At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 23rd day of *October*, 1917.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of *November*, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the fol-

lowing amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. Regulation 2j shall be amended by the substitution for the words from "and the Food Controller" to the end of sub-section (1) thereof of the following words "and the Food Controller may by order provide for the exercise and performance by local or other bodies constituted by or under any order of the Food Controller of such powers and duties as may be conferred or imposed on them by the Food Controller."

2. In Regulation 14e after the words "Army Council" there shall be inserted the words "or the Director-General of National Service."

3. After Regulation 17 the following regulations shall be inserted:—

"17A. (1) It shall be the duty of the occupier of any premises, on being required so to do by the chief officer of police of the police area in which the premises are situated, or any person authorised by him, to allow those premises or any part thereof to be used by the public as a shelter against hostile attack by air and to take all such steps as may be so required for the purpose of making the premises available as such shelter at such

times as they may be required for the purpose.

"(2) The chief officer of police of the police area in which any premises are situated, or any person authorised by him, may enter and inspect the premises with a view to ascertaining whether they are suitable for use for such purpose as aforesaid or whether any requirement made with respect to the premises under the preceding provisions of this regulation has been complied with.

"(3) If any person fails to comply with any requirement made under the provisions of this regulation or obstructs any chief officer of police or any person authorised as aforesaid in the execution of his powers under this regulation he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."

"17B. Where any building abutting on or near to any street or other public place has suffered structural damage in consequence of any hostile action the proper officer of the local authority shall, on receiving notice from the chief officer of police that a proper hoarding ought to be erected in front of the building and that no such hoarding has been erected by the occupier of the building, forthwith erect in front of the building an hoarding not less than twelve feet in height.

"For the purposes of this regulation the expression 'local authority' means the council of a municipal or metropolitan borough or of a town or of an urban or rural district, and the expression 'proper officer' means the borough surveyor or other similar officer."

4. The following shall be substituted for Regulation 26:—

"26. No person shall without the permission of the competent naval or military authority, or some person authorised by him—

- (1) display any light or make or keep burning any fire in such a manner as to serve as a signal, guide, or landmark; or
- (2) ignite or otherwise make use of any fireworks or other similar device;

and if any person acts in contravention of this regulation he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations."

5. Regulation 30B shall be amended as follows:—

(1) By the insertion after the words "any mine to which this regulation applies" of the words "or any interest in an oil-field."

(2) By the insertion after the words "such a mine" of the words "or any interest in an oil-field, or by a company having directly or indirectly by means of the holding of shares in any other company or otherwise the control of such a mine or oil-field."

(3) By the substitution for the words "mines situated in the United Kingdom" of the words "mines wherever situated."

6. Regulation 37B shall be amended by the substitution of the following sub-sections for sub-sections (1) (2) and (3) thereof:—

"(1) Every British sea-going ship of six hundred tons gross tonnage or upwards in respect of which a licence to instal wireless telegraph apparatus has been granted by the Postmaster-General shall be provided with a wireless telegraph installation, and shall maintain a wireless telegraph service, and shall be provided with two certified operators, together with suitable

accommodation for the apparatus and operators."

"(2) Application to the Postmaster-General in a form prescribed by him for such a licence shall, unless a licence has before the making of this regulation been granted in respect of the ship, be made as follows:—

(a) As regards every such ship which is registered in the United Kingdom, by the owner on or before the thirteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and seventeen:

(b) As regards every such ship which is registered elsewhere than in the United Kingdom, by the master within two days after the date on which the ship first arrives in the United Kingdom after the twenty-third day of October, nineteen hundred and seventeen."

"(3) The Postmaster-General shall, as and when wireless telegraph apparatus and the services of operators become available for the purpose, cause licences to be issued in respect of such ships as in the opinion of the Admiralty should in the national interests be fitted with such apparatus, and the licences shall specify the date as from which the carrying of such apparatus under this regulation is to be compulsory, the character of the apparatus, and the qualifications of the operators."

