PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS an Army Council has been constituted under His Majesty's Letters Patent, and it is expedient to make such provision as is hereinafter contained with respect thereto:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Army Council.

All business, other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself, is to be transacted in the following principal divisions:—

(a) The Chief of the Imperial General Staff shall, in addition to performing such other duties as may from time to time be assigned to him by the Secretary of State, be responsible for issuing the orders of His Majesty's Government in regard to Military Operations.

(b) The Deputy Chief of the Imperial General Staff shall be responsible for the performance of such duties as the Chief of the Imperial General Staff may assign to him from time to time.

(c) The Adjutant-General, the Quartermaster-General and the Master-General of the Ordnance shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the organization, disposition, personnel, armament, and maintenance of the Army as shall be assigned to them, or each of them, from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(d) The Civil Member of the Army Council shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of business affecting the Territorial Force Associations, the Volunteer Force, and War Department lands, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(e) The Finance Member of the Army Council shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the finance of the Army, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(f) The Director-General of Military Aeronautics shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for so much of the business relating to the administration of the Army Air Service as is not subject to the control of either the Air Board or the Ministry of Munitions, and as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(g) The Director-General of Movements and Railways shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for so much of the business relating to the transport by rail or inland water-ways at home or abroad of the personnel and materiel of the Army as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(h) The Surveyor-General of Supply shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for so much of the business relating to the commercial administration of Army supplies as is not under the control of the Ministry of Munitions, and as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

2. The Secretary of the War Office will act as Secretary of the Army Council, and will be charged with the interior economy of the War Office, and the preparation of all official communications of the Council, and with such other duties as the Secretary of State may from time to time assign to him.

3. During the period of the War the Military Members of the Army Council shall have precedence amongst themselves according to their Army Seniority.

4. This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Orders in Council dated the 10th day of August, 1904, the 22nd day of November, 1909, the 14th day of October, 1915, and the 27th day of January, 1916.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 29th day of March, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the Arch-

deaconry of Bedford, in the Diocese of St. Albans:

“ Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconry of Bedford are desirable and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans, (in testimony whereof he has set his Hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that, as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, *first* the Rural Deanery of Eaton comprising the Parishes of Bolnhurst, Colnworth, Eaton Socon, Ravensden, Renhold, Roxton with Great Barford, Thurleigh, and Wilden, shall cease to exist, and that the said Parishes of Bolnhurst and Colnworth shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Riseley; the said Parishes of Eaton Socon, and Roxton with Great Barford, shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Biggleswade; the said Parishes of Ravensden, Renhold, and Wilden shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Bedford; and the said Parish of Thurleigh shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Felmersham; and *secondly* the Parishes of Langford and Edworth shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Biggleswade to the Rural Deanery of Shefford, and that each of the Parishes hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery in which it is hereby included or to which it is hereby transferred, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas a notice of the said Scheme has, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Archdeacon affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Bedford, and he has expressed his approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of St. Albans.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation bearing date the 1st day of March, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Augustine, Belvedere, situate within the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of All Saints, Belvedere, in the County of Kent, and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of All Saints, Belvedere, and of the Parish of Erith, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such New Parish and Parish respectively:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of All Saints, Belvedere, and of the said Parish of Erith, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Augustine, Belvedere, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, as such Bishop, with the consents of the Venerable Donald Tait, Archdeacon of Rochester, the Reverend Alfred William Boulden, of Christ Church Vicarage, Erith, in the said County of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders, Everard Hesketh, of Beachcroft, Eltham, in the said County of Kent, Esquire, and James Simms, of Craighead, Abbey Wood, in the said County of Kent, Esquire, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of All Saints, Belvedere, and with the consent of the Right Honourable Philip George, Baron Wynford, as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Erith, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of All Saints, Belvedere, and of the said Parish of Erith, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which

portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the *Map* or *Plan* hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Augustine, Belvedere, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Belvedere.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Belvedere, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of All Saints, Belvedere, in the County of Kent, and in the Diocese of Rochester, which is bounded upon the east and upon the north by the Parish of Erith, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Plumstead, in the said County of Kent, and in the Diocese of Southwark, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Plumstead, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Belvedere, at the junction of the road called Knee Hill with Abbey Lane, and extending thence in a straight line due east (thereby crossing part of Abbey Wood) for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of New Road, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing another part of Abbey Wood, and passing to the south of the public house called the Leather Bottle) for a distance of 57 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Heron Hill, St. Augustine's Road, and Upper Abbey Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Upper Abbey Road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ina Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Ina Road for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Picardy Road and Halt Robin Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Halt Robin Road for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to the point where such road turns northward, upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Belvedere, from the said Parish of Erith.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Erith which is bounded upon the north by the middle of the River Thames, upon the west by an isolated portion of the Parish of Plumstead, in the said County of Kent, and in the said Diocese of Southwark, upon the south by the above described portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Belvedere, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Belvedere, from the said Parish of Erith at the centre of the bridge which carries the North Kent Line of the South Eastern and Chatham Railway across Picardy Manor Way, and extending thence first northward, and then in various directions, along the middle of Picardy Manor

Way for a distance of 1 mile and 9 chains or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern side of the River Thames, and extending thence in a straight line due north for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the northern boundary of the said Parish of Erith in the middle of the River Thames."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order given under the Seal of Office of the Local Government Board on the 30th day of March, 1917, it was declared that on and after the 7th day of May, 1917, Part IV of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the District of the Urban District Council of Walsoken, the effect of which Order is to prevent any person suffering from any infectious disease from carrying on any trade or business unless he can do so without risk of spreading the disease. And also to grant to the Local Authority power to require dairymen to furnish a list of sources of supply of milk, and also that all dairymen are to notify any infectious disease existing among their servants. And also that no clothes are to be sent to a laundry unless they have been disinfected by or to the satisfaction of the Local Authority or their Medical Officer. And also that filthy and dangerous articles are to be purified or where necessary to be destroyed. And also that a child who is or has been suffering from an infectious disease is not to attend school without a medical certificate. And the effect of the Order is also to make provision as to the use of library books and for the payment of expenses of any person in a hospital and for the removal of any person from infected premises and for prohibiting the conveyance of infected persons in public vehicles and for the cleansing and disinfecting of premises in the district and for providing nurses for attendance on patients. But with regard to section 59, dealing with the use of public libraries, it is declared that until further order be made nothing in that section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district.
