Rome, August 14.

**T**HE Congregation for the Business of Liege met on Monday last, and spent several hours in hearing the Allegations and Proofs on both sides; but a dispute arising about some Clauses of the Statutes of that Church, whereof different Copies were produced, it was thought necessary that an Authentick Copy of the said Statutes at large should be laid before them, and that the procuring of the same should be recommended to the Popes Internuncio at Cologne; to whom an Express was dispatched, with Directions accordingly; and because this would take up some time, the Congregation adjourned till the 20th of the next month. The Pope has given the Archbishoprick of Genoua to Signior Spinola, who was before Bishop of Sarzano. The 14th was celebrated in St. Peter's Church the Anniversary of the Death of Pope Innocent XI. at which the Colledge of Cardinals assisted; but it was observed that none of the French Cardinals were present, who, upon account of the differences that happened between that Pope and the Court of France, seem unwilling to shew any respect to his Memory. The Pope has ordered some new Levies to be made to reinforce his Garisons; which is done, as some believe, in order to put himself into a posture to hinder any Foreign Troops from taking Winter-quarters within the Ecclesiastical Territories; though there appears no ground for any such apprehension.

Genoua, August 14. The matter about the Contributions demanded of this Republick, towards the subsistence of the Imperial Troops in Italy, is not yet adjusted, tho' the Secretary Savago has been several times at Milan about it; whither he is now going again, with new Instructions, to Negotiate this Affair, as well as to accommodate the difference between this State and the Spaniards, about the selling of Salt at Final. Several Barks are lately arrived here from Thoulon, who left the French Fleet in that Port.

Milan, August 20. A new Order has been published here this Week, requiring all Officers in the service of this State, to repair forthwith to their several Commands, notwithstanding

any former leave they may have to be absent. Casal is now so closely blockt up, that the Garison can receive no Supplies from abroad.

Venice, August 20. The Master of a Vessel who came from Napoli di Romania the 30th of the last month, reports, That the great Convoy, which parted from hence about the middle of June, arrived there 9 or 10 days before he came away, together with the Popes and Maltese Gallies; That the Captain General Zeno, who had before disposed every thing for the opening of the Campagne, had detached 4000 men to strengthen the Troops that guard the Isthmus of Corinth, that they might be in a condition to oppose any attempt of the Enemies on that side, and that he had caused the rest of the Forces, consisting of about 14000 men, Horse and Foot, to embark on the Transport Vessels, and designed to Sail with them towards the Archipelago. The Letters from Dalmatia of the 9th inform us, That the Proveditore General Delfino was encamped with 12000 men near Cichut, and that he had given Orders not only for repairing the Fortifications of that place, which were ruined in the late Siege, but for adding likewise several new works, which would make it much stronger than it was before. The Bassa's of Albania and Bosnia had separated their Troops, and sent them back to their Quarters. The Chevalier Lando took possession two days ago of the Dignity of Procurator of St. Mark, (which was lately conferred upon him) with a great deal of Solemnity.

Vienna, August 25. The last Letters from Hungary, say, That the Aga of the Janisaries, with several other Turkish Officers, arrived at Belgrade in the beginning of this month, and that the Visier, who was pressed by several Expresses dispatched to him by the Bassa's of Belgrade and Temeswaer to hasten his Journey, arrived there the 12th; That the Forces he brought with him consisted not of above 20000 men, to which might be added 10 or 12000 more, who have had their Winter Quarters near the Danube, and about the like number of Tartars, commanded by their Han, who are said to have passed the Danube at Widin. General Veterani, who Commands the Imperial Forces in Transilvania, upon notice of the march of the Tartars, detached two Regiments