7. Regulation 40B shall be amended as follows:—

(1) By the substitution of the following new sub-section for sub-section (7):—

"(7) If any person—

- (a) prepares opium for smoking; or
- (b) deals in or has in his possession any opium prepared for smoking; or
- (c) being the occupier of any premises permits those premises to be used for the purpose of the preparation of opium for smoking or of the sale or smoking of opium prepared for smoking; or
- (d) is concerned in the management of any premises used for any of such purposes as aforesaid; or
- (e) has in his possession any pipes or other utensils for use in connection with the smoking of opium or any utensils for use in connection with the preparation of opium for smoking; or
- (f) frequents any place used for the purpose of opium smoking;

he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."

(2) By the substitution of the following new sub-section for sub-section (8):—

"(8) Every person who has dealings in cocaine or opium (including sales to persons outside the United Kingdom) shall comply with the following provisions:—

(a) He shall enter or cause to be entered in a book kept for the purpose such particulars with respect to all dealings in cocaine or opium effected by him as the Secretary of State may prescribe;

(b) He shall make the entry with respect to any transaction on the day on which the transaction is effected;

(c) Where he carries on business at more than one set of premises he shall keep a separate book in respect of every set of premises;

(d) He shall keep the book in some part of the premises to which it relates so that

it shall at all reasonable times be available for inspection by any person authorised in that behalf by the Secretary of State, and shall allow any person so authorised at all reasonable times to inspect it;

(e) He shall not cancel, obliterate, or alter any entry in the book or make therein any entry which is untrue in any particular.

"If any person fails to comply with any of the provisions aforesaid he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."

8. Regulation 40c shall be amended as follows:—

(1) For the words from the beginning of the regulation down to and including the words "military law" the following shall be substituted:—

"If—

(a) any man of His Majesty's Reserve Forces not for the time being subject to the Naval Discipline Act or to military law; or

(b) any man who holds a certificate of exemption from military service;"

(2) For paragraph (a) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"(a) Wilfully produces any disease or infirmity or the appearance thereof in, or maims or injures, any man belonging to any of His Majesty's Forces (including the reserve forces) or any man who holds a certificate of exemption from military service, whether or not he knew that the man belonged to such forces or held such a certificate; or"

9. In Regulation 41A for the words "the Army Council" wherever those words occur there shall be substituted the words "the Director-General of National Service."

10. In Regulation 41AA for the words "the Army Council" there shall be substituted the words "the Director-General of National Service."

11. In Regulation 45B for the words "the Army Council" there shall be substituted the words "the Director-General of National Service."

12. In Regulation 45C for the words "the Army Council" where they first occur there shall be substituted the words "the Director-General of National Service," and after the words "the Army Council" where they secondly occur there shall be inserted the words "or of the Director-General."

13. The following regulation shall be inserted after Regulation 45D:—

"45E. Any officer or person authorised in that behalf by the Director-General of National Service shall for the purposes of the attestation of soldiers in pursuance of Part II. of the Army Act, have the authority of a justice of the peace and be deemed to be included in the expression 'justice of the peace' wherever used in that Part of that Act in relation to the attestation of soldiers."

14. In Regulation 53 after the words "a police constable" and after the words "the competent naval or military authority" there shall be inserted the words "or any person duly authorised in that behalf by the Director-General of National Service."

15. In Regulation 53s after the words "duly authorised by him" there shall be inserted the words "or for any person duly authorised by the Director-General of National Service."

16. The following regulation shall be inserted after Regulation 56A:—

"56B (1) Any officer or other person authorised in that behalf by the Director-General of National Service may, although he is not a counsel or solicitor, prosecute or conduct before any court of summary jurisdiction, any proceedings arising out of any matters with respect to which powers or duties are for the time being vested in or performed by the Director-General of National Service.

"(2) This regulation shall not apply to Scotland."

