hereto shall be exempt from the provisions of Article 3 of the Sheep Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1915 so far as they relate to dipping within the first prescribed dipping period.

Modification of Part I of the Principal Order.

2. Part I of the Principal Order shall, in its application to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, be read and have effect as if paragraph (3) of Article 2 of that Order were omitted.

Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.

3. The dates between which all sheep in the Area described in the Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the principal Order, are hereby fixed to be the nineteenth day of July and the twenty-first day of August in each year.

Modification of Part II of the Principal Order.

- 4. Part II of the Principal Order shall, in its application to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, be read and have effect as if paragraphs (2) and (3) of Article 5 and Article 6 were omitted, and as if the following paragraph were inserted in Article 5:—
 - "(2.) The dippings shall be carried out on such dates, at such dipping places, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority, and served by post or otherwise on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice."

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of June, nineteen hundred and seventeen.

SCHEDULE.

Area referred to in this Order.

An Area comprising such part of the county of Nairn as lies within the following boundary (but excluding any roads forming part of such boundary):—

Commencing at a point in the eastern boundary of the county at Daltulich Bridge, and proceeding in a south-westerly direction along the Coulmony Road to its junction with the road leading from Nairn to Grantown; thence in a north-westerly direction along that road to Rehaurie; thence in a westerly direction along the road leading from Rehaurie to Cawdor viâ Keppernach Wood, Black Mill, and Lyne of Urchany to the four cross roads near

Little Urchany; thence in south-westerly and north-westerly directions along the road via Achneim Wood, Glengeoullie Bridge, Cawdor Wood, Achindown Bridge, Inchyettle, Doghill, Dallaschyle Wood and Old Newton of Budgate to its junction with the road leading from Cawdor to Craggie; thence easterly along that road to its junction with the road leading to White Bridge; thence north-westerly along that road to the River Nairn; thence in a south-westerly direction along the south bank of that river to the county boundary near Croygorston; thence in south-easterly and north-easterly directions along the county boundary to the point of commencement.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH JUNE 1917.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Norfolk (Swine-Fever) Order of 1915 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being in a swine-fever infected place, if the swine are accompanied by a litence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate and subject to the following conditions:—

- (i.) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and isolated from other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon-factory or slaughter-house in the same Scheduled Area.
- (ii.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.
- (iii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest policestation in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.
