By the KING. A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the

importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz.:—

All machinery driven by power and suitable for use in cutting, working or operating on wood, including:—

Sawing machines of all descriptions;

General joiners;

Mortise, tenon and boring machines; Lathes and rounding machines;

Box and cask making machines and all machines accessory thereto;

Scraping and sandpapering machines;

Wheelwright machinery;
Firewood-making and bundling

machinery:

Wood wool fibre and pulp machinery; Saw-sharpening and setting machines; Saw stretchers and brazing apparatus; All machines for grinding, planing or moulding irons.

Electrical motors up to one-half horse

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 18) Proclamation, 1917.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:—

- 1. Regulation 2c shall be amended as follows:—
- (1) After the words "the Army Council" the words "or the Board of Trade" shall be inserted.
- (2) After paragraph (e) the following new paragraph shall be inserted:—
 - "Where any trees, whether standing, felled or converted, possession of which has been so taken, are acquired by the Army Council or the Board of Trade, or any person duly authorised by them, the price to be paid in respect thereof shall, in default of agreement, be determined in the manner and in accordance with the principles prescribed by Regulation 2B."
- 2. At the end of sub-section (1) of Regulation 21 the following words shall be inserted:—
 - "and the Food Controller may by order provide for the exercise and performance by

- local bodies constituted by or under any such order of such powers and duties as may be conferred or imposed on them by the order."
- 3. Regulation 2jj shall be amended as follows:—
- (1) After sub-section (2) the following new paragraphs shall be inserted:—
 - "(3) The Board of Trade, and any person authorised by them, shall, as respects trees and timber, whether standing, felled or converted, and articles manufactured therefrom, have the like powers as are given to the Army Council under Regulations 2E and 15c, and those regulations shall apply accordingly.
 - "(4) Any order made by the Army Council under Regulations 2B, 2E, or 15c before the 22nd day of August, 1917, and in force on that date, affecting any such trees or timber as aforesaid, or articles manufactured therefrom, shall continue in force and have effect as if it had been made by the Board of Trade or a person authorised by them under this regulation, and as if the Board of Trade was substituted therein for the Army Council, without prejudice, however, to any action taken thereunder by the Army Council before that date."
- 4. At the end of sub-section (5) of Regulation 9GG the following words shall be inserted:—
 - "and the Army Council shall, as respects road materials, have the like powers as are exercisable under Regulation 255 by the Board of Trade as respects articles of commerce."
- 5. After Regulation 7s the following regulation shall be inserted:—
 - "7BB. Where it appears to the Board of Trade that it is necessary, for the purpose of maintaining an efficient service and promoting the efficient transport of goods with a view to the successful prosecution of the war, that any charges for carrying merchandise by sea between Great Britain and Ireland by a carrier whose power of charge is limited by law should be increased, the Board may by order, notwithstanding anything in any Act prohibiting such increase, authorise an increase, not exceeding such amount as the Board from time to time think necessary in the circumstances, and subject to such conditions as may be specified in the order."
- 6. At the end of paragraph (d) of Regulation 27 there shall be inserted the words "or to prejudice the success of any financial measures taken or arrangements made by His Majesty's Government with a view to the prosecution of the war."
- 7. For Regulation 31 the following regulation shall be substituted:—
 - "31. No person shall bring into the United Kingdom or remove from or to Great Britain to or from Ireland any firearms, parts of firearms, military arms, parts of military arms, or ammunition or any explosive substance without a permit from the competent naval or military authority, and if any person does so he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and any person who has in his possession or custody or under his control any article so brought or removed in contravention of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, unless he proves that he did not know, and could

not with reasonable diligence have ascertained, that the article was so brought or removed in contravention of this regulation.

"For the purpose of the enforcement of this provision the powers of search and seizure conferred by Regulation 51 shall be exercisable by officers of Customs and Excise as well as by the authorities, officers and persons mentioned in that regulation."

8. After Regulation 42A the following regulation shall be inserted:

"42AA. If any person within any area in respect of which the operation of section one of the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, is for the time being suspended procures or persuades a soldier to desert or absent himself without leave, or knowingly aids or assists a soldier about to desert or absent himself without leave, or knowingly conceals a deserter or absentee without leave, or aids or assists him in concealing himself, or aids or assists in his rescue, that person shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and for the purpose of this provision shall be deemed to have had knowledge unless he proves that he had not knowledge.

