Turin, May 1.

HE Troops of his Royal Highness have Orders to encamp near Quieras; and the German Forces with those of the Milaneze are on their march to join them. The French Troops are likewife in motion on the Frontiers of

Madrid, April 29. The Forces that have been lately raised in this Kingdom are on their match towards Catalonia, and a confiderable Supply of Money has been remitted to the Vice-Roy there for the Service of the Gampagne. The French, as we are informed by an Express from thence, have begun to draw their Troops together, and give out that their Army will consist of 30000 Men. They write from Barcelona of the 17th Instant, that two English Men of War arrived in that Port some days before with several Merchant Ships under their Convoy, and that they failed again the 15th for Majorca.

Corunna, May 5. Two Dutch Privateers have

brought in here a French Ship called the Amazon of Bayonne of 26 Guns, and 8 Patereroes, laden with Corn from Tercera, together with a Dutch Ship of 14 Guns bound home from Malaga, which was taken by the Amazm, and retaken by

the said Dutch Privateers.

Warsaw, May 4. The Letters of the 25th past Warsaw, May 4. The Letters of the 25th patt from the Court of Poland, which is still at Zoltien, tell us, that the King was perfectly recovered. And that the Baron de Meyer was expected there in the Quality of Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Bavaria, to Treat of a Marriage between his Electoral Highness and the Princess of Poland.

Vienna, May 5. The Imperial Troops in Hun-gary are commanded to be on the 25th of this Month at the General Rendezvous near Efficke; and in the mean time they continue to fend from hence all manner of Stores for the use of the Army. The Letters from the Frontiers fay, that Takeley is fallen into difgrace at the Ottoman Port, and 'tis even reported, that Orders are come from the Visier to send him Prisoner to Adriauple; Which is a new motive to the Hungarians of his Party to defert him, as divers do every day: Some of them, who were quartered at Rham, deligned to have followed the Example of Darozzi by fetting that place on Fire, and going over to the Imperialists, but the Turks having got timely notice of it, sent some Troops thither, who cut them all in pieces; and about the fame time they detached 500 Januaries to reposses themselves of

ducted thither by 3000 Turks, who passed the Danube at Belgrade. Two days ago another Conference was held here between the Imperial Ministers and the Envoy of Saxony about General Schoning's Affair, which, we are told, was finally adjusted at this Meeting, and an Express has been sent to Dresden with an account of it. The Count de Martenitz is going again to the Courr of Poland in the Quality of the Emperor's Envoy xtraordinary.

Dresden, May 10. On the 7th Instant in the E. vening died here John George the Fourth, Elector of Saxony, of the Small Pox, being the Eleventh day of his Sickness; And the next day his Brother Prince Frederick Augustus was proclaimed Elector, and received the Homage of the Magistrates of this City, and the Troops in Garison here; after which his Electoral Highness retired to Mauritsburg about two German miles from hence. Where one of the first things he did was to name the Baron de Frizen to go with the Character of his Envoy Extraordinary to the King of Great-Briatain, and to attend his majesty during the Cam-

Hailbron, May 11. There are now Encamped about 20000 Men of the Confederate Forces near this place, the rest are on their march, and Prince Lewis of Baden is expected here against the 20th of this month, to put himfelf at the head of the Army. The French Troops in Alface and parts adjacent march to Neufladt, and it's faid they are to encamp in that Neighbourhood about the 25th of this month; The Detachements they had ordered from the Rhine towards Piedmont and Catalonia are countermanded, and are now to serve in the Army

under the Mareschal de Lorge.

Francfort, May 12. The Elector and Electores of Hanouer came to this place on Monday last, and went this morning to the Bath at Wishaden. Prince Lewis of Baden is now at Stutgard in the Country of Wirtemberg; The Army he is to command this Summer affembles near Hailbron, where there are already above 20000 Men together. His Highness has ordered a Detachement to secure a considerable Passnear Pfortzheim. A strong French Party, commanded by Monsieur Melac, paffed the Rhine some days ago at Philipsburg, and advanced to Ladenburg on the Neckar, having with them one Field Piece; There passed some Shot be-tween them and those in the Town, after which the French retired, and viewed all the Passes between that place and the Rhine, but found them fo well guarded, that they returned without attempting any thing farther. Several of their Dragoons took this occasion to defert; whose Hories are in a very poor condition. Yesterday passed by this City 6 large Boats with some of the Vipalanka, and to fortifie it.
