At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 27th day of April, 1917.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by section 1, sub-section 1, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the lastmentioned Proclamation:

And whereas, by section 1, sub-section 2, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State, such List as so varied or added to being in the

last-mentioned Proclamation referred to as the "Statutory List":

And whereas the List contained in the lastmentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the Statutory List of persons and bodies of persons incorporated or unincorporated with whom trading is prohibited should be varied by the omission therefrom of all persons or bodies of persons in Porto Rico, in the Philippine Islands, and in the United States of America, and be further varied or added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Statutory List be varied by the omission therefrom of all persons or bodies of persons in Porto Rico, in the Philippine Islands, and in the United States of America, and be otherwise varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur

James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having any dealings with any of the persons or firms men-tioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3. A List (The Consolidating List, No. 25A) consolidating all previous Lists revised to date and including the amendments in the Schedule annexed hereto is issued concurrently with this Order. Consolidating List contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway,

Note (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the same country, all dealings in that country with such person or firm are pro-hibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses is specifically mentioned.

*Note (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

Note (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the A considerable amount of Statutory List. information is already available at the Foreign

Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

Note (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on Persons and firms in the United the List. Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

And whereas by Section 1 of the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, it is enacted that Schedule (A) to the Pharmacy Act, 1868, be repealed, and the Schedule to the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, substituted therefor, and that the said last-named Schedule may be amended by adding thereto any Article in the manner provided by Section 2 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868:

And whereas the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain did, on the 4th day of April, 1917, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them by Section 2 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as modified by Sec-

tion 1 of the Pioisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, resolve and declare as follows:—

"That Lead in combination with Oleic Acid, or other higher fatty Acids, whether sold as Diachylon or under any other designation (except machine-spread plasters) ought to be deemed a Poison within the meaning of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, and ought to be deemed a Poison in Part 1 of the Schedule of Poisons to that Act":

PACKING CASES.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Army Council hereby prohibit the manufacture of cases and crates, and the use of new cases and crates, for the packing of the goods listed in Schedule A hereto attached: Provided that nothing in this Order shall prohibit (1) the export as now packed of goods already packed for export at the date of this Order; (2) the packing in cases of the goods listed in Schedule B; (3) the packing in crates of the goods listed in Schedule C.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF FEMALE WRITING ASSISTANT IN THE GENERAL POST OFFICE, IN LONDON, AND IN THE OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC TRUSTEE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

- 1. The limits of age for these situations are 16 and 18. If an Examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of February in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of August in that year.
- 2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—
 - (a) That they are unmarried, or widows.
 - (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.
 - (c) That they are natural-born or naturalised British Subjects.
- 3. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General and the Public Trustee may from time to time fix.
- 4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—
 - 1. English Composition.
 - 2. Handwriting.
 - 3. Spelling.
 - 4. Arithmetic.
 - 5. Geography.
 - 6. Reading Manuscript.
- 5. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by her Parent or Guardian, that she will, if successful, reside either with her parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.

Candidates who fail to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general proficiency will not be regarded as qualified.

- 6. Candidates for the Post Office Service must be at least five feet in height.
- 7. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition.
- 8. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has

been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 10. A fee of 7s. 6d. will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

ENGLAND, EAST COAST.

River Humber and Approaches-Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 399 of 1917; hereby

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force:-

1. That portion of the Humber which lies between two straight lines, drawn from shore to shore, as follows:—(1) a line drawn 225° (S. 61° W. Mag.) through Spurn lighthouse, (2) drawn 344° (North Mag.) from the east side of Barrow haven, will be referred to as the port" in these regulations.

2. Shipowners and local agents are warned that their vessels should be directed to conform

to the following regulations:

(I) Except under exceptional circumstances merchant vessels will be free to enter or leave the port during the hours of Official day.

(II) Before entering the port merchant vessels must receive permission and the necessary instructions from the Examination steamer, and before leaving they must obtain permission through the Collector of Customs at Hull, Grimsby, or Goole, as the case may be.

(III) Shipowners and local agents are advised to time the arrival of their vessels at the

port for daylight.

(IV) Vessels desiring to enter the port from seaward are, unless previously met by the Examination steamer, to proceed Southern Examination anchorage during strong northerly or easterly winds, when they should proceed to the Northern Examination anchorage) and there anchor.

(V) The Examination steamer will be met in the Examination area between Bull light-vessel

and Chequer Shoal buoy.

The Examination steamer will be distinguished by the following means:-

By Day.—A white ensign, and at the foremast head the special flag mentioned in Part II of Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1 of When the port is closed 3 red balls will be hoisted in addition to the special flag.

