situate in the County and Diocese of Durham, for the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Luke, Darlington, situate

in the same County and Diocese:

"Whereas under the provisions of the 21st Section of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, the right of Patronage and the nomination of the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint James, Albert Hill (Darlington), is exercisable alternately by Your Majesty and by the Bishop of the said Diocese of Durham:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Darlington, is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Suc-cessors, and in the Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham, and his suc-

cessors alternately And whereas the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and the said Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham, have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said two Benefices of Saint James, Albert Hill (Darlington), and Saint Luke, Darlington, should be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said two Benefices, and of the Patronage thereof, respectively, and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the

Schedule hereunto annexed:

"And whereas the said two Benefices are of modern origin, and are in consequence not entered in Your Majesty's Books:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the alternate Patron of the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Darlington, (in testimony of which consent he, the said Herbert Henry Asquith, has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, now Bishop of Durham, as the alternate Patron of the said Benefice of Saint James, Albert Hill (Darlington), (in testimony

of which consent he, the said Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham, has signed this Scheme and has affixed thereto his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the alternate right of Patronage of and nomination to the said Benefice of Saint James, Albert Hill (Darlington), and the Church thereof, which is now exercisable as aforesaid by the said Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham, shall be assigned and transferred from him the said Bishop and from his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth belong to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Herbert Henry Asquith or other the First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury for the time being on behalf of Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, in such manner that the whole Advowson of the said Benefice of Saint James, Albert Hill (Darlington), shall thereafter belong to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and that in exchange for the same the alternate right of Patronage of and presenta-tion to the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Darlington, and the Church thereof, belongs now as aforesaid Your to Your Heirs and Successors, Majesty, upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and shall thereupon and thenceforth belong to, and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by, the said Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham, and his successors Bishops of Durham, in such manner that the whole Advowson of the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Darlington, shall thereafter belong to the said Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham, and his successors Bishops of Durham.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.