"If any person within any such area as

aforesaid-

(a) buys, exchanges, takes in pawn, detains or receives from an officer or soldier or any other person; or

(b) solicits or entices an officer or soldier to sell, exchange, pawn or give away; or

(c) assists or acts for an officer or soldier in selling, exchanging, pawning or making away with

any arms, ammunition, equipment or clothing of an officer or soldier, that person shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, unless he proves either that he acted in ignorance of the same being the arms, ammunition, equipment or clothing of an officer or soldier, or that the same was sold, by order or under the authority of the Army Council."

9. After Regulation 55A the following regulation shall be inserted:

"55B. (1) Where a Secretary of State is satisfied as respects any area that it is expedient for the better protection of that area from fire that, in case of an air raid or apprehended air raid, the fire brigades and fire appliances in that area, or any of them, should be employed under single control, he may by order

(a) constitute the area a special fire brigade area and define the limits thereof;

(b) provide that, in case of an air raid or apprehended air raid, the fire brigades in the special area or any of them, shall cooperate in accordance with a scheme approved by him, and shall, for the purpose of carrying out such scheme, act under the directions of a single authority, being the Chief Officer of one of the Fire Brigades in the special area, or such other person or authority as may be specified in the order;

(c) make such additional and supplemental provisions as appear to him to be necessary for the purpose of giving full

effect to the order;

and a Secretary of State may also from time to time give such directions as appear to him expedient for the purpose of giving full effect to the order.

"(2) All officers and members of fire brigades in the area to which the order applies shall comply with the directions of the Secretary of State, and with the directions of the authority specified in the order.

"(3) The powers conferred by this regulation on a Secretary of State shall, as respects any area situated in Scotland, be exercised by the Secretary for Scotland."

WHEREAS by the Aliens Restriction (Consolidation) Order, 1916 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Aliens Restriction Act, 1914, has been pleased to impose restrictions on aliens, and to make various regulations for carrying these restrictions into effect:

And whereas the principal Order has been extended and amended by subsequent Orders in Council, and it is expedient further to amend the provisions of the principal Order in manner

hereinafter appearing:
Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the Principal Order :-

1. At the end of Article 22A the following sub-sections shall be added:

"(10) Any powers conferred by virtue of this Article on the Minister of Munitions may be exercised on behalf of the Minister by any person or persons deputed by the

Minister for the purpose.

- "(11) Where it appears to a Secretary of State, on the recommendation of the Admiralty or Army Council, that it is necessary or expedient so to do with a view to the safety of the Realm, he may by Order direct that all or any of the provisions of this Article shall apply to work of any class or description specified in the Order as they apply to munitions work, and any provisions so applied shall thereupon have effect as if references to munitions work included references to work of any class or description so specified, and any such Order may provide for such modification of any provisions so applied as may appear necessary in order to make this Article applicable to the work in question, and in particular for the substitution as respects such work of some other Government Department for the Minister of Munitions.
- Article 25 shall be amended as follows:-In the paragraphs numbered (a), (b) and (c) after the word " are " wherever that word occurs there shall be inserted the words "or have recently been"; and for the words "shall be kept closed either altogether or" there shall be substituted the words "shall be either closed altogether or kept closed."
- 3. The following Article shall be inserted
- after Article 25s:—
 "25c. A Secretary of State may grant, in such form and subject to such conditions as

he may think fit, to any alien who, being a married woman or a widow, was before her marriage a natural born British Subject, a certificate of exemption from all or any of the provisions of this Part of this Order.

4. The following Article shall be inserted

after Article 27B:—
"27c. Where any offence under this Order, or any Order revoked by this Order, consists of failure to comply with any of the provisions of this Order requiring any particulars to be furnished, or any report or return to be made, or any notice to be given, the offence shall, for the purposes of this Order, be deemed to have continued so long as such failure continues, whether or not any time is specified at or within which the particulars, report, return, or statement are to be furnished, made, or given."

- 5. The following sub-section shall be substituted for sub-section (1) of Article 34:-
 - "(1) This Order may be cited as the Aliens Restriction Order."
- 6. The following Article shall be inserted after Article 35:-

"36. The fact that any Article or any provision contained in any Article of this Order is, or has been, revoked or superseded shall not affect, and shall be deemed not to have affected, the previous operation of the Article or provision so revoked or superseded, or the validity of any action taken under any such Article or provision, or any penalty or punishment incurred in respect of any contravention or failure to comply with any such Article or provision, or any proceeding or remedy in respect of any such penalty or punishment."