By Night.—Three lights vertically, 3 feet. apart, conspicuously displayed at the end of a yard so as to show an unbroken light round the horizon. When the port is closed these lights will be red, when it is open they will be white.

Note—These lights are in addition to the

ordinary navigation lights.

(VI) There are two Examination anchorages. The northern is to be used in strong northerly and easterly winds. The southern is to be used under all other conditions

The Northern Examination anchorage comprises those portions of Hawke road and Middle shoal included between the intersection of the following lines of bearing:-

(1) Skeffling church bearing 18° (N. 34° E. Mag.).

(2) Skeffling church bearing 4° (N. 20° E.

(3) Spurn lighthouse bearing 120° (S. 44° E. Mag.).

(4) Extreme of Spurn point bearing 115° (S. 49° E. Mag.).

The Southern Examination Anchorage comprising the area bounded as follows:

1) On the north by the Bull sand.

(2) On the south by the three fathom contour line northward of Tetney haven.

(3) On the east by the line joining the Bulk light-vessel and entrance to Tetney haven.

(4) On the west by a line parallel to and 7 cables from the eastern limit (3).

Note.—When the Southern Examination anchorage is full of shipping further arrivals should anchor eastward of and as near to it as

The Examination area is that portion of the river enclosed by an irregular line drawn from the Bull light-vessel to the extreme of Spurn point, thence to the Chequer Shoal buoy, thence to a point 210° (S. 46° W. Mag.) of and distant 7 cables from Bull light-vessel and thence to Bull light-vessel.

All pilotage certificates granted to masters and mates for the whole or any part of the Humber Pilotage district are suspended and further all vessels (irrespective of draught, size, or nationality, but with the exception of those provided for in paragraph 4) bound to or from any place on the Humber must be conducted by licensed pilots over the whole or any part of the waters between Hull and the Outer Pilotage station of the Humber Pilotage district, which, until further notice, will be situated in the neighbourhood of the Bull light-vessel.

4. In the case of lighter inter-dock traffic and of small British vessels engaged in local traffic above Immingham, pilotage by licensed

pilots is not compulsory.

5. During the hours of official night, and during fog with visibility of less than half-amile, no traffic is permitted to move on the Humber below Paull point; also when these conditions prevail no vessel should enter or remain within a radius of five miles from Humber (late Spurn) light-vessel.

6. A vessel should not approach the Humber unless there is sufficient time available to enable such vessel to obtain a pilot and to arrive at her destination, or at a position in which she is permitted to anchor before the commencement of

official night.

7. No vessel should anchor whilst awaiting

a pilot.

8. Vessels when leaving the Humber must proceed direct to sea. Should it be necessary to wait for the weather to moderate or clear, they must remain inside the river at an authorised anchorage.

The pilot lobbies will be notified when the existence of fog outside the river is known.

9. A pilot should not board a vessel unless there is sufficient time available to enable such vessel to arrive at her destination, or at a position in which she is permitted to anchor, before the commencement of official night. The latest time at which the pilot cutter stationed at the Bull light-vessel should board inward-bound vessels is one hour before the commencement of official night.

Vessels bound outward should not pass Hawkins point later than 45 minutes before the com-

mencement of official night.

10. All vessels proceeding into or out of the Humber must be navigated by way of Hawke and Sunk roads passing to the northward of the Bull light-vessel, except those outwardbound from Grimsby, which may cross the Middle shoal passing at once into the channel north of the Middle.

Note.—The five-fathom channel through the Sunk and Hawke roads is very narrow at the western entrance and also at a point north of the Middle light-vessel; deep-draught vessels steaming against the tide when approaching the buoys marking these portions of the channel should endeavour to avoid passing other vessels between them by easing engines to allow ships with the tide under them to get through first. Smaller vessels outward-bound should pass close to the southward of the buoys marking the south side, and those inward-bound close to the northward of the buoys marking the north side, of the narrow portions of the channel, provided always that their draught of water and the state of the tide will admit.

