POLICE, FACTORIES, &c. (MISCEL-LANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT, 1916.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Police, Factories, &c. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, of making Orders for securing the welfare of the workers employed in factories or workshops, he proposes to make an Order, to take effect from the 1st October next, and to apply to all factories employing 25 or more persons which belong to one or other of the fol-

lowing classes:—Blast Furnaces, Copper Mills, Iron Mills, Foundries, Metal Works.

The proposed Order will impose obligations on the occupiers of these works in respect of the provision and maintenance of "First Aid" boxes or cupboards, and, in the case of factories employing 500 or more persons, the provision and maintenance of an ambulance room and ambulance carriage.

Any objection to the proposed Order must be sent to the Secretary of State at the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. I, within 21 days after the date of this notice. The objection must be in writing, and must state—

(a) the requirements in the draft Order objected to;

(b) the specific grounds of objection; and(c) the modifications asked for.
