Milan, March 21.

THE Marquis de Leganes, our Governour, returned hither from Turin on the 17th instant, and has since had several Conferences with the General Officers of the Forces in the Service of this State, about the Affairs of the Campagne; By Order of his Excellency 6000 Sacks of Corn have been sent to Piedmont for the use of the German Troops quartered there. The Count de Breiner, Commissary General of the Emperors Forces in Italy, has again Summoned the Princes, who are Feudataries of the Empire, to pay the Contributions demanded of them, upon pain of Military Execution.

Venice, March 26. Two new Men of War and 3 Gallies are fitting out here, which may be ready to sail for the Levant by the middle of the next month, and at the same time will be sent thither several Companies of new raised Soldiers (who are already come to the Lido) with a great quantity of Provisions and Ammunition, and other Necessaries for our Army. By a Vessel that arrived here this Week from Constantinople, we have Advice, That the Turks design to have a Fleet at Sea this Summer, which they had not the last, and to that end are very busie in fitting out all their Ships and Gallies: That the Han of Tartary was gone home to assemble his Troops, which are to joyn the Ottoman Army in Hungary; And that the Grand Visier was expected at Constantinople before he went into the Field.

Madrid, March 18. The new Levies are continued in all the Provinces of this Kingdom for reinforcing our Army in Catalonia; whither they are sent as fast as the Troops are compleated: The Duke d'Escalona, Viceroy of that Country, has ordered the Fortifications of Barcelona to be repaired, and such new ones to be added, as are judged necessary for the greater security of the place; which work is carried on with great diligence. His Catholick Majesty has not yet disposed of the Command of the Armada, vacant by the Resignation of Don Pedro Corbette; but in the mean time has committed to his care the fitting it out with all the Expedition possible. On the 14th of this month Died here Don Jean de Angulo, Secretary of the Universal Dispatch; and the 15th the King declared the choice he had made of Don Alonso Cornejo, (who was formerly Secretary of

State and War in Flanders, and upon his return hither was made Secretary for the Affairs of Italy) to succeed him in that Station. His Catholick Majesty has made the Prince de Chimay, the Prince de Bergues, and the Marquis de Westerlo, Knights of the Golden Fleece. We are told that a considerable supply of Money was remitted to the Elector of Bavaria by the last Post.

Warsaw, March 6. The last Letters from Zalkiew tell us, That the King of Poland had quite lost his Ague, and was very hearty and well, but that his Physicians advised him however not to think as yet of removing from thence. Our Troops that are posted about Caminick, continue to keep that Garrison very closely blockt up; and the Crown General is sending them a great Reinforcement, the better to enable them to hinder the Enemies receiving any Relief from the Tartars; who for that purpose are preparing a Convoy at Jassi in Moldavia.

Vienna, March 27. The Envoy of the Elector of Saxony residing at this Court, who went lately to Dresden, returned hither the 22d instant, and had the same Evening a private Audience of the Emperor, and the day following a long Conference with the Imperial Ministers, about the Business of General Schoning, which its believed will now be quickly adjusted; and in the mean time here is a Discourse of his going into the Service of the Venetians. They write from Transilvania, That General Veterani had sent the Regiment of Gondola into the Country of the Sicules, to secure it against the Incurfions of the Tartars; and that upon Advice of the Enemies designing to put a new Supply of Provisions and Ammunition into Giula, he had Commanded a Body of Troops that way to observe their motions.

Cologne, April 6. The Duke de Croÿ arrived here on Friday last, and went the next day to his Estate at Millendonck. General Chauzet came hither yesterday from Holland in his way towards Franckfort. Several small Parties of Suiſers have lately passed through this City, being raised for the Service of the States General of the United Provinces.

Ghent, March 7. The Duke of Wintemberg came hither the last Week from Brussels, and has since taken a Review of our Garrison. Divers pieces of Cannon were taken some days ago out of the Arsenal here, being designed for the Service of this Campagne. On the 2d instant a Party of