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 1 of the Ministry of National Service Act, 1917, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty to appoint a Minister of National Service under the title of Director-General of National Service, and that the Director-General of National Service (hereinafter referred to as the Director-General) shall have such powers and duties of any Government department or authority, whether conferred by statute or otherwise, as His Majesty may by Order in Council transfer to him or authorise him to exercise or perform concurrently with or in consultation with the Government department or authority concerned:

And whereas by virtue of Section 14 of the New Ministries and Secretaries Act, 1916, as applied by sub-section (2) of Section 2 of the Ministry of National Service Act, 1917, where any powers or duties are transferred by virtue of the said last-mentioned Act the transfer is to take effect as from a date to be fixed by Order of His Majesty in Council, and different dates may be fixed for different powers and duties:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the said recited Acts and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. There shall be transferred to the Director-General by virtue of this Order all powers and duties of the Army Council or the Secretary of State under the enactments mentioned in Part I of the Schedule to this Order, and those enactments shall accordingly be construed and have effect as if the Director-General were specified therein instead of the Army Council or the Secretary of State, as the case may be.
2. If the Director-General and the Army Council at any time after the date of this Order agree that any other powers or duties of the Army Council, Secretary of State, or any military authority, in relation to recruiting, enlistment, the calling up of the reserve forces, exempting from service, or otherwise in

relation to the provision of men for the Army, ought to be transferred to the Director-General, those powers and duties shall on notice to that effect being given by the Director-General and the Army Council, be thereupon transferred by virtue of this Order to the Director-General.

3. The Director-General may exercise concurrently with the Army Council or Secretary of State, as the case may be, the powers conferred by the enactments mentioned in Part II. of the Schedule to this Order, and those enactments shall accordingly be construed and have effect as if the Director-General were specified therein in addition to the Army Council or the Secretary of State, as the case may be.

4. A reference to any of the enactments mentioned in the Schedule to this Order shall be deemed to include a reference to any of those enactments as applied to any other subject matter by any other enactments.

5. Nothing in this Order shall affect the validity of any regulations or orders made, any action taken, or any forms authorised before this Order comes into operation by the Army Council, Secretary of State or any other authority, and any such regulations, orders, or

forms, shall until revoked or varied by the Director-General, continue in force as though they had been made or authorised by the Director-General under the powers vested in him under this Order.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of November, 1917:

Provided that if the Director-General is of opinion that it is expedient to postpone the operation of this Order, either generally, or as respects any particular area in the United Kingdom, or as respects the transfer of any particular power or duty, he may at any time before the said first day of November and thereafter from time to time, by order, postpone the operation of this Order accordingly to a date or dates not later than the first day of May, 1918, and if any order is so made by the Director-General this Order shall have effect accordingly.

7. (1) This Order may be cited as the Ministry of National Service Order, 1917.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom, from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Wash-

ington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

§ NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel. Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.), as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

THE PAPER RESTRICTION (POSTERS AND CIRCULARS) CONSOLIDATION ORDER, 1917.
DATED 22ND OCTOBER, 1917.

Made by the Board of Trade under Regulations 2F, 2G, and 2J of the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

Whereas the Board of Trade have made Orders restricting the use of paper for the purpose of posters, catalogues, price lists and advertising circulars dated respectively 2nd March, 1917, and 17th March, 1917, and whereas General Licences were granted by the Board on 18th April, 1917, and 20th August, 1917, under the first of the said Orders:

And whereas it appears expedient to the Board of Trade to amend and consolidate the said Orders and Licences:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in exercise of their powers under the Defence of the Realm Regulations, hereby order as follows:—

o *Posters.*

1. (a) In this Order the expression "poster" means a sheet or sheets made wholly or partly of paper, cardboard or other similar material containing any advertisement, announcement, or intimation, whether in words, pictorial form, or otherwise, printed, written or depicted which is exhibited or intended to be exhibited;

(b) An announcement, advertisement or intimation consisting of any combination of posters shall be treated as one poster;

(c) In the case of posters relating to the advertisement of or contents in any newspaper or periodical, the expression "poster" includes posters made of any material whatever.

2. No person shall exhibit or cause or permit to be exhibited any poster relating to the advertisement of or contents in any newspaper or periodical except at the premises where the newspaper or periodical is published.

3. No person shall make or exhibit or cause or permit to be made or exhibited any poster the superficial measurements of which exceed two thousand four hundred square inches.

4. No person shall exhibit or affix or cause or permit to be exhibited or affixed on any one wall, hoarding or place a number of posters relating to the same subject matter or business which in the aggregate exceeds a superficial area of two thousand four hundred square inches, except at the place of business of the person advertising, in which case no one poster so exhibited or affixed shall exceed the superficial area aforesaid.

