The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Dispatch, dated 6th September, from. His Majesty's Consul at Dairen, stating that the examination which is being enforced in the case of certain vessels at Dairen and Port. Arthur on account of cholera has been extended. to vessels coming from Yokohama, Osaka, Kobe, Shanghai, Foochow, Amoy, Swatow, Canton, and all other ports in South China, and that the preventive measures in force have been further extended by the prohibition of the import of the following articles from the Philippine Islands, South China, Japan, and all other localities in which the disease is prevalent :-

Raw fish and shellfish, slightly salted fish and shellfish, and vegetables the leaves of which are used for food.

The following articles coming from the same localities will only be admitted after disinfection:

Raw fruit and all vegetables other than those specified above.
