

ORDER OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER
REGULATION 14A OF THE DEFENCE OF THE
REALM (CONSOLIDATION) REGULATIONS.

Whereas the Admiralty are of opinion that, in view of the public safety and the defence of the realm, it is desirable to impose restrictions on persons proceeding to or from ports in the County of Zetland, in addition to the restrictions imposed by the Order made by me on the 1st day of March last in virtue of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 14A of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Herbert Samuel, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in virtue of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. No passenger proceeding from or to any place outside the County of Zetland shall land or embark at any port in the said county without the permission of the Officer Commanding Troops, Lerwick: Provided that the grant of any such permission shall not exempt an alien from any of the requirements of the Aliens Restriction (Consolidation) Order, 1916, with regard to the obtaining of permission to land or embark at any port in the United Kingdom or otherwise.

2. This Order shall come into force on the first day of November, 1916.