- (a) Unless the convention or agreement secures to His Majesty's Ambassador or other public Minister in the allied country power to grant to British subjects in that country exemption from military service;
- (b) Unless the convention or agreement contains provisions to the effect that British subjects in the allied country and subjects of the allied country in the United Kingdom shall before being liable to military service have an opportunity if they make an applica-

tion for the purpose of returning to the United Kingdom or the allied country as the case may be;

and it is further provided that such Order in Council shall not be made until the expiration of thirty days from the date on which the convention or agreement is laid before Parliament:

And whereas an agreement, dated the sixteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and seventeen, has been concluded between His Majesty's Government and the Provisional Government of Russia relative to the reciprocal liability to military service of British subjects resident in Russia and Russian subjects resident in Great Britain and the said agreement complies with the conditions aforesaid:

And whereas the said agreement was laid before Parliament on the nineteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and seventeen:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to signify, and it is hereby signified, that such an agreement as is mentioned in this said Act has been made with Russia, and further His Majesty is pleased, by and with the like advice, to direct and it is hereby directed that the said Act shall have effect with respect to Russia and Russian subjects.

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by Order in Council dated the 29th day of February, 1916, to extend by six months the time mentioned in the said Order of the 14th day of September, 1915, and by Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1916, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council dated the 13th day of March, 1917, to extend that time by a further period of six months:

And whereas it is expedient to extend further the time mentioned in the said Orders:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that:—

No steps shall be taken to put the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, into operation until the expiration of a period of six months after the termination of the eighteen months and three periods of six months mentioned in the recited Orders, unless the present War has previously ended, nor, if at the expiration of that period the present War has not ended, until such later date, not being later than the end of the present War, as may hereafter be fixed by Order in Council.

"Where the Legislature of any British Possession provides for the survey of, and grant of Certificates for, Passenger Steamers, and the Board of Trade report to Her Majesty the Queen that they are satisfied that the Certificates are to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally efficient with the Certificates granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under this Act, Her Majesty in Council may:—

(1) Declare that the Certificates granted in the said British Possession shall be of the some force as if granted under this Act; and

(2) declare that all or any of the provisions of this Part of this Act which relate to Passenger Steamers' Certificates shall, either without modification or with such modifications as to Her Majesty may seem necessary, apply to the Certificates granted in the said British Possession; and

(3) impose such conditions and make such regulations with respect to the Certificates, and to the use, delivery, and cancellation thereof, as to Her Majesty may seem fit, and impose fines not exceeding £50 for the breach of those conditions and regulations:

And whereas by Orders in Council dated respectively the 26th day of June, 1884, and the 17th day of October, 1884, Her late Majesty was pleased to direct that, subject to the modifications contained in such Orders, Certificates granted by the Governments of Bombay and Bengal respectively should be of the same force as if they had been granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping:

And whereas it is made to appear expedient to His Majesty that during the present War the modifications contained in the above-recited Orders in Council, dated respectively the 26th day of June, 1884, and the 17th day of October, 1884, should be suspended:

And whereas on account of urgency this Order in Council should come into immediate operation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Him by the above-recited provision, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct that during the continuance of the present War:—

1. The Certificates granted by the Governments of Bombay and Bengal respectively for Passenger Steamers shall be of the same force as if they had been granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the provisions of the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping.

2. That all the provisions of the said Acts which relate to Certificates granted for Passenger Steamers under those Acts shall apply to the Certificates referred to in this Order without modification, and that during the continuance of the present War the modifications in the above-recited Orders in Coun-

cil dated the 26th day of June, 1884, and 17th day of October, 1884, be, and the same are hereby, suspended.

And His Majesty is further pleased, by and with the advice aforesaid, to direct that this Order do come into operation provisionally, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, from the date

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to

the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by various subsequent Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council of the

10th day of January, 1917:

And whereas the Regulations contained in the said Order in Council of the 10th day of January, 1917, were, by Order in Council of the 6th day of February, 1917, extended to the Isle of Man except, inter alia, Regulation 2M (1), and Sub-sections (3) to (8), both inclusive, and Regulation 2N:

And whereas it is expedient that such lastnamed Regulations should be extended to the

Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Regulation 2m (1), and Sub-sections (3) to (8), both inclusive, and Regulation 2N, part of the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, made by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 10th day of January, 1917, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adapta-

In Regulation 2m (1) for the words "Board of Agriculture and Fisheries" there shall be substituted the words "Board of Agriculture for the Isle of Man."

