Milan, Septemb. 1.

THE Fort of St. George, near *Cazal*, is surrendered to the Imperial and Spanish Troops, Commanded by Major General *Areze*; and the Garrison are made Prisoners of War; The French in *Cazal* are now so streightned, that they cannot receive any supplies from abroad. The Secretary *Salvago* is coming hither from *Genova* to adjust the matter of the Contributions, as also that about the selling of Salt at *Final*, which has been the subject of much dispute between the Spaniards and that Republick. A new Order has been Published here this week against carrying any Corn out of this State, without the Governours leave; And Commissioners are appointed to see the same duly executed.

Venice, Septemb. 4. The Letters from *Dalmatia* of the 22th past, give an account, That the *Proveditore General Delfino* was returned to *Spalatro* with part of the Forces that were employed in the taking of *Ciclut*, having left the rest in the Neighbourhood of that place, to cover the Workmen, who are repairing the Fortifications that were ruined during the Siege; and so soon as this is done, 'tis said the *Proveditore* will undertake some farther Enterprise against the Enemy, who are in no very good condition on that side, having emptied their Garrisons by the Succours they have been obliged to send to the Ottoman Army in *Hungary*. The news of the Captain General's departure with the Fleet from *Napoli di Romania* is confirmed several ways, and 'tis said he took his course towards the Gulf of *Egena*. Several Persons have of late been received into the Body of the Nobility here, upon there paying the usual Sums of Money, towards the Expences of the War. The last Letters from *Rome* tell us, That the Congregation about the Business of *Liege* was to meet the first of this month; when 'twas believed they would come to a Determination in that Matter.

Warsaw, August 30. The Marriage of the Elector of *Bavaria* with the Princess of *Poland* was solemnized here the 15th instant with great Magnificence, Prince *James* her Brother being his Electoral Highness's Proxy, and the Cardinal *Radziewski*, Archbishop of *Gnesna*, performing the Ceremony of the Marriage, in the presence of the King, Queen, and the Senators, who purposely repaired hither to assist at it; Since which, there have been publick Entertainments,

Balls, and Fireworks for several days together; and the Senators, and others of the principal Quality have been to wait upon the new Elector, to make their Compliments and Presents to her Electoral Highness, according to the Custom of this Kingdom. The Bishop of *Plosko*, and the Wife of the Castellan of *Vilna*, are named by the King of *Poland* to accompany the Princess to *Brussels*; Tho' 'tis not yet declared on what day her Electoral Highness will begin her Journey, or which way she is to go. On the 20th, the Baron *de Selles*, Envoy from the Elector of *Bavaria*, was dispatched back with Letters and Presents for his Electoral Highness, as well from the Princess, as the King of *Poland*. The Count *de Fablonowski*, the Crown General, went hence the 22th to the Army, which is encamped on the Frontiers of *Podolia*. The King of *Poland* has resolved to hold a General Diet in *November* next; and in the mean time Endeavours are used to compose the Differences between the Prince *Sapida*, General of *Lithuania*, and the Bishop of *Vilna*, which went so far, that the Bishop proceeded to Excommunication against the former.

Peter Waradin, Aug. 28. The Imperial Army lies encamped near this place; and several Parties are daily sent out to get intelligence of the Enemies Motions; On the 25th we had advice, That the Turks had passed the *Save*, but we understood afterwards, that 'twas only a Party of their Horse that had appeared near *Semlyn*; This day 'tis reported again, that the Visier is come over the *Save* with the whole Ottoman Army, and that a great many Tartars were drowned in their passage, by the breaking of one of the Bridges. 'Tis expected the Count *de Heydersheim*, who lies with the Imperial Horse on the other side of the *Danube*, will pass the River upon this advice, and that the whole Army being joyned, they will advance towards the Enemy, who, we hear, have marked out a Camp near *Semlyn*, and are bringing their Cannon thither by Water from *Belgrade*. General *Veterani*, who Commands the Imperial Troops in *Transilvania*, was encamped the 22th of the last month at *Dobra*, and had sent out a strong Detachment to observe the Tartars; Those that have already joined the Turkish Army are not above 8 or 9000; and 'tis said another Body of them is marching towards the *Danube*.
