Napoli di Romania, May 5.

THE Captain General having lately caused a Muster to be taken of the Venetian Forces in these parts, they are found to consist of about 17000 Foot, and 3000 Horse; part of these are Posted to Guard the Pass at the *Isthmus of Corinth*; and the rest lie ready to Embark on the Fleet, which is now in this Port. By the preparations that have been made, some great Enterprize seems to be designed; the Turks apprehend it may be against *Negrepont*, and have therefore sent a strong Reinforcement thither, with Supplies of Provisions, and all things necessary for the Subsistence of the Garison, and Defence of the place. In the mean time we expect here, with much impatience, the Count de *Steinau*, General of our Land Forces, who is coming with a great Convoy from *Venice*.

Milan, June 23. The Marquis de *Leganez*, our Governor General, went on the 20th Instant to *Pavia*, to view the Train of Artillery which is preparing there for the Service of the Campagne, and returned hither yesterday in the Evening; And his Excellency designs to part from hence again in few days, to take a General Review of the Forces of this State, who will soon after begin their march towards *Piedmont*. In the mean time, a detachment of our Forces is marched to *Cozzo* near *Casal*; and it's thought, that part of the German Forces, who have not yet left their

Quarters in *Monterrat*, are to join with them, in order to Block up *Casal*. Signior *Salvago*, who came hither lately from *Genova*, has had several Meetings with our Ministers, to adjust some differences depending between the Spaniards and that Republick.

Venice, June 25. By a Vessel which arrived here some days ago from *Malta*, we understand that the Gallies of that Order are gone to *Agosta* in *Sicily*, where they intend to stay for the Popes Gallies, that they may proceed together to the *Levant*. The Letters from *Spalato* in *Dalmatia*, of the 18th Instant, tell us, That General *Delfino* came before *Ciclar* on the River *Narent*, on the 16th, in order to attack that place, having for that purpose drawn together an Army of 14 or 15000 men. The last Advices from *Constantinople*, which are of the 30th of *April*, say, that the new Grand Visier was arrived at *Adrianople*; and that he intended to set out from thence about the 20th of *May* for the Campagne; and in the mean time, had sent Orders to stop Monsieur *Heemskerke*, the Dutch Ambassador, at *Belgrade*, till such time as he arrived there.

Warsaw, June 21. We heard the last Week, that a Body of 20000 Tartars was marching to conduct several hundred Wagons laden with Provisions to *Caminiac*; And this day we have Advice, that they have not only put this Convoy of Provisions into *Caminiac*, but that they advanced afterwards towards *Pomerany*, within 12 Leagues of *Lemberg*. The King of *Poland*, upon the first notice of the Enemies march, sent Orders to the Governors of the Frontier places to be upon their Guard, and to keep Parties abroad, to observe their Motions, and to warn the Neighbouring Country of their approach, as they saw there was occasion for it. In pursuance of these Directions, the Sieur *Gurski* marched with 200 men towards the place where he heard the Enemy were, and being come near to *Pomerany*, discovered some of their Troops, which believing to be only a Party, that was sent to Ravage the Country thereabouts, he advanced towards them, but they proved to be the Vanguard of their Main Body, from whence they were soon assisted by a
