under Bardon and partly by the New Parish of Copt Oak, Charnwood Forest, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the east and upon the north-east by the said New Parish of Copt Oak, Charnwood Forest, upon the north partly by the Parish of Whitwick, and partly by the Particular District of Christ Church, Coalville, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary divides the said Particular District of Christ Church, Coalville, from the Parish of Hugglescote with Donington at the centre of the bridge which carries Forest Road across the Leicester and Burton Branch Line of the Mid-Railway, and extending thence, first south-eastward, and then south-westward, along the middle of the said Line of Railway for a distance of 1 mile and 74 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hugglescote with Donington from the. said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Christopher, Ellistôwn."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

## SCHEDULE.

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Local Government Act, 1886, the Douglas Municipal Corporation Act, 1895, the Education Act, 1893, the Poor Relief Act, 1893, or the Higher Education Act, 1907, or any Acts amending the same, a Member of His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces employed on any

Naval or Military Service, or a person whose employment in connection with Naval or Military operations the Lieutenant Governor considers may properly be treated for the purpose of this Act in the same manner as actual Naval or Military Service, shall not during the present War by reason of his absence only on that Service be disqualified or vacate his office as a Member of any Council, Commissioners of a Town, Village or Parish District, a Higher Education Board, a School Board or a Board of Guardians of the Poor of any District, or incur any fine or other liability.

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Authorities (Disqualification Relief) (Isle of Man) Act, 1918.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, made by Orders of His Majesty in Council dated the 10th January, 1917, the 23rd February, 1917, the 13th March, 1917, the 30th March, 1917, and the 14th April, 1917, shall, to the extent and adapted as set out in the Schedule hereto, extend to the Isle of Man.