In Sub-section (4) after the words "Agricultural Holdings Act, 1908," there shall be read the words "(being an Act of the Imperial

Parliament) in the same way as if such provisions were herein set out."

For the purposes of Regulation 2m the following adaptations shall be made in the Second Schedule to the Agricultural Holdings Act,

For the words "County Court" in Rules 6, 9 and 13, there shall be substituted the words High Court," and in Rule 14 omit the words "by the Registrar of the County Court" and the words "but that taxation shall be subject to review by the Judge of the County Court."

In Regulation 2n for the words "a Govern-ment Department" where the same first occur, there shall be substituted the words "the Board of Agriculture for the Isle of Man," and where the said words next occur, there shall be substituted the words "the Board." the words "Regulation 21 or."

THEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 15th day of February, 1909, provision was made for appeals from the Suprema Court of Judicature for the Colony and Pro-tectorate of Southern Nigeria to His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 17th day of May, 1909, provision was made for appeals from the Supreme Court of Judica-ture for the Protectorate of Northern Nigeria to His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh

And whereas by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 29th day of November, 1913, it was provided that His Majesty's Colony of Southern Nigeria should be known as the Colony of Nigeria, and provision was made for the Government thereof:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 22nd day of November, 1913, and known as the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1913, the Protectorates of Southern Nigeria and Northern Nigeria were formed into one Protectorate under the name of the Protectorate of Nigeria, and the limits of the said Protectorate were thereby defined, and provision was made for the administration thereof:

And whereas by the aforesaid Letters Patent of the 29th day of November, 1913, provision was made for the constitution of a Legislative Council for the Colony of Nigeria, and for the definition of the powers of the said Council:

And whereas by the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1913, it was ordered that the Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being of the Colony of Nigeria should be Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas by the said Order in Council it was further ordered that it should be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, by Ordinance, to provide for the administration of justice in the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 10th day of August, 1914, and known as the Nigeria Order in Council, 1914, powers were conferred upon the Governor and the Legislative Council of the Colony, and the Governor of the Protectorate, to legislate jointly for matters affecting both the Colony and Protectorate of Nigeria

And whereas a Court called the Supreme Court of Nigeria has been constituted by the Supreme Court Ordinance, 1914, to be the Supreme Court of Judicature for the Colony

and Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made by this Order, in pursuance of the powers vested in His Majesty by the Judicial Committee Act, 1844, and the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, to enable parties to appeal from the said Supreme Court of Nigeria to His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of all powers exabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as

follows:

 This Order may be cited as "The Nigeria (Privy Council Appeals) Order in Council, 1917."

2. The Orders of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council, dated the 15th day of February, 1909, and the 17th day of May, 1909, shall be, and the same are hereby, revoked and repealed, without prejudice to any-

thing lawfully done thereunder.

From and after the date of this Order any person or persons may appeal to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in His or their Privy Council, from any Judgment, Decree, Order or Sentence of the said Supreme Court of Nigeria, in such manner, within such time, and under and subject to such rules, regulations and limitations as are hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:-

RULES.

1. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires:—
"Appeal" means Appeal to His Majesty in

Council;

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's Heirs and Successors;

"Judgment" includes Decree, Order, Sen-

tence, or Decision;

"Court" means either the Full Court or a single Judge of the Supreme Court of Nigeria, according as the matter in question is one which, under the Rules and Practice of the Supreme Court, properly appertains to the Full Court

or to a single Judge;
"Record" means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the pleadings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the

hearing of the Appeal;
"Registrar" means the Registrar or other proper Officer having the custody of the Records in the Court appealed from;

"Month" means calendar month;

Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

- 2. Subject to the provisions of these Rules, an Appeal shall lie:
 - (a) as of right, from any final judgment of the Court, where the matter in dispute on the Appeal amounts to or is of the value

of £500 sterling or upwards, or where the Appeal involves, directly or indirectly, some claim or question to or respecting property or some civil right amounting to or of the value of £500 sterling or upwards; and

(b) at the discretion of the Court, from any other judgment of the Court, whether final or interlocutory, if, in the opinion of the Court, the question involved in the Appeal is one which, by reason of its great general or public importance or otherwise, ought to be submitted to His Majesty in Council for decision.