5. No person shall exhibit or cause or permit to be exhibited, any poster containing any advertisement, announcement, or intimation with respect to goods offered for sale by a retailer, except at the premises where such goods are offered for sale, nor any poster containing any advertisement, announcement or intimation with respect to the business of a moneylender, bookmaker, commission agent for the making or placing of bets and wagers or with respect to any competition involving guessing or any test of skill.

Advertising Circulars.

6. In this Order the expression "advertising circulars" includes advertisements (other than posters) issued gratuitously and printed or written on paper, cardboard or other similar material; tradesmen's catalogues and price lists; advertising sheets or periodicals in the form of a newspaper or magazine, whether registered as a newspaper or not, which are distributed gratuitously and of which advertising is the main and not merely an ancillary purpose, diaries, almanacks and calendars issued gratuitously and containing advertising matter.

7. Save as is hereinafter provided no person shall issue or despatch any advertising circular, either by post, by hand, in the form of inset or otherwise, whether the same is issued or despatched by a trader to a trader, or in response to a request in writing or otherwise.

8. Advertising circulars may until 31st January, 1918, be issued and despatched within the United Kingdom for, by and on behalf of all persons, other than those mentioned in paragraph 13 hereof, provided that the total weight of paper used for such advertising circulars (including the envelopes or wrappers) between 20th day of August, 1917, and 31st day of

January, 1918, shall not exceed one-third of that used by the person by or on whose behalf the same were issued or despatched within the United Kingdom between 1st August, 1916, and 31st January, 1917.

9. In the case of advertising circulars relating to seeds and plants for the growing of food stuffs one-half of the total weight of paper used by the person by or on whose behalf the same were issued and despatched between 1st August, 1914, and 31st January, 1915, shall be substituted for the total weight of paper permitted to be used by paragraph 8; provided that in the case of advertising circulars relating both to seeds or plants for foodstuffs and other seeds, plants or goods the part relating to such other seeds, plants or goods must not exceed one-third of the total weight calculated as in paragraph 8.

10. Nothing in this Order shall apply to diaries, almanacks and calendars containing advertising matter for gratuitous issue for the year 1918 which were printed or partly printed before 10th day of September, 1917, and which contain no more advertising matter than was contained in the issue made for the same person for the year 1917, and which are not made for or issued by the persons mentioned in paragraph 13 hereof, nor to circulars requesting verification of information for books of reference and containing no advertising matter other than that relating to books of reference published by the same person.

11. Nothing in this Order applies to circulars relating to the purchase, sale, or dealing in, or to price lists of, any stocks, shares, debentures, bonds or securities of a like nature issued or despatched by members of the London Stock Exchange or of any provincial Stock Exchange represented on the Council of Associated Stock Exchanges.

12. Advertising circulars and price lists of the class mentioned in the last paragraph may be issued or distributed by any person other than a member of a Stock Exchange referred to in the last paragraph, provided that the total weight of paper used for such circulars issued or distributed between 20th August, 1917, and 31st January, 1918, does not exceed that allowed in paragraph 8 of this Order.

13. No advertising circular shall be made, printed, issued, despatched or exhibited for, by or on behalf of any registered moneylender, bookmaker, commission agent for the making or placing of any bets or wagers, or by the promoters of or persons interested in any guessing competition or test of skill.

14. Where it appears to the Board of Trade or the Royal Commission on Paper that the total weight of paper used by or on behalf of any person for advertising circulars issued or despatched by him between 1st August, 1916, and 31st January, 1917, or in the case of those circulars mentioned in paragraph 9, between 1st August, 1914, and 31st January, 1915, was unreasonable or excessive, having regard to the nature and importance of the business or matter referred to in such circulars and all the circumstances of the case, the Board or Royal Commission on Paper may by notice in writing directed to such person prescribe the total weight of paper that may be used by such persons for advertising circulars issued or despatched between the dates mentioned in paragraphs 8 and 9 of this Order, and such weight may be less than that permitted by those paragraphs and shall be the total weight

which such person is hereby permitted to use for the purpose aforesaid.

