For conspicuous gallantry in action. He led a successful raid against the enemy's trenches with great courage and coolness. He has on many previous occasions done fine work.

Capt. John March Diggles, M.C., Ches. R. For conspicuous gallantry in action. He showed marked courage and skill in assembling the brigade previous to the assault. He set a splendid example throughout.
