Turin, June 14. The Imperial Troops, and those of the Milaneze, are now on their march towards Piedmont, and by the end of this month our whole Army will be together. The Marefchal de Catinat assembles his Troops about Sujz.

Venice, June 11. By Letters from Constantinople of the 5th of April we are told, That the Grand Signior had given Orders to the Tefterdar Baila to provide Tents. Horses, and all things necessary for the new Viller's going to the War, and to have them ready against his arrival at Advianople: Orders were likewife fent to Mahmut Beg to march with the Troops of Allemia and Befina to joyn the Visier at Belgrade. The Hasnadar of the Deposed Visier had discovered 1200 Puries of Money belonging to his Patron, which were prefently feized on for the Grand Signior's Ufe; Six Hundred Puries were demanded of Ofman Bassa, late Caimacan of significant; and 400 of Ibra' im Effendi, the Kia of the late Viller. The Head of Ifmasl Baffa was on the 26th of March carried to Adrianople for oppressing the People under his Goverment; And the Head of the Bassa of Jerufalem was fent for, because, being last year Conductor of the Pilgrims to Mecca, he treated them ill by his Exactions. On the 29th, the Caimacan of Adrianople Married the Daughter of the late Sultan Malcomet, the Grand Signior, and all the Sultanesses coming to the Wedding, which lasted 3 days. On the first of April, 1200 Janisaries, with a hundred Purses of Money, marched towards Belgrade, to pay the Garisons of that place, Temeswaer and Giula. And on the 2d, the Kislar Aga was discharged from his Office, and Banished to Grand Gairo,

Vienna, June 16. The last Letters from Hungary inform us, That feveral Imperial Regiments were already come to the Rendezvous at Eava on the Drave; That the rest had Orders to hasten all they could their march thither; and that a Bridge was laid over the Danibe at Virismarton. General Caprara, who is to Command the Emperors Forces against the Turks, is not yet arrived here from *Piedmont*, but hourly expected, and his stay in this place will be very short. We hear. that the Turks who were marching towards Tiral, to make a second attempt upon that place, understanding that some Imperial Troops were in motion, in order to relieve it, chose rather to retire again than to run the hazard of another Repulse.