- 3. Where in any action or other proceeding no final judgment can be duly given in consequence of a difference of opinion between the judges the final judgment may be entered pro forma on the application of any party to such action or other proceeding according to the opinion of the Chief Justice or, in his absence, of the Senior Puisne Judge of the Court, but such judgment shall only be deemed final for purposes of an Appeal therefrom, and not for any other purpose.
- 4. Applications to the Court for leave to appeal shall be made by motion or petition within 3 months from the date of the judgment to be appealed from, and the applicant shall give the opposite party notice of his intended application.

5. Leave to appeal under Rule 2 shall only

be granted by the Court in the first instance:

(a) upon condition of the Appellant, within a period to be fixed by the Court, but not exceeding 3 months from the date of the hearing of the application for leave to appeal, entering into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, in a sum not exceeding £500 for the due prosecution of the Appeal, and the payment of all such costs as may become payable to the Respondent in the event of the Appellant's not obtaining an order granting him final leave to appeal, or of the Appeal being dismissed for non-prosecution, or of His Majesty in Council ordering the Appellant to pay the Respondent's costs of the Appeal (as the case may be); and

(b) upon such other conditions (if any) as to the time or times within which the Appellant shall take the necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the preparation of the Record and the despatch thereof to England as the Court, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, may think it

reasonable to impose.

- 6. Where a judgment appealed from requires the Appellant to pay money or perform a duty, the Court shall have power, when granting leave to appeal, either to direct that the said judgment shall be carried into execution, or that the execution thereof shall be suspended pending the Appeal, as to the Court shall seem just, and in case the Court shall direct the said judgment to be carried into execution, the person in whose favour it was given shall, before the execution thereof, enter into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, for the due performance of such Order as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to make thereon.
- 7. The preparation of the Record shall be subject to the supervision of the Court, and the parties may submit any disputed question

- arising in connexion therewith to the decision of the Court, and the Court shall give such directions thereon as the justice of the case may require.
- 8. The Registrar, as well as the parties and their legal agents, shall endeavour to exclude from the Record all documents (more particularly such as are merely formal) that are not relevant to the subject-matter of the Appeal, and generally to reduce the bulk of the Record as far as practicable, taking special care to avoid the duplication of documents and the unnecessary repetition of headings and other merely formal parts of documents; but the documents omitted to be copied or printed shall be enumerated in a list to be placed after the index or at the end of the Record.
- 9. Where in the course of the preparation of a Record one party objects to the inclusion of a document on the ground that it is unnecessary or irrelevant, and the other party nevertheless insists upon its being included, the Record as finally printed (whether in Nigeria or in England) shall, with a view to the subsequent adjustment of the costs of and incidental to such document, indicate in the index of papers, or otherwise, the fact that, and the party by whom, the inclusion of the document was objected to.
- 10. The Record shall be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto. It may be so printed either in Nigeria or in England.
- 11. Where the Record is printed in Nigeria the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council 40 copies of such Record, one of which copies he shall certify to be correct by signing his name on, or initialling, every eighth page thereof, and by affixing thereto the seal of the Court.
- 12. Where the Record is to be printed in England, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council one certified copy of such Record, together with an index of all the papers and exhibits in the case. No other certified copies of the Record shall be transmitted to the Agents in England by or on behalf of the parties to the Appeal.
- 13. Where part of the Record is printed in Nigeria and part is to be printed in England, rules 11 and 12 shall, as far as practicable, apply to such parts as are printed in Nigeria and such as are to be printed in England respectively.
- 14. The reasons given by the Judge, or any of the Judges, for or against any judgment pronounced in the course of the proceedings out of which the Appeal arises, shall by such Judge or Judges be communicated in writing to the Registrar, and shall by him be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council at the same time when the Record is transmitted.
- 15. Where there are two or more applications for leave to appeal arising out of the same matter, and the Court is of opinion that it would be for the convenience of the Lords of the Judicial Committee and all parties concerned that the Appeals should be consolidated, the Court may direct the Appeals to be consolidated, and grant leave to appeal by a single order.

