Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 17th day of March, in the year 1869, and published in the London Gazette on the 19th day of the same month, part of the District Parish of Saint Matthew, Brixton, in the said County of Surrey, and at that time in the Diocese of Winchester, but now in the said Diocese of Southwark, was assigned as a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Jude, situate at East Brixton, in the said District Parish of Saint Matthew, Brixton, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Jude, East Brixton':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint Jude, East Brixton, has, under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us,

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, East Brixton, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose, that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation, and without any assurance in the Law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, East Brixton, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said District Parish of Saint Matthew, Brixton, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such District Parish, and shall be annexed to, and shall in future form part of, the said New Parish of Saint Jude, East Brix-

ton.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, or proposing, any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the herein-before-mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

of any other Act of Parliament.

"All which we humbly represent, recommend, and propose, to Your Majesty in Council.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The Territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Jude, East Brixton, in the County of Surrey, and in the Diocese of Southwark, being:—

"All that portion of the District Parish of Saint Matthew, Brixton, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south and upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint Jude, East Brixton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Jude,

East Brixton, from the said District Parish of Saint Matthew, Brixton, reaches the middle of Water Lane, at a short distance to the west of the entrance to Brockwell Park, and extending thence westward along the middle of Water Lane for a distance of 43 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the boundary wall between the houses known as Number 1 Tulse Hill, and Number 24 Water Lane, and extending thence, first southward to and along the said boundary wall, and then south-eastward along the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of the premises attached to the last-mentioned house for a distance in all of 11 chains or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the northern side of the yard or passage running along the northern and western sides of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Arlingford Road, and extending thence, first southward to and along the middle of the said yard or passage, and then along the middle of the roadway or footpath leading along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Arlingford Road for a distance in all of 3 chains or thereabouts to the junction of such roadway or footpath with the road leading from Tulse Hill to the northern end of Brailsford Road, and extending thence southward, first to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the houses and premises from Number 20 to Number 42 (inclusive) Arlingford Road, and then along such wall or fence for a distance of 31 chains or thereabouts to its southern end upon the northern side of the road leading from Tulse Hill between the houses known as Numbers 42 and 44, Arlingford Road, into Brailsford Road, and extending thence, first southward to, and then westward along, the middle of the last described road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the houses and premises from Number 44 to Number 86 (inclusive), Arlingford Road, and extending thence southward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of 81 chains or thereabouts to its southern end where it meets the wall or fence forming the boundary of Brockwell Park, upon the boundary which divides the said District Parish of Saint Matthew, Brixton, from the said New Parish of Saint Jude, East Brixton.

And whereas Drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.
