MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. COUNTY OF FLINT.

RURAL DISTRICT OF SAINT ASAPH (FLINT).

Notice is hereby given, that the Local Government Board, by an Order dated the 16th day of October, 1917, have made the following Regulations under section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, which will come into operation on the 29th day of October, 1917:—

On and after the date on which these Regulations come into operation and until the 1st day of May, 1918, a person shall not, during the period from sunset to sunrise, drive any motor car upon the road first described in the Schedule hereto, or drive any motor car upon the part of a road secondly described in that Schedule at a speed exceeding five miles per hour.

SCHEDULE.

1. The road leading out of the main road from Abergele to St. Asaph at or near Bodelwyddan Church to its junction with the main road from St. Asaph to Rhuddlan at or near Pengwern Lodge.

2. So much of the road leading out of the said main road at or near the Ty Fry Inn to its junction with the main road from Abergele to Rhuddlan, as extends from a point in the road 460 yards north of Canolblas Farm buildings to its junction with the first-mentioned main road.
