and Military War Pensions, &c., Act, 1915, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

In Sub-section (1) of Section 2 for the words "Every County and County Borough" to the end of the Sub-section, there shall be substituted the words "The Isle of Man."

In Sub-section (2) of Section 2 for the words "The Council of the County or Borough or Urban District" there shall be substituted the words "The Tynwald Court."

In Sub-section (2) (a) of Section 2 for the words "Council of the County or Borough or Urban District" there shall be substituted the words "Tynwald Court"; for the word "Council," where it next occurs, there shall be substituted the words "Tynwald Court"; and for the words "The Council," where they last occur, there shall be substituted the words "Such Court."

In Sub-section (3) of Section 2 for the word "Council," wherever the same occurs, there shall be substituted the words "Tynwald Court."

In Sub-section (4) of Section 2 the words "In the case of a County" shall be deleted; for the word "County" there shall be substituted the word "Island"; and the words "So, however, that every Borough and Urban District" down to and including the words "Majority of the Members of the District Committee" shall be deleted.

Sub-sections (8) and (11) of Section 2 shall be deleted.

Wherever the expressions "A Local Committee," "Any such Local Committee," "Any Local Committee," or "Local Committees" occur (except in Sub-section (1) of Section 2) there shall be read the expression "The Local Committee."

In Section 5 for the words "Under the Summary Jurisdiction Acts" there shall be substituted the words "Before a High Bailiff or two Justices of the Peace at the suit of any Chief or other Constable."

HEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the

17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by various subsequent Orders in Council subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council dated the 1st day of June, 1916:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, issued by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 1st day of June, 1916, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

At the end of Regulation 15A, the following words shall be inserted "(being an Act of the Imperial Parliament)."

In Regulation 45A, after the words "Military Service" the words "(Isle of Man)" shall be inserted.

WHEREAS by Section 20 (3) of "The Finance Act, 1894," it is enacted that His Majesty the King may, by Order in Council, apply that Section to any British Possession where His Majesty is satisfied that, by the law of such Possession, either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death, or that the law of such Possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that Section:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the law of the Commonwealth of Australia, as respects the duty leviable by the Government of the Commonwealth in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death is to the like effect as the provision of Sub-section (1) of the aforesaid Section:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Section 20 of "The Finance Act, 1894," shall apply to the Commonwealth of Australia.
