nate, as he may think fit, the appointment of any advisory trade committee appointed under section VII. of the General Regulations 1910, whether or not the period of three years for which the committee was appointed or reappointed has expired.

4. Regulations VII. and VIII (1) of the General Regulations 1910 are hereby repealed, save in so far as they apply to advisory trade committees the period of appointment of which has not expired and has not been terminated.

NORTH SEA.

Caution with regard to Dangerous Area. Former Notice.—No. 434 of 1917; hereby cancelled.

Caution.

In view of the unrestricted warfare carried on by Germany at sea by means of mines and submarines, not only against the Allied Powers, but also against Neutral shipping, and the fact that merchant ships are constantly sunk without regard to the ultimate safety of their crews, H.M. Government give notice that on and after 4th July 1917, the area in the North Sea rendered dangerous to all shipping by operations against the enemy will be further extended as undermentioned, and it should be avoided.

Dangerous Area.

The area comprising all the waters except Netherlands and Danish territorial waters lying to the southward and eastward of a line commencing three miles from the coast of Jutland on the parallel of lat. 57° 08' N., and passing through the following positions:

> (1) Lat. 57° 08' N., long. 4° 00' E. (2) Lat. 53° 00' N., long. 4° 00' E.

thence along the parallel of 53° 00' N., to a position three miles from the Netherlands coast, thence to the northward and eastward, following the limit of Netherlands territorial waters.

METROPOLITAN WATER BOARD.

HEREAS by virtue of Section 58 of the Metropolitan Water Board Works) Act, 1911 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1911"), and of an Order dated the 22nd day of July, 1916, issued by Us, the Local Government Board, under Section 1 of the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1915"), the time limited for the exercise by the Metropolitan Water Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Water Board") of their powers for the compulsory purchase of the lands and easements required for the purposes of the filter beds and other works referred to in Section 51 of the Act of 1911 and for the purposes of the works referred to in that Act as Conduits Nos. 12 to 15 and 23, Reservoirs Nos. 5, 9, and 10, Aqueducts Nos. 1 to 13, and Roads Nos. 5 and 6, will expire on the 18th day of August, 1917:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 1 of the Act of 1915, and of any other powers in that behalf, We by this Our Order extend until the 18th day of August, 1918, the time limited as aforesaid for the exercise of the powers of the Water Board for the compulsory purchase of the lands and easements required for the above-mentioned purposes.
