DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) REGULATING THE SALE AND SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR ON GOOD FRIDAY IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following General Order:—

Areas to which the Order Applies.

1. This Order applies to all areas or parts of areas situate in England or Wales to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, have been applied.

Hours during which Intoxicating Liquor may be Sold on Good Friday.

2. The hours during which intoxicating liquor may (subject to the provisions of Article 3 hereof) be sold and supplied on Good Friday in licensed premises and clubs whether for consumption on or off the premises shall be as follows:—

(a) In such part of the Western Border Area as is situate in England, the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. and 9 p.m. for consumption on the premises, and the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. and 8 p.m. for consumption off the premises.

(b) In the Welsh Area and the West Gloucestershire Area, the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. for consumption on the premises, and the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. for consumption off the premises.

(c) In each of the other areas, the hours during which by the provisions of Article 2 of the Orders of the Board for the said areas

such sale or supply for consumption on or off the premises is permitted on Sundays.

And Article 2 of each of the said Orders of the Board shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.

Sale of Spirits for Consumption Off the Premises Prohibited.

3. No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club or be dispatched or taken therefrom on Good Friday, and Article 3 of each of the said Orders shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 & 6 Victoria, chapter 110) and on behalf of the Manchester Ship Canal Company, I hereby give you notice that the Company propose to make, in accordance with plan and section deposited at the Office of the Mersey Conservancy, an extension of the embankment adjoining to the River Mersey on Frodsham Score, which will extend about 100 yards beyond the line of high water mark of a tide uninfluenced by the wind of the height of 21 feet, as measured from the sill of the gates of the Old Dock in Liverpool, as defined in section 7 of the said Act of 5 and 6 Victoria, chapter 110 (and hereinafter called the said Datum), whereby the tidal and other waters of the said River Mersey may be excluded or interrupted, and that it is proposed to make such work on Frodsham Score as above mentioned at the north-easterly end of the embankment, for which a notice was inserted in the London Gazette of Decem-

ber 9, 1892, and such work will extend in a north-westerly direction from and be a widening of the embankment already constructed by the Company across the said Frodsham Score, and which there forms the north-westerly boundary of the Manchester Ship Canal, and the nature of such work will be an embankment, and the extent of such work will occupy an area of about twenty-three thousand square yards, and the object of the said work is to find a site for and will be constructed with materials excavated out of parts of the said Manchester Ship Canal, and it is intended to commence such work at the expiration of one month from the date of this notice, and will continue until the level of the said area has been raised to the average height of thirty-six feet above the said Datum.

ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

THE LEATHER (CERTIFICATE) ORDER, 1918.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council hereby order as follows:—

1. No person shall without a permit purchase, sell, or make or take delivery of or payment for any Leather to which this Order may for the time being be applied by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials otherwise than on the terms and subject to the conditions on and subject to which dealings in such leather are regulated by the provisions hereof.

2. No person shall purchase or take delivery of any Leather of the description aforesaid otherwise than upon quotation of the number of a certificate in such form as may be prescribed by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials, and it shall be the duty of such persons to make application for such certificate in such form as may be prescribed by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials and to furnish such particulars relative to such application as may be required by him or on his behalf.

3. No person shall sell or make delivery of any Leather of the description aforesaid otherwise than upon quotation by the purchaser of the number of a certificate of the description aforesaid, and it shall be the duty of the vendor to furnish such particulars as to the Leather so supplied as may be required by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials, verified by the production of such documents as may be required by him or on his behalf.

4. It shall be the duty of any person to whom Leather is supplied for any purpose in accordance with the provisions hereof to use such Leather for the purpose indicated in the form of application for the said certificate and not otherwise.

5. It shall be the duty of all persons concerned in any of the transactions specified herein to comply strictly with any directions that may be given by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials for the purposes hereof; and any failure to comply therewith or to furnish true particulars or keep or produce records and documents as may be required hereunder shall be proceeded against as an offence against the said Regulations.

6. The restrictions imposed by or under this Order upon dealings in any class of Leather to which this Order may be from time to time applied shall be deemed to be in addition to and not in substitution for or in derogation of any further and other restrictions, regulations or conditions imposed upon dealings in any such class of Leather by any Order for the time being in force and made or to be made by the Army Council under the said Regulations.

