We have sent out several Parties to observe them.

Francfort, July 8. The French Army repassed the Rhine the 29th of the last month, and is since marched lower down towards Wormes and Oppenbeim; They destroy all the Corn and Forage they find on the Ground. Prince Lewis of Baden marches towards the Rhine; and has at present his Head Quarters at Scwetzingen. Several Parties of Husiars are gone over that River, to annoy the Enemy all they can. The Troops af Hesse, Mun-ister, and Paderborne, are marched towards the Neckar, and are to join to morrow with the Neu-burgers at Gensheim. The Election of a new Great Master of the Teutonick Order is to be made on the 11th Instant at Mergenthall.