- 16. An Appellant, who has obtained are order granting him conditional leave to appeal may at any time prior to the making of an order granting him final leave to appeal withdraw his Appeal on such terms as to costs and otherwise as the Court may direct.
- 17. Where an Appellant, having obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal, and having complied with the conditions imposed on him by such order, fails thereafter to apply with due diligence to the Court for an order granting him final leave to appeal, the Court may, on an application in that behalf made by the Respondent, rescind the order granting conditional leave to appeal, notwithstanding the Appellant's compliance with the conditions imposed by such order, and may give such directions as to the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant as the Court shall think fit, or make such further or other order in the premises as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.
- 18. On an application for final leave to appeal the Court may inquire whether notice, or sufficient notice, of the application has been given by the Appellant to all parties concerned, and, if not satisfied as to the notices given, may defer the granting of the final leave to appeal. or may give such other directions in the matter as. in the opinion of the Court, the justice the case requires.
- 19. An Appellant who has obtained final leave to appeal, shall prosecute his Appeal in accordance with the Rules for the time being regulating the general practice and procedure in Appeals to His Majesty in Council.
- 20. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, desires, prior to the despatch of the Record to England, to withdraw his Appeal, the Court may, upon an application in that behalf made by the Appellant, grant him a certificate to the effect that the Appeal has been withdrawn, and the Appeal shall thereupon be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.
- 21. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, fails to show due diligence in taking all necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the despatch of the Record to England, the Respondent may, after giving the Appellant due notice of his intended application, apply to the Court for a certificate that the Appeal has not been effectually prosecuted by the Appellant, and if the Court sees fit to grant such a certificate, the Appeal shall be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed for non-prosecution without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.
- 22. Where at any time between the order granting final leave to appeal and the despatch of the Record to England the Record becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court may, notwithstanding the order granting final leave to appeal, on an application in that

behalf made by any person interested, grant a certificate showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted or entered on the Record in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died or undergone a change of status, and the name of such person shall thereupon be deemed to be so substituted or entered on the Record as aforesaid without express Order of His Majesty in Council.

23. Where the Record subsequently to its despatch to England becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court shall, upon an application in that behalf made by any person interested, cause a certificate to be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted, or entered, on the Record, in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died or undergone a change of status.

24. The Case of each party to the Appeal may be printed either in Nigeria or in England, and shall, in either event, be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto, every tenth line thereof being numbered in the margin, and shall be signed by at least one of the Counsel who attends at the hearing of the Appeal, or by the party himself if he conducts his Appeal in person.

25. The Case shall consist of paragraphs numbered consecutively, and shall state as concisely as possible the circumstances out of which the Appeal arises, the contentions to be urged by the party lodging the same, and the reasons

of appeal.

Reference by page and line to the relevant portions of the Record as printed shall, as far as practicable, be printed in the margin, and care shall be taken to avoid, as far as possible, the reprinting in the Case of long extracts from the Record. The Taxing Officer, in taxing the costs of the Appeal, shall, either of his own motion or at the instance of the opposite party, inquire into any unnecessary prolixity in the Case, and shall disallow the costs occasioned thereby.

- 26. Where the Judicial Committee directs a party to bear the costs of an Appeal incurred in Nigeria, such costs shall be taxed by the proper Officer of the Court in accordance with the Rules for the time being regulating taxation in the Court.
- 27. The Court shall conform with, and execute, any Order which His Majesty in Council may think fit to make on an Appeal from a Judgment of the Court in like manner as any original Judgment of the Court should or might have been executed.
- 28. Nothing in these Rules contained shall be deemed to interfere with the right of His Majesty, upon the humble petition of any person aggrieved by any Judgment of the Court, to admit his Appeal therefrom upon such conditions as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to impose.

IV. The number of lines in each page of Pica type shall be 47 or thereabouts, and every tenth line shall be numbered in the margin.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, Section 66, and of an Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, Section 20, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 26th day of July, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, Section 66, and of the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, Section 20, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for regulating the incomes of the Canons of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of York:

"Whereas in addition to certain Residences situate within the precincts of the Cathedral Church, and to two estates known respectively as Saint Peter's Estate, and the Fabric Estate, the revenues from which are appropriated exclusively to the maintenance of the services in the Cathedral Church, and to the repair of the fabric thereof, the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of Saint Peter at York are endowed with an annual payment of £25 made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council made the 8th day of February, 1855, and published in the London Gazette on the 16th day of February, 1855, and with certain lands tenements and hereditaments transferred to them by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under and by virtue of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council made on the 19th day of July, 1862, and published in the London Gazette on the 25th day of the same month, which lands tenements and hereditaments were at the time of such transfer calculated to yield a net annual income of £4,410 :

