property, rights and interests of the Board and the Corporation in Lake Cowlyd and the proposed works and their respective rights and powers in reference to taking and using the said water, and to enable the Corporation to take and use for water power and other purposes of their business water from the proposed works, including the said Lake, to such extent and in such manner as the intended Act may provide.

6. To amend or repeal section 5 (For the protection of the Aluminium Corporation Limited) of the Act of 1908, and to authorize the Corporation in lieu of receiving and taking from the Board the compensation water provided by that section, to take from the proposed works, including Lake Cowlyd, water in such manner, to such extent and on such terms and conditions as the intended Act may provide.

7. To confer on the Corporation such rights and interests in the proposed works and any outlet and other works and conveniences constructed on the said proposed embankment or dam or in connection therewith for the purpose of their taking water as aforesaid as may be necessary and as the intended Act may provide.

8. To authorize the Corporation to supply or to convey to the proposed works, including Lake Cowlyd, water from any other watershed or gathering ground on such terms and conditions as the intended Act may prescribe.

9. To authorize the Board and the Corporation or either of them from time to time to increase the height of the proposed new embankment or dam to such extent and on such terms and conditions as the intended Act may provide.

10. To empower the Corporation and the Board, or either of them, for the purposes of the proposed works or other the purposes of the intended Act to acquire lands and buildings compulsorily or by agreement, and to appropriate to and use for all or any of the purposes of the intended Act any lands for the time being vested in them, and to acquire compulsorily or by agreement easements in, through, over or in respect of any properties.

11. To exempt the Board from the operation of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, relating to superfluous lands, and to make other amendments in the Lands Clauses Acts in their application to the intended Act.

12. To extend the Conway and Colwyn Bay Joint Water Supply District (hereinafter referred to as "the Joint District") as constituted by, and defined in, Article 2 of the Conway and Colwyn Bay Joint Water Supply Order, 1891 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1891"), as amended by the Conway and Colwyn Bay Joint Water Supply Orders, 1896 and 1898 (hereinafter referred to as "the Orders of 1896 and 1898"), by adding thereto the said parish of Dolgarrog; to confer on the Board all usual and necessary powers in reference to the supply of water in the said parish of Dolgarrog; to extend and apply, with or without alteration or amendment, all or some of the provisions of the Orders of 1891, 1896 and 1898 to the said Parish and the Joint District as proposed to be extended; and to amend the Orders 1891, 1896 and 1898 as may be necessary for constituting the said parish a part of the Joint District.

13. To increase, if necessary, the number of members elected by or representing the Conway Rural District Council on the Board and to increase the number of members on the Board accordingly; to make provision for electing any such additional member or members by the Conway Rural District Council, and to amend the Orders of 1891, 1896 and 1898 as may be necessary.

14. To authorize the Board to supply water to the house known as "Plas Maenan," in the parish of Maenan, in the said rural district of Geirionydd, and for such purposes to exercise all such powers for and in connection with breaking up streets and roads and laying mains and pipes as they are authorized to exercise in the Joint District under the Public Health Acts and any other Act or Acts, and to make such other provision in reference to such supply as the intended Act may provide.

15. To sanction, confirm and give effect to, with or without alteration, the Agreement, dated the twenty-seventh day of May, 1916, made between the Board and the Corporation in reference to the proposed works and the matters aforesaid.

16. To make such provisions as may be necessary or as the intended Act may prescribe

in reference to the flow of the stream Afon Ddu and the discharge of compensation water into such stream or into the River Conway, and to confirm and give effect to any agreement between the Board and the Corporation, or either of them, with any company, body or person having rights in or powers over the said stream and river.

17. To make provision for the protection of landowners and other persons or bodies whose property, rights or interests may be affected by the proposed works or by the exercise of the powers of the intended Act.

18. To vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would or might in any way prevent, interfere with, or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

19. To repeal, alter, amend or extend, or re-enact or incorporate with the intended Act all or some of the provisions of the Act of 1908 and the Orders of 1891, 1896 and 1898 or any of them.

20. To incorporate, with or without amendment, or to render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the following public Acts:—The Lands Clauses Acts, the Railways Clauses Acts, the Public Health Acts, and the Arbitration Act, 1889, and all Acts amending those Acts respectively, and to enact all such other provisions as may be necessary or expedient for effecting the objects of the intended Act.