- 11. Sailing vessels of 50 tons register and upwards when entering or leaving the Humber must be towed through the Boom Defence gateways. Should tugs not be available, inward-bound vessels may anchor north-westward of the No. 2 Lower Middle light-float at a distance of not more than 1½ miles from it, but they must not bring the before-mentioned light-float to bear to the southward of 128° (S. 36° E. Mag.).
- 12. All vessels entering or leaving Grimsby docks must pass to the southward of the No. 4 Lower Burcom buoy except those making use of the channel southward of the Burcom shoal (hereinafter called the Burcom channel), which are exempted from this condition, but no vessel may cross the Burcom shoal between the No. 5 Middle Burcom and No. 4 Lower Burcom buoys. Vessels using the Burcom channel must pass into and out of its western end to the eastward of No. 6 Upper Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, and through a gateway at its eastern end 170 feet wide each side of which is marked by a dolphin surmounted by a black triangle supported on a white pole.

Vessels making use of this gateway are cautioned to keep well in the middle of the opening and are subject to the following regulations:—

- (1) Vessels navigating against the tide must in all cases give way to those navigating with the tide.
- (2) No vessel must approach the defences in this part of the river nearer than a quarter of a mile except to pass through the before-mentioned gateway or to enter Grimsby docks.
- (3) No vessel may tow more than two craft at one time through the gateway, as stated in paragraph 17.
- (4) Distant signals will be shown from the flagstaff on the West Pier at the Grimsby Dock entrance as follows:—
 - (a) Two black balls will denote that the gateway is open.
 - (b) Three black balls will denote that the gateway is closed.
 - (c) No signal being hoisted denotes that traffic is suspended.

When signal (b) three black balls is hoisted, no vessel may approach the gateway, and when traffic is suspended no vessels, other than H.M. Ships on special duty, may use the gateway.

- 13. Prohibited Anchorage areas:—
- (1) Anchorage is prohibited for all vessels between two imaginary lines:—
 - (a) Joining Stone Creek Coast Guard

flagstaff and the eastern extremity of the eastern jetty at Immingham.

- (b) Joining the riverward beacon of the two centre measured mile beacons on Sunk island and the northernmost of two clumps shown southward of Stallingborough on Admiralty Chart No. 109. The latter line passes through the position of No. 6 Upper Burcom buoy.
- (II) No merchant vessel shall anchor (except when granted special permission) between the before-mentioned prohibited anchorage area (I) and the line of transit of the eastern measured mile beacons on Sunk island produced to the Lincolnshire shore or (except as provided for in paragraph 11) to the northward of the line of the Killingholme leading lights or within 1½ cables of any of the Admiralty mooring buoys.
- (III) Anchorage is prohibited for merchant vessels in the following areas:—
 - (a) Between a line joining New Clee railway station and Patrington church and a line joining Middle light-vessel and No. 4 Lower Burcom buoy extended to both banks of the Humber.
 - (b) An area bounded on the north by a line joining No. 4 Lower Burcom buoy and Spurn lighthouse, and on the west by a line joining Cleethorpes pier pavilion and Skeffling church.
- (IV) No vessel of any description may anchor on the south side of the Bull sand between the western limit of the Southern Examination anchorage described in paragraph 2 of this notice and a line drawn through the Cleethorpes Sewer outfall beacon (on which a red light is exhibited in peace time) in a direction 60° (N. 76° E. Mag.), passing through a point 299° (North-west Mag.) distant 7 cables from Spurn lighthouse; nor on the north side of the Bull sand between the beforementioned line of bearing passing through the Cleethorpes Sewer outfall and a line joining Sprun lighthouse and the Bull light-vessel produced to the Bull sand.
- 14. No merchant vessels or boats, &c., will be allowed to approach within a quarter of a mile of any defence work (except to pass through the Boom gateways) or to go alongside any Government ship, vessel, lighter, or any other Government craft, or any Government establishment, without special permission. All vessels proceeding up and down the Humber are to pass at a distance at least three cables from H.M. Ships, if the depth of water and circumstances of navigation permit.
- 15. All vessels employed in laying moorings, raising wrecks, &c., must be passed at slow speed, propelling engines being eased at least 300 yards before reaching such vessels and so continued for 150 yards after passing them. While the said mooring or wreck raising craft are at work they will each fly a red flag.
- 16. Anchor lights are to be reduced in power and screened as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1143 of 1916.

Vessels anchored in the Humber westward of the meridian of Greenwich are to exhibit anchor lights as mentioned above, except that between Immingham and the meridian of Greenwich they are to be reduced in brilliancy so as to be invisible at any greater distance than half-a-mile. Eastward of the meridian of Greenwich no lights whatever are to be

Anchor lights authorised by these orders are never on any account to be extinguished; the -order "Out Lights" will not apply to them.

-Bow and masthead steaming lights are to be as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1143 of 1916.

