NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

Deposit Contributors Benefits Order (Wales),
1917.

THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE (WALES)
(DEPOSIT CONTRIBUTORS BENEFITS) ORDER,
1917, DATED DECEMBER 15TH, 1917, MADE BY
THE WELSH INSURANCE COMMISSIONERS
UNDER SECTIONS 78 AND 82 OF THE NATIONAL
INSURANCE ACT, 1911 (1 & 2 GEO. 5, C. 55).

Whereas by the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Deposit Contributors Benefits) Order, 1914 (hereinafter called "the principal Order"), and by the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Deposit Contributors Benefits) Orders, 1915 and 1916, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, for the reasons more particularly set forth in the recitals to the principal Order, have made certain provisions with regard to the payment of benefits to deposit contributors during the years 1915,

1916 and 1917, and it is necessary and expedient that the said provisions should be further extended:

Now, therefore, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Deposit Contributors Benefits) Order, 1917.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. Subject as hereinafter provided, the provisions of the principal Order shall continue to apply up to and including the 31st day of December, 1918, with such variations for the purpose of the year 1918 as are specified in the Schedule hereto.

3. A man who, having been insured under the provisions of section 46 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, becomes a deposit contributor for the first time after his discharge, shall be entitled to receive medical and sanatorium benefits for such period from the date on which he became a deposit contributor as the Commissioners, having regard to the amount standing to his credit, may think fit, and there shall be deducted from the amount standing to his credit such proportion of the sums payable in respect of him for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of section 42 of the Act for the year 1918 as the Commissioners may think just.