"And whereas by the said Section 66 of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, as amended by Section 20 of the said Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, it is provided that by a Scheme of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, ratified by Order of Your Majesty in Council in the manner in the said Acts contemplated, such annual sums may be determined on to be paid, and shall accordingly be paid, by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as after due enquiry and a calculation of the average annual revenues of the said Dean and Chapter shall give to each of the Canons of the said Cathedral Church an average annual income of £500, and that it shall be lawful by

such Scheme and Order in Council to carry such purpose into effect by any mode of payment contribution augmentation or endowment which may be deemed fit, and that the scale of payments and receipts may from time to time in any case be revised and if need be varied by the like Authority of Scheme and Order in Council so as to preserve as nearly as may be the intended average annual incomes respectively, but not so as to affect any Canon in possession at the time of making any such variation:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the share of the annual income derived from the said annual payment of £25, and from the estates transferred by us as aforesaid, and applicable to the payment of the incomes of the four Canons has not in fact been sufficient to provide the said average annual income of £500, and that for many years past the average annual income of each of the Canons of the said Cathedral Church has been less than that amount, and we have satisfied ourselves after due enquiry and consideration that the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed should be adopted for regulating such incomes:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of York in their corporate capacity (testified by the Corporate Seal of the Dean and Chapter affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the Reverend John Watson, the Reverend George Austen, the Reverend Albert Darrell Tupper Carey and the Reverend Charles Carlyle Bell, the four present Canons - Metropolitical of the said Cathedral and Church, testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this Scheme, we humbly recommend and propose that there shall be delivered to us by the said Dean and Chapter in respect of the year ending the 29th day of September, 1916, and in respect of every succeeding year immediately after the annual audit to be made not later than the 30th day of November in each year of the accounts of the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral and Metropolitical Church, correct accounts in writing, in such form and verified to our satisfaction in such manner as we shall from time to time direct, of all the revenue and expenditure of the said Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral and Metropolitical Church other than the revenue and expenditure of the said Saint Peter's Estate, and Fabric Estate, and in particular showing every sum of money, from whatsoever source arising, which in accordance with the statutes and usages of the said Cathedral and Metropolitical Church, or the Chapter thereof, shall have been paid in the same year out of the revenues of the Dean and Chapter to each of the Canons of the said Cathedral and Metropolitical Church, which payments in the year shall be deemed to have been made in respect of the income of each such Canon for the same year ending the 29th day of September, and that when it shall appear by any such account that the amount paid to any Canon for the time being in respect of the income of his Canonry for the year is less than the sum of £500 then and in every such case there shall be paid by us forthwith to the said Dean and Chapter, on account of such Canon for the time being, such a sum of money as shall make up the deficiency; and such payment by us shall be a good and sufficient discharge of any claim which such Canon may have on us in respect of the average annual income to which he may be entitled for the same year under the provisions of the said Acts and of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme: Provided always that if at any time it shall appear by any such accounts that the amount so paid out of the revenues of the said Dean and Chapter to any Canon for the time being in respect of the income of his Canonry for the year exceeds the sum of £500 then and in every such case the amount of such excess shall be paid by the Dean and Chapter or by such Canon to our credit at the Bank of England, and that upon any account so delivered being examined and approved by two of our joint Treasurers or by our Accountant for the time being, their or his receipt for the amount of any such excess shall be given to the said Dean and Chapter, and shall be a good and sufficient discharge for the sum so paid and for any claim which we may have on the said Dean and Chapter or any such Canon under this provision of this Scheme: Provided further that the income of £500 for each Canon shall be deemed to be accruing from day to day and shall be apportionable accordingly as between any Canon or the Representatives of any Canon and the Successor of such Canon in the event of any Canonry becoming vacant on any day other than the 29th day of September in any year.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said Cathedral and Metropolitical Church, or the Dean and Canons thereof, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His

Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 26th day of July, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint John the Baptist, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, in the County of Southampton, and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of All Saints, Portsea, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such New Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Portsea, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint John the Baptist, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, as such Bishop, and with the consent of the Reverend Cyril Forster Garbett, Clerk in Holy Orders, an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Winchester, and the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the Parish of Portsea, in the said County and Diocese, and as such Vicar or Incumbent the Patron as well of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, as of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of All Saints, Portsea, (in testimony whereof they the parties have respectively said consenting signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Portsea, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint John the Baptist, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Rudmore, Portsea.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Rudmore, Portsea, comprising:—

