THE French Fleet was on the 5th Instant still at Tou-lon, having taken on board 4000 Men, and twas said 6000 more were embarking for Garatonia. The Marcschal de Noailles has represented the ill condition of the French Forces under his Command in Catalonia, and how much they are weakened since the beginning of this Campagne; so that the Regiments which are sent thinher from Provence, seem rather to be designed to recruit the Army, than to undertake any new Enterprize.
