Naples, August 31.

OUR Vice-Roy has caused New Levies to be made in all the Provinces of this Kingdom, to recruit the Neapolitan Regiments in the Service of Catalonia; And he is likewise about remitting a considerable Sum of Money to the Governor of Milan, for the use of the War in Piedmont. Several Gallies and Barks are fitting out for the security of our Coasts against the Corsairs of Barbary, who have of late Landed in several places, and carried away divers of the Country People.

Venice, September 18. All the Advices from the Morea, confirm the departure of the Venetian Fleet from Napoli di Romania, together with the Transport Ships, on which are Embarked about 15000 Soldiers, under the command of the Count de Steinau General of our Land Forces; But they do not yet tell us, with any certainty, what design they are gone upon: They have taken with them 50 Pieces of Cannon for Battery, and several Mortars, with all sorts of Instruments that are made use of in the attacking of places; and 'tis generally believed, that they will make an attempt upon Scio, or the Fort of Carababa near Negrepont. They write from Dalmatia, that since the taking of Ciclut, a great many Families of Greeks have put themselves under the Protection of the Republick. The Senate has made choice of Signior Alessandro Zeno, to go their Ambassador to the Pope.

Hamburgh, September 28. The Letters from Stockholm inform us, that the King of Sweden parted from Gottenburg the 7th of this month, after having passed several days there; That he intended to take a review of his Forces in Schonen, and the Neighboring Provinces, and to return to Stockholm about the 18th. The last Letters from Warsaw tell us, that the Electores of Bavaria would set out in few days on her Journey towards Flanders; That the Forces of that Crown were still Encamped at Maripol on the Frontiers of Podolia, and those of Lithuania at Konpechi, and that these two Bodies would join together so soon as the Crown-General (who parted lately from Warsaw) was arrived in the Camp; after which 'tis thought they would advance towards Moldavia.

Dublin, September 24. On Friday last came into this Bay Their Majesties Ships the *Pearle*, Captain *Holmes*, and the *Dolphin* Capt. *Stepney*, Commanders, having in their company a Ship laden with Tobacco from *Virginia*, bound to *Bristol*, and another Vessel bound hither from *Norway*. They write from *Kinsale* of the 21th, That the *Newport* of *London*, laden with Sugar from *Mountserrat*, came in there the 17th from *Limerick*; as also the *St. Peter* Ketch from the same place. The 20th sailed from *Kinsale* the *Joseph* of *London*, *Silvester Gomez* Commander, bound for the *Madras* and *Canaries*, which came in there to stop her leak.

Falmouth, September 29. On the 20th Instant came into this Port a Flushing Privateer, from cruising on the French Coasts, the Commander whereof reported, that on the 15th he fell in with 14 great Ships, about 16 or 18 Leagues to the Westward of Ushant, which he took to be French Men of War, being within a League and half of them; and that the next morning he came up with two Suedish, and two Danish Ships, who came down the Channel with the English Fleet of Victuallers bound to the Streights, and parted from them the day before, and judged when they spake with this Privateer, that the said Fleet might be 30 or 40 Leagues to the Southward of Ushant. Yesterday in the Evening, came to an Anchor before this Harbor Their Majesties Ship the *Weymouth*, Captain *Jumper* Commander, and with her the *Four Brothers* of *Dartmouth*, *William Elliot* Master, being a Pink of 100 Tuns, laden with Tobacco, from *Virginia*; whence she came about 8 Weeks since, in company of 4 fail more, bound for *Bristol* and *Liverpool*. On the 15th, Captain *Jumper* cruising near the French Coast, came up with 14 fail of big Ships, (the same that were seen by the Flushing Privateer before mentioned) which he spoke with, and found them to be one Portuguese Ship, and the rest Suedes and Danes, bound home from several Ports in France. On the 23d, Captain *Jumper* gave chase to a French Ship, and during it,

lost his Foretop-Mast and Maintopgallant-Mast, whereupon the Frenchman bore down on the Weymouth, and proved to be a Privateer called the Count of Tholouse, of St. Malo, carrying 44 Guns; Captain Juniper gave him a Broad-side; but the Privateer returned not one Gun, and while they were buied on Board the Weymouth to get up a new Topmast, made his escape. The Weymouth failed again this morning to the Westward.

Plimouth, September 30. Last Night came into this Port Their Majesties Ship the Dartmouth, from cruising to the Westward, and brought in with her a small Prize of 40 Tuns laden with Salt for Newfoundland. This day failed hence, for London, the Golden Star, with Oil, Wine, and Paper, of, and from Genoa, Joseph Pusan Commander, of 300 Tuns. Just now came in Their Majesties Ship the Anglesey, and brought in a French Privateer of 26 Guns and 180 men, who yielded without firing a Gun. There is now in sight an English Man of War standing into this Harbor, with a Ship in Tow, supposed to be another Privateer Prize.

Bristol, Sept. 30. On the 28th arrived in this Port the *Margaret* of Bristol, and the *Society of London*; And this day the *Bristol Factor* of this place, all three from Virginia.

Bristol, October 2. The *England-Frigat*, Comanded by Captain Cooper, is come in here; He left *Carke* Harbor the 29th past, and about 10 days before he took a French Merchant-man called the *Honore of Rochelle*, bound home from *Martinico*, burden 250 Tuns, and of 25 Guns, laden with Sugar, Cotton and Indico; she had met with a Storm, in which she flung over-board 18 of her Guns, and part of her Laden. Capt. Cooper has brought this Prize in with him.

Portsmouth, October 2. Yesterday failed from hence the *Friendly Society*, with several Merchant Ships bound to the Eastward.

Deale, October 2. Sir *Cloudestly Shovell* continues in the *Downes*. Last Night came from the Westward about 20 or 30 sail of Coasters, under Convoy of a Man of War, who are now at Anchor near the South Foreland.

London, October 1. On the 28th of the last month, was Launch'd at *Shoreham* a New Sixth Rate Frigate of 24 Guns, built by Mr. *Barrett* for Their Majesties.
