By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1916, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the ex-

portation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1916, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(c) Meats of all kinds (except poultry and game), not including beef and mutton, fresh or refrigerated;

(c) Resins and resinous substances (except such as contain caoutchouc).

(2) That the following headings should be added:—

(c) Bamboo;

(c) Feathers and down;

(c) Felspar.

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

- (c) Meat of all kinds, not including beef and mutton, fresh or refrigerated;
- (c) Poultry and game;
- (A) Rennet powder, rennet extract and other preparations of rennet;
- (c) Resins, resinous substances (except such as contain caoutchouc) and articles containing resins and resinous substances;
- (c) Tobacco.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

And whereas by two Orders of Council, dated respectively the 7th day of October, 1915, and the 15th day of November, 1915, the said Proclamation was varied accordingly:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Order of Council of the 15th day of November, 1915, whereby Tobacco was added to the List of excepted articles which are not required to be consigned to the Authorized Persons referred to in the Schedule to the said Proclamation, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Second Lieutenant Walter Howden Lyell.

On the 4th May, 1916, Lieutenant Lyell was in command of a party under instruction in throwing hand grenades. One of the men threw a grenade on to the parapet directly in front of the party, thus placing them in great danger. Lieutenant Lyell at once ran up, and, picking up the bomb, threw it over the parapet.

Lance-Corporal Percy Warwick.

On the 19th September, 1915, a class of men attached to the Grenade Company of the 3rd Guards Brigade was being instructed in throwing live bombs from a saphead into a small trench twenty-five yards away. One of the men when his turn came was nervous and, after igniting his bomb, dropped it behind him. Warwick at once, with great presence of mind, picked the bomb from between the legs of several men and threw it out of the trench.

In each case explosion followed immediately the bomb had been thrown away.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) WITH REFERENCE TO THE SALE OF LIGHT BEER.

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following Order:—

Areas to which the Order applies.

1. This Order shall apply to all areas or parts of areas situate in England or Wales in which an Order of the Board is now in force.

Extension of Hours for the Sale of Light Beer.

2. (a) Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 2 of the respective Orders of the Board for the aforesaid areas, it shall be lawful, subject as hereinafter provided, to sell or supply in licensed premises or clubs for consumption on and off the premises and to consume therein and to dispatch and take there-

from any beer which on analysis of a sample thereof at any time is found to contain not more than two per cent. of proof spirit on and during the following days and hours—

On Weekdays—

In addition to the hours prescribed by the said Article in each of the said Orders for the sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption on and off the premises respectively, during all hours between 9 o'clock in the morning and 6 or 6.30 in the evening as the case may be.

And the said Article in each of the said Orders shall be read as if such additional hours for the sale and supply of such beer were expressly inserted therein.

(b) Not less than seven days' previous notice in writing of the date on which it is intended to begin to sell or supply such beer during such additional hours shall be given by the holder of the licence or the secretary of the club to the Superintendent of the Police of the district wherein the licensed premises or club are or is situate; and all licensed premises and clubs in respect of which such notice has been given shall as from such date, notwithstanding any provisions contained in the said respective orders, be closed on weekdays for all purposes at the hour in the evening at which the sale of intoxicating liquor must cease in accordance with the provisions of the said Article in each of the said Orders, unless and until such sale is discontinued and due notification of such discontinuance has been given to the said Superintendent of Police.

(c) A copy of this Order shall be kept permanently affixed in all licensed premises or clubs where such beer is sold during such additional hours.

Other Provisions of the Orders to Remain in Force.

3. Save as hereby provided the provisions of each of the said Orders shall apply to the sale and supply of such beer.

Commencement of Order.

4. This Order shall come into force on the tenth day of July, 1916.

ORDER.

Whereas by Orders published in the London Gazette on November 23rd, 1915, December 7th, 1915, December 31st, 1915, March 21st, 1916, June 6th, 1916, and June 27th, 1916, respectively, the Minister of Munitions, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Regulation 30A of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, applied such regulation to certain War Material specified in such Orders, namely:—Optical munitions, all kinds of aluminium and alumina, platinum metal and ores, residues and bars containing the same, and whale oil other than sperm oil.

And whereas the Minister deems it desirable that the insurance of such War material should be permitted.

Now, therefore, the Minister gives notice that he hereby authorises and permits the insurance of the War material specified in the above-mentioned notices.

ORDER made under the Defence of the Realm Regulations Consolidated as to the Devonport and Plymouth Pilotage Districts.

By virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm Regulations Consolidated, and of all other powers and authorities them thereunto enabling the Lords Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom do hereby order that from and after the fifteenth day of July, 1916, all ships (other than ships belonging to His Majesty) which are under charter to or are in the service of His Majesty or any Department of His Majesty's Government, while navigating in any of the pilotage districts stated below for the purpose of entering, leaving or making use of any dockyard port in such district, shall be under the pilotage of a pilot appointed by the Senior Naval Officer of such district or of a Master or Mate possessing a pilotage certificate for such district granted by the Senior Naval Officer, and shall not be obliged to employ any other pilot. If any such ship is not under pilotage as hereby required, after a pilot appointed as aforesaid has offered to take charge, her Master shall be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations Consolidated.

Where this Order has effect Section 633 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall apply and the Pilotage Act, 1913, shall not apply.

Nothing herein contained shall impose on the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty any liability for any loss or damage occasioned by any act or default of any Pilot appointed by the Senior Naval Officer.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.

Advertisements purporting to be issued in pursuance of Statutes or under Orders of Court will not be inserted unless signed or attested by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

Advertisements relating to Bills before Parliament will not be inserted unless signed by a Parliamentary Agent or a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.
