He Venetians make great preparations for the next Campagne; and the Turks by the care they take to provide for the security of Negrepont, seem to apprehend they have a design upon that place. The list week 12 Turkish Vessels appeared in the Gulf of Egena; They had several hundred Soldiers on board, and thought (as we believe) to have surprized the new Fort the Doge Monosimi ordered not long before his death to be built there; but Signior Michieli, Proveditore-General of the Armada, having, upon the first notice of the Enemies moving that way, detached 5 Galleys to look after them, the Turks retired without attempting any thing.

Naples, March 9. The Galleys that were lately fent from hence with several Companies of Foot, to change the Garifon of Porto-Longone, returned into this Port 3 days ago. Some other Galleys failed yesterday to carry a Supply of Provisions and Ammunition to the Spanish Places on the Coast of Tuscany. The Rectuits which were ordered to be made in this Kingdom for the Neapolitan Regiment in Catalonia, are compleated, and will embark in 2 or 3 days on the Vessels that are appointed to transport them to Barcelona.

Genoua, March 20. Several Vessels arrive here daily from Marseilles and Toulon to lade Corn for France, where the scarcity of it continues to a great degree. The Conferences are still held here about the matter of the Contributions demanded for the German Troops, which this Republick has not yet resolved to pay, but, it's believed, to prevent the Inconveniences that may attend their resulfal, they will at last comply with what is desired. Yesterday arrived here an Express from Rome, being dispatched by the Cardinal de Fourbin to the French Court.

Venice, March 26. Two Vessels are arrived here this week from Constantinople; They bring no news from thence; but report, that they met Signior Contarini, who was Cruifing with 8 Venetian Men of War in the Archipelago. The last Letters from Dalmatia say, that the Turks had drawn most of their Troops from those parts, to reinforce their Army in Hungary; and that 'twas believed the Venetians would make use of this opportunity to attempt fomething confiderable npon the Enemy. Signior Antonio Barziza, and his Brother, have been lately added to the Body of our Nobility upon their paying 100000 Ducats, towards the Expences of the War, and it's faid that Signior Nafadino will be thortly admitted upon the fame Condition.

Vienna, March 27. The last Advices from Turkey inform us, that the Han of Tartary parted from Adrianople on the 21th of the last month, towards Budziack, having assured the Grand Visier that he would return with a great Body of Tartars to join the Ottoman Forces in Hungary against the opening of the Campagne; That the Turks make great Efforts to have a numerous Army in the Field this Sommer; but that the Troops they affemble for that purpose from the several Provinces of their Empire, are corapoled of raw undisciplined Men: That the Visier had sent orders for supplying the Garisons of Temeswaer and Gyula with Provisions and all other Necessaries for their Defence and Subsistence; and that the Care of the latter was committed to Teckeley, who has been for some time at Passarovitz: The Tartars who made lately an Incursion into the Country of Sicules, give out, that they will shortly return with a much stronger Party, to make a Ravage on the Frontiers of Transilvania; and upon these Advices General Veterani has detached some of the German Troops to secure the Passes on that fide, and has ordered others to observe the Enemy, and prevent their putting any Succors into Gyula.
