ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(Dated 26th February 1917.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Part 1 of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914.

1. Part 1 (Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914 is hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, and shall in its application to such Area be read and have effect as if paragraph (3) of Article 2 of that Order were omitted.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of March, nineteen hundred and seventeen.

SCHEDULE.

Area referred to in this Order.

An Area comprising such portion of the county of Inverness as lies within the following boundary (and including any roads forming that boundary) :-

Commencing at a point near Dalray, where the Nairn and Inverness county boundary crosses the road leading from Cawdor to Craggie and proceeding in a south-westerly direction along that road to its junction with the Strathnairn road at Craggie; thence continuing in a south-westerly direction along that road to its junction with the road leading to Inverness, near Dalvourn Bridge; thence in a northerly direction along that road via Balnafoich Bridge to the western boundary of the parish of Daviot and Dunlichity; thence in a southerly direction along the parish boundary to where it crosses the Farr and Fort Augustus road near Milton; thence in a south-westerly direction along that road via Whitebridge Hotel to a point where it crosses the river Tarff near Fort Augustus; thence in a south-easterly direction along that river and the Allt Coire na Ceire Burn to the Pass of Corrieyairack; thence in an easterly direction along the Pass to the southern boundary of the parish of Boleskine and Abertarff; thence continuing in an easterly direction along the southern boundaries of the parishes Boleskine of Abertarff, and Moy androssie, and part of the western boundary of Alvie, to a point where it crosses the Raitts Burn; thence in a southerly direction along the said burn to its confluence with the River Spey; thence in a north-easterly direction along that river to the boundary between the counties of Elgin or Moray and Inverness; thence in a north-westerly direction along the latter county boundary to the point of commencement.

SPECIAL ACTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1915.

Y virtue and in exercise of the powersconferred on them by the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, the Board of