15. All persons who make, print, issue, despatch, distribute or publish advertising circulars shall, if and when required by the Royal Commission on Paper on behalf of the Board of Trade, make returns to the said Commission in such form and giving such particulars as they may direct as to the making, printing, issuing, despatch, distribution or publication of advertising circulars.

General.

16. Nothing in this Order applies to posters or advertising circulars despatched or to be despatched by persons (other than those mentioned in paragraph 13) to persons abroad.

17. The Paper Restriction Order, 1917, and the Paper Restriction Order, 1917 (No. 2), and the General Licences granted under the Paper Restriction Order, 1917, are hereby revoked without prejudice to any act or thing done or suffered or to any penalty incurred or prosecution or proceeding which has been or may be instituted thereunder.

18. The Royal Commission on Paper, on behalf of the Board of Trade, may in such cases as they think fit, and either particularly as respects any person or thing, or generally as respects any class of persons or things, issue Licences dispensing with the application of this Order to any person or thing or any class of persons or things.

19. Where the fulfilment by any person of any contract is interfered with by the necessity on the part of himself or any other person of complying with any provision of this Order, that necessity shall be a good defence to any action or proceeding taken against that person in respect of the nonfulfilment of the contract so far as it is due to that interference.

20. Infringements of this Order are summary offences under the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

21. This Order may be cited as the Paper Restriction (Posters and Circulars) Consolidation Order, 1917.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Board of Trade, and dated 27th April,

1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for the Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain-making trade, hereby give notice, as required by Section 4 of the above Act, that they propose to vary the minimum time-rate for Hand-hammered Chain-making fixed by them on 22nd August, 1910, and 19th January, 1914, as follows:—

By increasing the minimum or lowest time-rate for making from iron supplied by the employer Hand-hammered Chain up to and including $\frac{1}{2}$ in.:

Where the employer provides (in addition to the iron) the workshop where the work is carried on and the tools and the fuel—from 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour to 4d. per hour (free and clear of all deductions).

Where the worker provides (in respect of iron provided by the employer) the workshop where the work is carried on and the tools and the fuel, or any of these three heads of outlay—from 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour to 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour (free and clear of all deductions).

The latter variation is proposed on the basis that any carriage to or from the premises of the employer is performed by the worker; or that, if performed by the employer, the latter is entitled to receive 1d. per cwt. either way.

The Trade Board also give similar notice that they propose to vary the General Minimum Piece-rates fixed by them on 22nd August, 1910, 23rd November, 1910, 1st February, 1911, and 19th January, 1914, for making Hand-hammered Chain, as follows, viz., by the addition to such minimum rates of sums amounting approximately to 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

The Trade Board also give similar notice that they propose to vary the Minimum rates fixed for learners on the dates specified above as follows:—

(a) By increasing the Minimum Time-rate for learners in their first six months of employment from 4s. to 5s. 10d. a week.

(b) By increasing the Minimum Time-rate fixed for learners in their second six months of employment from 5s. 6d. to 8s. a week.

(c) By increasing the Minimum Piece-rates for learners in their third and fourth six months of employment by the addition to such rates of sums amounting approximately to 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

On application to the Trade Board, further information will (if in the opinion of the Trade Board the applicant is likely to be affected by the General Minimum Piece-rates) be given as to the variations proposed.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the proposed variations of the rates which may be lodged with them within three months from the 24th October, 1917. During the second six months of employment from 5s. 6d. to 7s. 2d. a week.

During the third six months of employment from 10s. to 13s. a week.

During the fourth six months of employment from 12s. 6d. to 16s. 3d. a week.

Provided that such proposals are subject to the condition that where a learner has served an apprenticeship for a period of not less than two years to Hand Hammered Chain-making, such learner shall be entitled to count such period of learning as equivalent to one year of service to Dollied or Tommied Chain-making.

The Trade Board also give similar notice that they propose to vary the General Minimum Piece-rates for making Dollied or Tommied Short Link Chain or Short Link Hand-hammered Chain of $\frac{3}{8}$ in. diameter and over up to $\frac{1}{2}$ in. inclusive, as fixed by them on 1st February, 1911, and 19th January, 1914, as follows, viz., by the addition to such minimum rates of sums amounting approximately to 30 per cent.

