APROCLAMATION,

Declaring the Parliament shall be Prorogued until the Five and Twentieth day of October next.

MARIE R.

THereas this prefint Parliament flands Prorogued to the Eighteenth day of this Instant September, We, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, for weighty reafins Us especially moving, do hereby Publish and Declare Our Royal Pleasure, That the Same Parliament shall upon the Said Eighteenth day of September, be further Prorogued unto the Five and twen-tieb day of October next; Whereof the Lords Spirital and Timporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Buzelfes of the House of Commons, and all others whom it may concern, may hereby take Notice: We letting them know, That We will not at the said Lightemb day of this Instant September, expett the Attendance of any, but such as being in and about Our Cities of London and Westminster, may attend the misting of the said Prorogation, in such manner as kentofore in like Cases hath been accustomed.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall the Sixth Day of September, 1694. In the Sixth Year of Our Reign.

Rme, Aug. 21. On Wednesday last arrived here an Express, dispatched by the Elector of Bavarie to his Minister at this Court, with an Authentick Copy of the Statutes of the Church of Lige; Whereupon the Congregation who had put off their farther meeting till the 20th of September, because of the dispute about some Clauses of the faid Statutes, wherein the Copies that were produced to them did materially differ, have refolved to meet on the first day of the fame month, to proceed upon this matter; which in all probability will at last be determined in favour of the Elector of Cologne, though the French Cardinals do still continue their follicitations to make his Election void.

Lighorne, Lug. 23. We hear from Genous, that Wellel was arrived there from the Coast of Spain, the Master whereof declared, that he left the Fleet commanded by Admiral Ruffell, on the 12th Instant, before Barcelone. The French Fleer continues still at Trulen, as we understand by a Bark that is come from thence in two days; The Mareschal de Tour-vile had sent out divers light Frigats, Tartanes,

fome days, and then march on to the Valley of Susa. Another Detachement of 900 Germans is gone to reinforce the Blockade of Cazel.

Venice, Aug. 27. The Senate have received Letters from Napoli di Romania of the 31th of the last month, which give an account, that the Baron de Steinau, General of our Land Forces, arrived there with the great Convoy on the 20th. That the Captain General Zeno had fent a Reinforcement of 2000 Foot and 1500 Horse to the Troops appointed for the Guard of the Ishmus of Corinth; and that he fet fail the 25th with the rest of the Forces, and all the Men of War and Galleys, that were in that Port; but upon what defign is not yet known. They write from Dala matia, that the Proveditore General Delfino was returned to Spalaro, having posted most of his Troops about Ciclus till the Fortifications of that place be repaired.

Vicana, Aug. 28. The Grand Visier's arrival at Belgrade is confirmed by the last Letters from Hungary, and those from Peter-Waradin of the 21th add, that he had passed the Save with the Ottoman Army, and was encamped near Sen. lyn; Which Count Guido of Staremberg had by Express given advice of to the Count de Heyderf. heim, who was posted with the Imperial Horse at Petsch on the River Theysse, desiring him withal to hasten his Conjunction with the rest of the Forces that lay near Perer-Waradin, that so they might be in a posture to advance towards the Enemy, or to take such other measures as should be thought most proper. General Caprara has affisted at several Councils of War that have been held here this week; and is now on his departure for Hungary, to command the Imperial Army on

Mentz, Sept. 4. The Chapter of this Church met here on the 2d Instant, where it was resolved, at the defire of our Archbishop, to proceed the next day to the Election of a Coadjutor, when the Chapter being again assembled, the Choice fell by unanimous consent upon the Bishop of Bamberg, which was proclaimed with the usual Ceremonies.

We have Advice that the Germans have defeated a French Party of 300 Men, which was kent out from Brifac. The Landtgrave of Hesse-Cassell continues still in this City.
