

Hull, and Rivers Ouse and Trent. Excursion steamers will not be allowed to ply without a permit from the Admiralty port officer, Dock Offices, Immingham, and in no case are they to pass to the eastward of an imaginary line joining Victoria Dock entrance, Hull, and the east beacon on Skitter Ness.

23. Patrol of Internal Waterways.—The internal waterways of the port will be policed by Naval patrol vessels and by the Humber Conservancy Board under the direction of the Naval authorities.

Captains and Masters of Merchant Vessels and persons in charge of barges or boats of any kind are hereby warned to observe any orders which may be given to them by Naval Patrol vessels or the duly authorised officers of the Humber Conservancy Board.

24-25. Warning.—Warning is hereby given that vessels disobeying the above regulations will be liable to be fired on.

Variation.—16° W.

Note.—This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.

RICHMOND (SURREY) ELECTRICITY SUPPLY.

(Provisions with regard to Supply of Electricity; Alterations in Price of Electricity and for Meters; Amendments of Provisions of Agreements Scheduled to Richmond (Surrey) Electricity Supply Act, 1907, and Richmond (Surrey) Electricity Supply Act, 1913; Confirmation of Agreement; Repeal and Amendments of Acts, etc.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Richmond (Surrey) Electric Light and Power Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") for an Act for the following purposes, or some of them (that is to say):—

To make further provision with reference to the supply of electricity in the borough of Richmond, in the county of Surrey, to authorise or make provision with reference to increases or other alterations of the prices charged by the Company for the supply of electricity and for meters, and for further increases or other alterations of such prices, and to amend or alter existing provisions in regard to the aforesaid matters or any of them.

To ratify and confirm any agreement or agreements which may have been entered into or which may hereafter be entered into by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the said borough (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") and the Company in relation to all or any of the above matters.

To alter, amend, extend, enlarge or repeal all or some of the powers and provisions of the Richmond (Surrey) Electric Lighting Order, 1883, the Borough of Richmond (Surrey) Order, 1892, the Richmond (Surrey) Electricity Supply Act, 1907, and the agreement dated the 8th day of December, 1891, scheduled to and confirmed by the last-mentioned Act, the Richmond (Surrey) Electricity Supply Act, 1913, and the agreement dated the 20th day of January, 1913, scheduled to and confirmed by such Act, and all other Acts or Orders relating to the Company.

Printed Copies of the intended Act will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons as soon as leave shall have been given by Parliament to introduce the Bill.
