## SCHEDULE.

1.—(1) The next Statutory Elections of members shall be postponed, or, in the case of Elections already postponed under the Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915, further postponed for a year; and the term of office of the existing members shall accordingly be extended, or further extended by one year.

This provision shall apply only where the next Statutory Election (whether a postponed election or not) would take place before the 1st day of November, 1917.

- (2) Sub-sections (3), (4) and (5) of Section 1 of the Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915, shall apply to the foregoing Subsection as they apply to the provisions of that Section with the substitution of the year 1917 for the year 1916.
- (3) Any enactment making the payment of a fine a condition of resigning any office shall not have effect so as to require the payment of a fine in the case of a member who resigns any office after the date on which his term of office would, but for the provisions of the Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915, or this Act, have expired.
- 2. This Act may be cited as the Local Elections (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, and shall be construed as one with the Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915.
