ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 15TH FEBRUARY 1918.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Application of Part 1 of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914.*

1. Part 1 (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914 is hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto.

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of February, nineteen hundred and eighteen.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries have hereunto set their Official Seal this fifteenth day of February, nineteen hundred and eighteen.

SCHEDULE.

*Area referred to in this Order.*

An Area in the county of Perth, comprising such portion of the parish of Ardoch as lies within the following boundary (*but excluding any road forming part of such boundary*), namely:—Commencing at the bridge where the Allan Water is crossed by the road leading from Greenloaning to Braco, thence proceeding in a northerly direction along that road viâ Braco to its junction with the road leading to Comrie, thence in a north-westerly direction along that road viâ Langside to the western boundary of the parish, thence in a southerly, westerly, southerly, and south-easterly direction along the parish boundary until it meets the northern bank of Allan Water, thence in a north-easterly direction along the northern bank of Allan Water to the point of commencement.

INCOME TAX.

Whereas it has become necessary to renew the list of persons to supply vacancies amongst the Commissioners appointed to act in the division of Ilminster, in the county of Somerset, as Commissioners for the general purposes of the Acts of Parliament for granting to His Majesty duties on profits arising from property, professions, trades, and offices: Now we, two of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, in pursuance of the powers vested in us in that behalf, do hereby convene a meeting of the Land Tax Commissioners for the county aforesaid, being respectively qualified to act as such Commissioners, to be holden at the Court House, Ilminster, on Wednesday, the 27th day of February, 1918, at 10.30 o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of choosing fit and proper persons to be Commissioners to supply vacancies amongst the Commissioners for the general purposes of the Income Tax for the division of Ilminster aforesaid.

ORDER BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL OF  
NATIONAL SERVICE, DATED FEBRUARY 18TH,  
1918, PROHIBITING THE OPENING OF A NEW  
RETAIL TRADE OR BUSINESS OR A NEW  
BRANCH OF AN EXISTING RETAIL TRADE OR  
BUSINESS WITHOUT A LICENCE.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Regulation SAA of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Director-General of National Service hereby orders as follows:—

1. No person shall in Great Britain, on or after the date of this Order, without a licence issued by or under the authority of the Director-General of National Service—

(a) Establish or carry on any new retail trade or business, or

(b) establish or carry on any new branch of any existing retail trade or business.

2. Every person applying for a licence under this Order shall furnish to the Director such information as he may require for the purpose of enabling him to deal with the application.

3. Any licence issued under this Order may be issued subject to such conditions and restrictions as may be contained therein, and any departure from any such restrictions or conditions, or other acts in contravention of the provisions of this Order, will be a summary offence under the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

4. Any licence issued under this Order will be issued subject to the condition that the licence may be revoked by the Director-General of National Service if he is satisfied that any condition or restriction contained in such licence has not been observed.

5. In the event of the transfer, by purchase or otherwise, of the trade or business in respect of which a licence has been issued under this Order, or in the event of the death of the holder of a licence issued under this Order, it shall be lawful for the transferee or other person claiming under the holder of such licence,
