A. PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO TRADING WITH THE ENEMY.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS it is advisable to amend Our Proclamation of the 23rd day of May, 1916, called "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3:"

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation declaring, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. As from the date hereof there shall be inserted in Paragraph 5 (a) of the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, next after the words "Marine Insurance" the words "or of Fire Insurance."

2. As from the date hereof there shall be added, next after Paragraph 5 (a) of Our said Proclamation, the following paragraph:—

"(aa) Any person or body of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom, from re-insuring for any Company or Firm, who is engaged in any non-enemy Country in the business of Fire Insurance, and is not an Enemy Company or Firm, or the branch of an Enemy Company or Firm, or mentioned in the Statutory List, any fire risk insured by that Company or Firm for any person or body of persons mentioned in the Statutory List, if and so far as the re-insurance of such risk is obligatory under the conditions of any Treaty or Contract of Re-insurance current on the 31st day of December, 1917, or under the conditions of any renewal or revision of a Treaty of Contract of Re-insurance so current, if such renewal or revision has been approved by the