Other lights are to be as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1143 of 1916, and this order also applies to vessels in dock or alongside quays and jetties. Notwith-standing anything in these orders, dredgers may be permitted to work at Hull and Immingham at night provided all their lights are extinguished within half-an-hour of issue of the general order "Out Lights."

The above orders will not absolve the Masters of craft at anchor from keeping a sharp look-out and giving warning on the approach of any craft under way.

The above orders apply to vessels of every description, other than H.M. ships. Thelatter should, however, comply so far as the visibility of anchor lights eastward of Immingham is concerned.

- Vessels are prohibited from towing more than two craft at one time through the gateway at the eastern end of the Burcom channel referred to in paragraph 12, each side of which is marked by a dolphin surmounted by a black triangle supported on a white pole; no tug is permitted to tow more than three craft at one time through the remaining gateways of the Boom defence. Owners of tugs may apply to the Humber Conservancy Board for pilot licences for the masters of their vessels which will enable them to pilot their own vessels and river craft comprising their tow (in certain parts of the river). The number of craft 'towed will be restricted according to the power of the tug.
- 18. Humber Rule No. 18 is to be strictly enforced. No sound signals other than navigation signals authorised by the Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea, and by Humber Rules Nos. 14 to 16 (inclusive) at all times of the day or night, and No. 17 during the day only, are on any account to be used by vessels in any part of the Humber, the Old Harbour at Hull, or within any of the docks at Hull, Immingham and Grimsby
- 19. Owners of small vessels plying in the vicinity of the Humber are instructed not to paint their craft light grey, and are hereby directed to have any vessels so coloured repainted. They are warned that small vessels painted grey run a great risk of being fired upon in mistake for submarines. Vessels upon in mistake for submarines. painted black run the least risk.
- 20. Fishing in the Humber.—No vessel is allowed to fish in the Humber below Hull without a permit from the Admiralty port officer; all fishing, shrimping, trawling, or whelking in this portion of the river in areas other than those for which permits are granted is prohibited.
- 21. Regulations affecting small craft in the vicinity of Cleethorpes.—Pleasure boats may ply for hire at Cleethorpes only between the Eastern and Western Sewer Outfall beacons, and must keep within a distance of one mile from the shore.

Notwithstanding anything in these orders, rowing boats may pass along the shore at Clee-

- thorpes, but they must keep within 400 yards of the high-water mark of spring tides.
- 22. Excursions by Water.—Excursions by water are limited to the River Humber above Hull, and Rivers Ouse and Trent. Excursion steamers will not be allowed to ply without a permit from the Admiralty port officer, Dock Offices, Immingham, and in no case are they to pass to the eastward of an imaginary line joining Victoria Dock entrance, Hull, and the east beacon on Skitter Ness.
- 23. Patrol of Internal Waterways.—The internal waterways of the port will be policed by Naval patrol vessels and by the Humber Conservancy Board under the direction of the Naval authorities.

Captains and Masters of Merchant Vessels and persons in charge of barges or boats of any kind are hereby warned to observe any orders which may be given to them by Naval Patrol vessels or the duly authorised officers of the Humber Conservancy Board.

24-25. Warning.—Warning is hereby given that vessels disobeying the above regulations will be liable to be fired on.

 $Variation.-16^{\circ} W.$

Note.—This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprison-

ment and fine.

Port and Harbour of Burntisland-Traffic of Neutral Vessels prohibited.

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulation has been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty:

On and after the 1st May, 1917, no vessels other than those of British nationality or those of the Allied Nations shall enter the Port and Harbour of Burntisland, within the statutory limits administered by the Burntisland Harbour Commissioners, until further Notice.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (CON-SOLIDATION) ACT, 1914, AND THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGU-LATIONS.

Bye-Laws (Orders) made by the Corporation of Trinity House, London, acting under the Instructions of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, in respect of the holders of the Admiralty Special Deep Sea Pilotage Certificates for the waters from and including Great Yarmouth, northward up to and including Berwick-on-Tweed.

