WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of September, 1916, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have had under consideration the Regulations governing the award of pensions to Widows and compassionate allowances to Children of Officers of Your Majesty's Coast Guard promoted on retirement to the Rank of Honorary Lieutenant:

"And whereas the existing Regulations provide only a single rate of pension for the Widows (viz. £40) and a single rate of compassionate allowance for the Children (viz. £5 to £10) of Officers of this Rank, and contain no special provision for the Dependants of Officers recalled to the Service and dying from causes in any way attributable to the Service:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable in the present circumstances to make such provision:

"And whereas under Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 29th February, 1916, pensions of £50 a year and compassionate allowances of £8 to £14 a year, may, in cases arising out of the present War, be awarded to the Widows and Children, respectively, of Commissioned Warrant Officers of Your Majesty's Navy:

"We, therefore, beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the award of pensions and compassionate allowances to the Dependants of Officers of Your Majesty's Coast Guard, promoted on retirement to the Rank of Honorary Lieutenant, and called up for service in the present War, on the same scale and under the same conditions as apply in the case of Commissioned Warrant Officers of Your Majesty's Navy.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your

Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by various subsequent Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council dated the 18th day of August, 1916:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, made by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 18th day of August, 1916, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

1. In Regulation 8g, for the words "*The 1st day of September*" there shall be substituted the words "*The 21st day of September*"; and after the words "*The Finance (1909-10) Act, 1910*," there shall be added the words "*being an Act of the Imperial Parliament*."

2. In the following Regulations the words "*The Lieutenant-Governor*" shall be substituted for the respective words herein mentioned, that is to say:—

In Regulation 9d, for the words "*The Minister of Munitions*":
