

ford Park, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Acton Green, at the junction of Fielding Road with the road called The Avenue, and extending thence northward along the middle of The Avenue for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Fielding Road, and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Numbers 73 and 75, Woodstock Road, and extending thence eastward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of $1\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of Woodstock Road, and extending thence first eastward to, and then southward along, the middle of Woodstock Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Abinger Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Acton Green, from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bedford Park."

And whereas Drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of All Souls College, Oxford, on the 28th day of October, 1916, and sealed on the 22nd day of November, 1916, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Whereas the University of Oxford Commissioners, under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, did, by an Instrument under their Seal, dated the 16th day of June, 1881, make certain Statutes thereunto annexed for your Petitioners who are therein described as "The College of All Souls of the Faithful Departed, commonly called All Souls College, in the University of Oxford":

And whereas such Statutes were approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council

on the 3rd day of May, 1882, and have since been altered and amended from time to time:

And whereas at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of our said College, specially summoned for that purpose, and held on the 28th day of October, 1916, it was unanimously resolved, by those present and voting at the Meeting, that the several further alterations in and additions to the said Statutes hereinafter specified should be made, that is to say:—

In Statute III (April, 1913, edition).

That in Statute III, Clause 9, the words "clear of income tax" shall be omitted.

That in Statute III, Clause 10, the word "Sub-Librarian" shall be substituted for the words "Assistant Librarian."

That in Statute III, Clause 17, the number "15" shall be substituted for the number "14."

In Statute IX (April, 1913, edition).

That a new Clause 11 shall be inserted in Statute IX immediately after Clause 10 of such Statute, and to be in the words and figures following, namely:—

"11. As from 5th April, 1917, the College shall repay to the Warden, to any Fellow elected under any provision of Statute III, to any Officer of the College, and to any Professor or Reader mentioned in Statute IV (whether the emoluments of such Professor or Reader are derived from the Revenues of the College or from any other source, and including, in the case of any such Professor, the emoluments of any Fellowship which is by the Statutes of the College permanently attached to his professorship), such portion of the income tax actually paid by him in respect of his emoluments as Warden, Fellow, Officer, Professor or Reader, as would have been payable by him if such emoluments had constituted his sole income, and as if he were assessed on such income as earned income, and without abatement."

Now we, the said Warden and College, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby submit the aforesaid alterations and additions made by us in the Statutes governing our said College to the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.