- A Pilot shall not add to or in any manner alter his certificate, or make or alter any endorsement thereon, nor shall he be privy to any such certificate or endorsement being added to or altered.
- 2. A Pilot who is ordered to proceed on his Majesty's Service on Pilotage duties by the London Trinity House or any of their Officers duly authorised to act in matters of Pilotage, or by any Officer in His Majesty's Service, shall immediately proceed thereon, and any Pilot who fails so to do, or who evades the receipt of any such order, or who quits or declines such service, shall be liable for the first offence to a fine of five pounds, and for the second and every subsequent offence of ten pounds.
- 3. A Pilot shall, in obedience to the order or summons of the London T nity House, attend at the Trinity House in London, and in default of such attendance he shall be liable for the first offence to a fine of forty shillings, and for the second and every subsequent offence of five pounds.
- 4. A Pilot shall at once notify any change of his address to the London Trinity House.
- 5. If a Pilot has been convicted either on indictment or summarily of any felony, misdemeanour or other offence, and sentenced to imprisonment without the option of a fine, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these Bye-Laws.
- 6. A Pilot who observes any alteration in any of the Sands or Channels, or that any Seamarks are out of place, or do not show their proper distinctive characters, shall forthwith deliver or send a correct statement thereof in writing to the Trinity House in London.
- 7. A Pilot shall conform himself strictly to all directions which may be given to him by any Harbour Master touching the mooring, unmooring, placing or removing of any ship under his charge, so long as such ship is within the limits of the authority of the Harbour Master.
- 8. A Pilot who neglects to use the lead in circumstances in which he should have taken that precaution shall be deemed to have failed in or neglected his duty as a Pilot.

9. A Pilot shall, immediately before joining a ship in any Port, call at the Custom House, with a view to obtaining the latest Traffic instructions, and if he is in one of the undermentioned Ports, shall also call, if possible, at the Office of the local Pilotage Authority for the same purpose.

- 10. When a ship while in charge of a Pilot has touched the ground, or has been in collision with any other ship or any fixed or floating object, the Pilot shall immediately report the occurrence in writing, on the form prescribed, to the London Trinity House. Collision reports shall be treated as confidential until both parties to the collision have made their depositions before the proper authority.
- 11. When a ship while in charge of a Pilot has been in collision with a mine, or has been struck by a torpedo, the Pilot shall immediately report the occurrence in writing to the London Trinity House, and such reports shall be treated as confidential.
- 12. When anchors or cables have been lost from any ship while in charge of a Pilot he shall immediately report the occurrence in writing, on the form prescribed, to the London Trinity House.
- 13. A Pilot shall not send or be privy to sending any unlicensed person to take charge of a ship, and in any case where he is unable to pilot a ship for which his services have been requested, or where he has knowledge of a ship requiring a Pilot, he shall communicate with a licensed Pilot or with his Pilotage Station, so that a licensed Pilot can be sent to the ship.
- 14. A Pilot on going on board a ship for the purpose of piloting the same shall produce his Certificate to the Master.

Pilotage Dues, etc.

15. The Pilotage Dues, etc., to be paid in respect of the services of Pilots shall be those specified below:—

For the first hundred miles, 2s. 6d. a mile. For the second hundred miles, 2s. a mile. For distances beyond, 1s. 3d. a mile.

The above scale is to include boarding and landing charges and normal expenses, with the exception of the actual 3rd class railway fares incurred. In the event of detention beyond the time a ship is actually under way detention money will be chargeable at the rate of £1 a day.

Note.—Section 50 of the Pilotage Act, 1913, enacts that a licensed Pilot shall not demand or receive, and a master shall not offer or pay to any licensed Pilot, dues in respect of pilotage

- services at any other rates, whether greater or less, than the rates which may be demanded by law, and, if a pilot or master acts in contravention of this enactment, he shall be liable in respect of each offence to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.
- 16. A Pilot who may be landed or shipped on one of the Pilot Steamers belonging to the London Trinity House shall pay the sum of £1 to the said Trinity House.
- 17. If on the examination of a Pilot for the renewal of his certificate he is found to be suffering from deafness, or defective vision, to a degree rendering him inefficient to carry out the duties of a Pilot, or from colour blindness, or if he is otherwise incompetent to act as a Pilot, his certificate shall not be renewed.

Fees for Certificates.

18. A Pilot who has obtained his Certificate in exchange for an existing one through a Pilotage Authority shall continue to pay to that Authority the poundage on his fees laid down in the Authority's Bye-Laws as if he held his certificate direct from the Authority.

The fees to be paid in respect of Deep Sea Special Pilotage Certificates shall be as fol-

On the grant of a Certificate ... £2 2 0 On the renewal of a Certificate £1 1 0

Provided, however, that if the applicant for a Certificate already holds a Deep Sea Certificate from a Pilotage Authority, for the waters in question, the fees for the grant shall not be payable.

- 19. Any special Pilotage Certificate may be suspended or revoked at any time by the London Trinity House acting under authority of the Admiralty.
- 20. The above Bye-Laws will come into force on May 15th, 1917.
