A PROCLAMATION,

Declaring the Parliament shall be Prorogued until the Five and Twentieth day of October next.

W Hereas this present Parliament stands Prorogued to the Eighteenth day of this Instant September, We, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, for weighty reasons Us especially moving, do hereby Publish and Declare Our Royal Pleasure, That the same Parliament shall upon the said Eighteenth day of September, be further Prorogued unto the Five and twentieth day of October next; Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgesses of the House of Commons, and all others whom it may concern, may hereby take Notice: We letting them know, That We will not at the said Eighteenth day of this Instant September, expect the Attendance of any, but such as being in and about Our Cities of London and Westminster, may attend the making of the said Prorogation, in such manner as heretofore in like Cases hath been accustomed.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall the Sixth Day of September, 1694. In the Sixth Year of Our Reign.

Rome, Aug. 21. On Wednesday last arrived here an Express, dispatched by the Elector of Bavaria to his Minister at this Court, with an Authentick Copy of the Statutes of the Church of Liege; Whereupon the Congregation who had put off their farther meeting till the 20th of September, because of the dispute about some Clauses of the said Statutes, wherein the Copies that were produced to them did materially differ, have resolved to meet on the first day of the same month, to proceed upon this matter; which in all probability will at last be determined in favour of the Elector of Cologne, though the French Cardinals do still continue their solicitations to make his Election void.

Lighorne, Aug. 23. We hear from Genoua, that a Vessel was arrived there from the Coast of Spain, the Master whereof declared, that he left the Fleet commanded by Admiral Russell, on the 12th Instant, before Barcelona. The French Fleet continues still at Toulon, as we understand by a Bark that is come from thence in two days; The Marechal de Tourville had sent out divers light Frigats, Tartanes, and Felucca's, to get Intelligence.

Turin, Aug. 27. The Duke of Savoy marched the 25th from Plois, and encamped between Orbassan and Rivalle, where the Army will continue

some days, and then march on to the Valley of Susa. Another Detachment of 900 Germans is gone to reinforce the Blockade of Cazal.

Venice, Aug. 27. The Senate have received Letters from Napoli di Romania of the 31th of the last month, which give an account, that the Baron de Steinau, General of our Land Forces, arrived there with the great Convoy on the 20th. That the Captain General Zeno had sent a Reinforcement of 2000 Foot and 1500 Horse to the Troops appointed for the Guard of the Isthmus of Corinth; and that he set sail the 25th with the rest of the Forces, and all the Men of War and Gallies, that were in that Port; but upon what design is not yet known. They write from Dalmatia, that the Proveditore General Delfino was returned to Spalato, having posted most of his Troops about Ciclus till the Fortifications of that place be repaired.

Vicma, Aug. 28. The Grand Visier's arrival at Belgrade is confirmed by the last Letters from Hungary, and those from Peter-Waradin of the 21th add, that he had passed the Save with the Ottoman Army, and was encamped near Senly; Which Count Guido of Staremberg had by Express given advice of to the Count de Heydersheim, who was posted with the Imperial Horse at Petsch on the River Theyffe, desiring him withal, to hasten his Conjunction with the rest of the Forces that lay near Peter-Waradin, that so they might be in a posture to advance towards the Enemy, or to take such other measures as should be thought most proper. General Caprara has assisted at several Councils of War that have been held here this week; and is now on his departure for Hungary, to command the Imperial Army on the Danube.

Mentz, Sept. 4. The Chapter of this Church met here on the 2d Instant, where it was resolved, at the desire of our Archbishop, to proceed the next day to the Election of a Coadjutor, when the Chapter being again assembled, the Choice fell by unanimous consent upon the Bishop of Bamberg, which was proclaimed with the usual Ceremonies.

Frankfort, Sept. 5. The Armies on the Upper-Rhine continue in their former Camps; The Confederates at Kretzingen near Durlach, and the French near Creutznach. We have Advice that the Germans have defeated a French Party of 300 Men, which was sent out from Brisac. The Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel continues still in this City.

Paris, Septemb. 6. The Letters from Toulon of the 28th past tell us, that the French Fleet was still in that Port; and that the Marechal de Tourville had received Advice by a small Vessel, that Admiral Russell failed from Barcelona the 26th of the last month, and appeared the 27th before Blancs, which is about 4 Leagues from Palamos.