On application to the Trade Board further information will (if in the opinion of the Trade Board the applicant is likely to be affected by the General Minimum Piece-rates) be given as to the variations proposed.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the proposed variation of the rates which may be lodged with them within three months from the 24th October, 1917. Such objections should be in writing, and signed by

ORDER.
TAR-OILS.

The Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers thereunto enabling him, gives notice and orders as follows:—

(1) He hereby takes possession as from the 1st November, 1917, until further notice, of all tar oils then or thereafter situate in the United Kingdom produced or derived from gas coal tar or coke oven tar of a specific gravity of 1,000 or exceeding 1,000, or produced or derived from water gas tar, producer tar or Mond gas tar of any specific gravity.

(2) If any person having control of any tar oil to which this Order applies without the consent of the Minister of Munitions sells, removes, or secretes it or deals with it in any way contrary to any conditions imposed in any licences that be granted in respect thereof, he

will be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

(3) No person shall on or after the 1st November, 1917, until further notice purchase or take delivery of any tar oil situate in the United Kingdom except under and in accordance with the terms of a licence issued under the authority of the Minister of Munitions, or offer to sell, sell, supply, or deliver any such tar oil to any person other than the holder of such a licence and in accordance with the terms thereof. Provided that no such licence shall be required:

(a) By any person for the purchase and delivery of tar oil in quantities not exceeding an aggregate of 5 gallons during any one calendar month.

(b) By any person, after the first application by him for and pending the granting or refusal of a licence, for the delivery to him under a contract in writing existing at the date hereof of tar oil for the purpose of benzol washing or the manufacture of disinfectants, antiseptic drugs, lamp or vegetable black, or fuel, to an amount not exceeding during any one calendar month the amount of the average monthly deliveries under such contract during the three calendar months immediately preceding the date hereof.

(4) No purchase or sale of tar oil situated in the United Kingdom, or offer to purchase or sell any such tar oil whether such purchase, sale or offer is or is not under any licence issued under the authority of the Minister of Munitions, shall, in the case of any class of tar oil specified in the Schedule hereto, be until further notice at a price exceeding the price fixed for the same in the said schedule, provided that this clause shall not apply to any deliveries under and in pursuance of a contract in writing entered into prior to the 13th July, 1917.

(5) No person, whether he is or is not the actual producer of such tar oil shall on and after the 1st November, 1917, until further notice use any tar oil exceeding in quantity 5 gallons in any one calendar month for the purpose of or in connection with any manufacture or work except under and in accordance with the terms of a Licence issued under the authority of the Minister of Munitions.

(6) All persons producing or holding stocks of tar oils shall furnish to the Controller of Explosives Supply, Storey's Gate, Westminster, S.W. 1, as and when required by him such returns of tar oils at any time manufactured, purchased, sold, supplied, delivered or used by them at such times and in such form as the said Controller of Explosives Supply shall from time to time direct.

(7) All persons heretofore required by the Minister of Munitions to furnish returns relating to tar oil shall until further notice continue to furnish returns in accordance with such previous requirements.

(8) For the purpose of this Order the expression "tar oil" shall mean Creosote Oil, Green Oil, Sharp Oil, Anthracene Oil, and other oils produced from or containing an admixture of oil produced from the distillation of Coal Tar, Coke Oven Tar, Producer Tar, Water Gas Tar and Mond Gas Tar or any of them.

(9) The Order of the Minister of Munitions dated the 13th July, 1917, relating to Creosote and other oils produced from the distillation of coal tar is hereby cancelled as from the 1st

November, 1917, but such cancellation shall not affect the previous operation of that Order prior to such last mentioned date or the validity of any action taken under it, or the liability to any penalty or punishment in respect of any contravention or failure to comply with the same respectively prior to its cancellation, or any proceeding or remedy in respect of such penalty or punishment.

(10) All applications for licences under this Order shall be made to the Controller, Mineral Oil Production Department, Ministry of Munitions, 8, Northumberland Avenue, W.C. 2.

1. Admiralty Specification Oil, 72s. per ton.

2. 75 per cent. Creosote Oil and 25 per cent. Pitch, 61s. 6d. per ton.

