

## Article 6.

On completion of the requisition, the captain of the port will compile a list of the goods requisitioned with the necessary indications to distinguish them, and the price fixed and the name of the Administration on whose account they have been requisitioned.

The list will be published in the Official Notices of the Province and exhibited at the Office of the port.

## Article 7.

The indemnity for requisition will be paid, after deduction of the expenses, to the person to whom goods would have been handed over according to paragraph 2 of Article 1.

In case of doubt or controversy, or if the indemnity is not accepted, it will be paid, after deduction of the expenses, into the Deposits and Loans Caisse to the account of the person to whom it belongs.

Payment in this manner can similarly be made if within the period prescribed under Article 9 no one appears to claim the indemnity.

## Article 8.

Whoever claims an indemnity for requisition, if the conditions of the first part of Article 2 apply, may apply to the Commission established there, which will arrange for the deposit or payment of the sum fixing the appropriate guarantees according to the conditions and for the effects provided in the same article.

## Article 9.

The period of 60 days fixed in the first part of the Sole Article of the Decree of August 27, 1916, No. 1119, begins, for the purposes of the same Decree, from the time of the publication of the list in the Official Notices of the Province, provided for in Article 6.

It lies with the Administration on whose account the requisition is made to apply for the constitution of an arbitration college in the sense of Article 2 of the Decree of October 30, 1915, No. 1570.

## Article 10.

The application of the present Decree does not prejudice regulations in force for the subjects of enemy States or States allied with the enemy, and for the exercise of the right of Prize.

## Article 11.

The Minister of Maritime and Railway Transports, in concert with the Ministers of Foreign Affairs, Finance and War, will issue regulations for the execution of the present Decree.

## Article 12.

The regulations referred to in the present Decree are issued by the officials of the Port Office and of the Royal Customs without any responsibility on their part or that of the public Administration, and without prejudice to the reciprocal rights of the parties.

## Article 13.

The present Decree is also applicable to goods disembarked before this date from ships placed at the disposal of the Administration of the State.

In such cases the time limit fixed by Article 3 begins from the date of publication of the Decree.

As regards requisitions effected before the enforcement of the present Decree, the arrangements of the Sole Article of the above-mentioned Decree of August 27, 1916, hold good.

## Article 14.

The present Decree will take effect from the date of its publication in the Official Gazette.

The KING has been pleased, in pursuance of the provisions of the Second Schedule to the Military Service Act, 1916 (5 & 6 Geo. V., cap. 104), to appoint Mr. Jonathan Catherall, of Hawkesbury, Buckley, Chester, to be a member of the Appeal Tribunal for the county of Flint.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulation 37 of the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers thereunto enabling them, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby make the following Order:—

The Orders contained in Admiralty War Instructions for British Merchant Ships or in any instructions or advice, confidential or otherwise, issued or given to Masters of vessels by British or Allied Naval Officers, or by other duly authorised Officers or Officials, as to routes to be taken and other precautions to be observed to avoid capture or destruction by the enemy, are to be observed even when they are in conflict with the provisions of the Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea, and every vessel observing such regulations, instructions or advice shall be deemed to be taking measures to meet "special circumstances"
