Alicant, September 20. N.S.

HE last Week appeared off this place three French Men of War, of 60 to 70 Guns, with a Fireship; They took a Fishing Boat, and detained the Men about 3 hours on Board, and then re-leafed them; They Examined them chiefly concerning the Fleet commanded by Admiral Ruffel, and the Fishermen informed them that they passed by this place to the Westward about 10 days ago. This day Admiral Russel, with all the Fleet, is passing by to the Eastward, with a strong Wind at S. W. And an English Frigat is now coming in. P. S. The whole lileet is just now come to an Anchor in this Road; And we are mld, that Rear-Admiral Nevill will fail to mornow with a Detachment of the Fleer, to look after the French Men of War that are abroad.

Rome, Offober 2. The French Cardinals, who endeavoured all they could to hinder the Pope from granting his Bulls to the Elector of Cologne, for the Bilhoptick of Liege, are very much diffatished, now they find they are dispatched and sent away : And tis faid that the Cardinal de Fourbin has publickly declared his discontent on this occasion. The Pope has ordered some men to be raifed privately for the reinforcing his Troops in the Dutchy Ferrara, in order to prevent the Germans from taking any Winter Quarters there. The Minister of the Duke & Savoy continues to follicit the Revocation of the Decree lately made by the Inquisition here, against the Edict his Royal Highness has published in favour of the Vaudois.

Geneza, Ollober 2. Yesterday arrived here an Express from Senior Salvage, who was lately fent by this Senate to the Governor of Milan, to adjust as well the business about the selling of Salt at Firal, as the Contributions that are demanded for the Imperial Troops in Italy; And 'tis faid that he has at last Accommodated these Matters. By a Vellel from the Coast of Barbary we are advised, that the Algerines continued the Siege of the City of Tunis, and that Mahome: Bey was endeavouring to raise new Forces for the Relief of it.

Turin, Offeber 8. Several Conferences are now held about fettling the Winter Quarters, and fo foon as that is done, the Army, which is fill Encamped at Chives, will feparate. The Marschall de Chives, reschal de Catinat is preparing for his return to the French Court, to give a particular Account of the state of things on this side. Here is a report, that 6000 Germans are to enter into the Pay of the King of Spain, and that they are to serve the next Spring in Catalonia.
