From Turin we are told, that the Duke of Savoj has disbanded a confiderable part of his forces, and that fince the Sentence passed by the French Ambolishour in savour of the said Dukes pretentions & all things remain peaceable between Savoj and Geneur Some misunderstandings are lately rissent between the Duke and Cantons of Swizzerland, the latter having in the last Session of their Diet concluded under their Warranty the Country of Vaux, which 'tis said belongs so the Duke, but is at present possess to those of Berne 5 but the Baron di Grenfy the Savoyard Ambaliadous to shose Cantons, is bushly negociating that effair, and 'tis hoped may compose the affair to their munical satisfaction.
