Rome, July 17.

ON Monday last the Pope received the Compliments of the Colledge of Cardinals, and of the Foreign Ministers upon his entring into the Fourth year of his Pontificate.

The Bavarian Minister continues to press the Pope to come to some determination in the Business of *Lige*; On the other hand the Agents of the Cardinal *de Bonillon*, having no very good opinion of their Cause, seek delays, and would therefore have the meeting of the Congregation of Cardinals, which is to Examine this Matter, put off to a farther day, but the Pope has absolutely refused it, and has repeated his Orders to them to meet on Tuesday next, as was before appointed, and to make their Report with all the expedition possible; In the mean time the Duke of *Savoy* has written to the Pope, very earnestly recommending to him the Interests of the Elector of *Cologne* upon this occasion. The Prince *de Lichtenstein* the Emperor's Ambassador, has finished his Visits of Leave, in order to his return home, though 'tis thought he will not part from hence till his Successor arrives. There being a very plentiful Harvest in the Ecclesiastical Territories, the French have desired and obtained Leave of the Pope to buy up a certain quantity of Corn, and to transport the same to *France*.

Turin, July 26. The Duke of *Savoy* is still encamped near *Ayrasque*, whither 8 Pieces of Cannon, with divers Wagons laden with Ammunition, were sent this week from this place; and several Pieces of Cannon more, with some Mortars, are preparing to follow in few days. The Marschal *de Castinas* continues in his Camp at *Rocheville*, expecting a Reinforcement.

Madrid, July 22. By an Express from *Gibraltar*, we have Advice, that the English and Dutch Squadron commanded by Rear-Admiral *Newille*, and the 10 Spanish Men of War, which sailed from *Cadiz* on the 9th of this month, had joined Admiral *Russell* on the 10th and 11th near *Tangier*, where the whole Fleet was stopt by a strong Levant till the 15th, when the Wind changing to the West, they passed through the *Streights* the same day, taking their Course towards *Barcelona*. We are told that Orders are sent to 20 Spanish Gallies which lie at *Cartagena* to join the Fleet. New Levies are making in all parts of this Kingdom for reinforcing the Spanish Army in *Catalonia*.

Vienna, July 28. General *Caprara* is still here, but in all probability will not defer his departure for *Hungary* longer than till towards the end of this week. The Imperial Forces who have had their Rendezvous on the *Drave*, are in the mean

time commanded by Count *Guido* of *Starcenberg*; and by our last Advice they were moving towards *Peter-Waradin*; General *Veterani*, with the Troops from *Transylvania*; is on his march towards the *Iron-Gate* to secure that Pass. The Turks do not yet begin to assemble their Troops about *Belgrade*, nor do they certainly know when to expect the Grand Visier there; The last Letters from *Turkey* said, that he went in the beginning of the last Month to his Tent near *Adrianoople*; That his going thither was attended with all the State and Solemnity which is usually practised by the Turks in such occasions; But the Troops he had with him did not exceed 5000 Men, and that he might not march with so small a number, he had put off his departure towards *Hungary* till the 28th of June, by which time he expected several other Bassa's would have joined him.

The Court of the King of the Romans is now going to be settled; and the great Officers are already named; Count *Leopold* of *Dietrichstein* is to be Master of the Horse; The Count *de Trautson* First Gentleman of the Bedchamber; The Count *de Martinitz* Captain of the Archers; and the Rhingrave of *Salme* Captain of the Halbardiers. The Count *de Wapdel* is come hither with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Denmark*, and has had Audience of the Emperor. General *Schoning* remains still here, having been much indisposed ever since he has had his liberty; He intends so soon as he is recovered to go to *Dresden*.

Frankfort, Aug. 4. The Confederate Army under the Command of Prince *Leuris* of *Baden* decamped the 2d of this month from *Hockenheim*, and marched towards *Bruchsal*, the design of fortifying *Manheim* being laid aside till such time, as some matters relating to the expence of that work, can be adjusted between the Elector *Palatin* and the Neighbouring Circles. The Marschal *de Lorge* has posted most of his Foot near *Oggerheim*, and caused several Intrenchments to be cast up along the *Rhine* to hinder the Germans from passing that River; and lies himself with his Horse near *Creutznach*. The Chapter of *Metz* will meet in two or three days to choose a Coadjutor in the room of Prince *Anthony* of *Neubourg* Great Master of the Teutonick Order lately deceased.

Hamburg, Aug. 6. The Letters from *Copenhagen* of the 3d Instant inform us, that the Dutch Convoy, consisting of 130 Merchant Ships and 9 Men of War, which sailed from the *Utic* about the 26th of the last month, arrived in the *Sound* the first of this, having left two Men of War and 8 Merchant Ships in *Norway*; and on the 2d Instant arrived before *Elsenore* between 40 and 50 English Merchant Ships under Convoy of three Men of War.