3. 66 2/3rds per cent. Oil and 33 1/3rd Pitch, 58s. per ton.

4. 50 per cent. Creosote Oil and 50 per cent. Pitch, 51s. per ton.

5. 40 per cent. and less Creosote Oil and 60 per cent. and upwards Pitch, 47s. per ton.

A commission not exceeding 2½ per cent., in addition to the prices mentioned above, may be charged by brokers, dealers and merchants.

The prices mentioned in this Schedule are for oil delivered free on rail or barge at the sellers' works or at the nearest station or wharf into the purchasers' tank cars and sold according to the producers' weights and measurements. DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATION 35A.

Rules for securing the safety of H.M. Ships and Vessels while undergoing refit or repair in Shipyards of the United Kingdom (other than Royal Dockyards) and for securing the safety of workmen and all other persons boarding any such Ship or Vessel.

The Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, after consultation with the Secretary of State, hereby make the following Rules:—

1. The Magazine and any other part of the Ship in which explosives or ammunition are stored, whether temporarily or otherwise, shall be considered "dangerous areas" for the purposes of these Rules, and the Commanding Officer shall cause notices to this effect to be affixed in a prominent place in every approach or entrance to any such area.

2. All persons before entering any dangerous area are, if required by the Foreman in Charge to do so, to put on the special shoes provided; such shoes are not to be worn except in the dangerous area, and are not to be kept or placed where they may come in contact with any grit.

3. No person shall approach or enter any dangerous area smoking or with a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette, or in a state of intoxication, nor shall any person approach or enter any such area if warned by the Commanding Officer or the Foreman in Charge not to do so.

4. No tools are to be used in any dangerous area other than those approved by the Commanding Officer for use in such area.

5. No matches or other means of obtaining fire, no small arm cartridges, fireworks, percussion caps, detonators or any kind of explosive substance as defined in the Explosive Substances Act, 1883, are to be at any time admitted or brought into any dangerous area except under the instructions of the Commanding Officer.

6. Every person is to examine his clothes before entering any dangerous area to see that he has no article prohibited by these Rules in his pockets or about his person. The Commanding Officer shall authorise some person to take measures to secure the observance of these Rules, and all persons, whether employed by the Contractors or not, shall submit (if called upon) to be searched by any authorised person before approaching or entering any dangerous area.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

Rules for securing the safety of persons employed in any factory or workshop or in any part thereof in which Smoke Boxes are being manufactured for the Admiralty and for regulating the manner in which work upon Smoke Boxes shall be carried on.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers thereunto enabling them the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, after consultation with the Secretary of State, make the following Rules:—

1. All work in connection with the manu-

facture of Smoke Boxes shall be done on the ground floor only of the said premises.

2. Every room in which such work is carried on shall be provided with exits so placed as to afford all persons working therein a ready means of escape to the open air.

3. All doors in any such workroom and all doors by which access is obtained to the open air shall open outwards and the latch or other means of fastening any such door shall be so contrived as to permit of the door being easily pushed open from the inside.

4. A space shall at all times be kept clear between the exits of any such workroom and the persons working therein, and such space shall not be obstructed by any material or plant or otherwise. All passages leading to the open air shall also be kept clear.

5. No quantity of smoke-producing material shall be present at any one time in such workroom in excess of the amount reasonably required for the purpose of the work actually in progress, and all smoke-producing material shall be removed from the workroom as soon as the work on it is completed.

6. No person shall bring into such workroom any smoking materials, matches or other means of producing a light, and every person before entering any such workroom shall submit, if called upon, to be searched by some person authorised for that purpose by the Admiralty or by the occupier of the said premises. Provided that in no case shall any female person be searched by or in the presence of anyone but a female person.

7. All directions of the Admiralty fixing the proportions in which ingredients are from time to time to be used in filling the canisters and other component parts shall be strictly observed and the occupier and every officer and servant of the occupier of the said premises and any other person affected by any such directions shall obey any directions so given.

Any person affected by any of the foregoing Rules who fails or neglects to comply with any of them will be liable, upon summary conviction, to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a period not exceeding six (6) months or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds (£100), or both.