"1. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, in the County of South-ampton, and in the Diocese of Winchester, which is bounded upon the north-west by the Parish Boundary in the middle of the channel known as Portchester Lake, upon the south and upon the south-east by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of All Saints, Portsea, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Portsea, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, at the junction of the road called Kingston Crescent with Mills Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Mills Road for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road connecting it with Twyford Avenue almost opposite to the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Stamshaw Road, and extending thence, first north-westward to the said wall or fence, and then first northward, and then in various directions, along such wall or fence for a distance in all of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern side of Seagrove Road, and extending thence, first north-eastward to, and then north-westward along, the middle of Seagrove Road for a distance in all of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stamshaw Road, and extending thence northwestward and in a straight line for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to the southern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 76, Twyford Avenue, and extending thence, first northward, then eastward, and then northeastward, along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Twyford Avenue for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Derby Road, and extending thence, first westward, then northward, and then again westward, along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the eastern side of Twyford Avenue, and extending thence, first westward to, and then northward along, the middle of Twyford Avenue for a distance in all of 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Derby Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Derby Road for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Twyford Avenue, and extending thence, first northward to such wall or fence, and then first northward, then eastward, then again northward, then westward, and then again northward, along the same wall or fence for a distance in all of 4½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the southern side of St. Mark's Road and extending thence northward and in a straight line across St. Mark's Road for a distance of 13 yards or thereabouts to the point

GENERAL ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

ORDER under the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES (FOOD CONTROL) ORDER (No. 2), 1917.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled;—

To the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs, Municipal Boroughs, and other Urban Districts in England and Wales;—

To the Councils of the several Rural Districts in England and Wales;—
To the Council of the Isles of Scilly;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Regulation numbered 2J. of the Defence of the Realm Regulations it is among other things provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by arrangement with the Food Controller, confer and impose on any local authorities and their officers any powers and duties in connection with the enforcement of certain of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and any powers and duties necessary to provide for the due discharge of any functions assigned to local authorities by any Order made by the Food Controller under the said Regulations;

And whereas the Food Controller has, in pursuance of the said Regulations, made the Food Control Committees (Constitution) Order, 1917:

Now therefore in pursuance of Our powers in that behalf, and by arrangement with the Food Controller, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears:—

- (a) The expression "Local Authority" means, as the case may be, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled, the Council of a Metropolitan Borough, the Council of a Municipal Borough or other Urban District, the Council of a Rural District, or the Council of the Isles of Scilly;
- (b) The expression "District" means the District subject to the jurisdiction of the Local Authority for the purposes of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, or of the Public Health Act, 1875, as the case may be.
- (c) The expression "Food Control Committee" means a Food Control Committee appointed pursuant to the Food Control Committees (Constitution) Order, 1917.

ARTICLE II.—We hereby confer and impose upon the Local Authority and upon such of their officers as they may designate or appoint for the purpose the powers and duties necessary to provide for the due discharge within their District, in conformity with the Defence of the Realm Regulations, of the functions assigned to Local Authorities by the Food Control Committees (Constitution) Order, 1917.

ARTICLE III.—A Local Authority may lend without charge to any Food Control Com-

mittee wholly or partly appointed by them, for the purposes of the powers and duties of the Committee, and for such period as the Local Authority may from time to time determine, any premises which the Local Authority may have available, and the services of any of the officers and servants of the Local Authority.

ARTICLE IV.—(1) Any expenses incurred by a Local Authority in the execution of this Order shall be defrayed in like manner as if the expenses had been incurred in the execution of the Public Health Act, 1875, or the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, as the case may be.

(2) Where two or more Local Authorities have concurred in the appointment of a Food Control Committee, any expenses incurred by those Local Authorities under this Order shall be defrayed in such proportions as may be agreed upon, or in default of agreement as may be determined by the Local Government Board.

ARTICLE V.—This Order may be cited as "The Local Authorities (Food Control) Order (No. 2), 1917."

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

LAND REGISTRY.

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Notices of Dissolution of Partnership will not be inserted unless signed by the Partners named therein, or by their legal representatives; and the signature or representative character of the

signatory must be verified by Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it