7. This Order may be cited as the "Leather (Certificate) Order, 1918."

ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

TIMBER.

Whereas it appears to the Army Council necessary and expedient to make the following Order for the purpose of giving further and better effect to an Order of even date herewith

made by them in pursuance of the powers contained in Regulation 5c of the Defence of the Realm Regulations for regulating the hauling of timber. Now, therefore, the Army Council, in pursuance of powers conferred on them by Regulation 15c of the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

Any person engaged in the felling, hauling and purchase or sale of timber shall furnish such particulars as to his business as may be required by or on behalf of the Controller of Roads and Bridges, War Office.

ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

HAULING OF TIMBER.

Whereas with a view to preventing the congestion of traffic and excessive damage to public roads outside the Administrative County of London being caused by the haulage of timber, it appears to the Army Council expedient to provide for the regulation thereof in manner hereinafter mentioned. Now, therefore, the Army Council, in pursuance of powers conferred on them by Regulation 5c of the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

(1) For the purposes of this Order the expression "timber haulage" means the haulage and transport of timber from the site where it was felled, except where the aggregate weight of the timber to be transported does not exceed 50 tons.

(2) The owner or other person having control or management of any vehicle used in timber haulage on any public road outside the Administrative County of London shall obey any directions in writing issued by the Road Control Officers appointed by the Army Council for the purpose of controlling such traffic.

(3) A Road Control Officer, subject to any general or special instructions he may receive from the Army Council, may:—

(a) After consultation with the local Highway Authorities and as respect roads in the Metropolitan Police District with the Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police, and where necessary with the Military Authorities, select the routes to be used for timber haulage and direct the use of any particular route or the diversion of the traffic or any part thereof from one route to another, in such manner as may be considered most conducive to the prevention of damage to the roads or the congestion of traffic thereon.

(b) Give directions prohibiting the use for timber haulage on such roads as may be specified in the directions of vehicles of such type as may be so specified, where such restriction is considered expedient to prevent avoidable damage to the roads, and other means of transporting the timber can be made available.

(4) Before commencing after the date of

this Order any work of timber haulage the owner or other person having the control or management of any vehicle to be used for the purpose shall give at least one week's notice in writing to the County Surveyor of the county or Borough Engineer of the county borough, or if more than one of each county or county borough through which the timber is to be transported, specifying:—

(a) The approximate date when the haulage will begin,

(b) The approximate tonnage to be transported,

(c) The type or types of vehicles to be used in hauling or transporting the timber, and the owner or other person having control or management of any vehicle which is at the date of this Order being used in timber haulage shall within one (week) after that date give similar notice in writing specifying the approximate tonnage remaining to be transported and the type or types of vehicles used. References in this clause to the County Surveyor shall in relation to Scotland be construed as references to the Road Surveyor or official charged with the supervision of the roads by whatever name called.

(5) Any person affected by this Order who fails to comply with the provisions thereof or with any directions given by any Road Control Officer thereunder will be guilty of a summary offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations and liable to the penalties mentioned in those Regulations.

(6) In the application of this Order to Ireland the expression "local highway authorities" means the Council of the county or county borough in which the road is situated, or in the case of a road the entire maintenance of which is undertaken by the Council of an urban county district, that Council.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF FEMALE SORTING ASSISTANT IN THE GENERAL POST OFFICE, LONDON, AND IN THE GENERAL REGISTER OFFICE, LONDON.

These Regulations are liable to alteration for future examinations.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 15 and 18. If an Examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of April in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of October in that year.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served for two full consecutive years in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

Persons transferred to situations in the Post Office from a Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking, on the absorption of such Company or Undertaking by the Post Office, may reckon as if it were service in a situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, their continuous service in the Post Office, as well as so much of their previous continuous service in the Telephone Company or Undertaking (or in any Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking previously absorbed by it) as was rendered in situations for which a Civil Service Certificate is ordinarily required.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) That they are unmarried or widows.
- (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.
- (c) That they are natural born or naturalised British subjects. A candidate who was not born or whose father was not born within the British Dominions or whose mother was at any time before marriage of enemy nationality will not be eligible for admission to examination for appointment to the Post Office unless she has obtained the special permission of the Civil Service Commissioners to compete.

3. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as may from time to time be fixed.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. Reading MS.
2. Writing.
3. Spelling.
4. Arithmetic.
5. Geography.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.
