## ADECLARATION,

For the Strict Discipline of the Army, and Due Payment of Quarters.

WILLIAM R.

Hireas it is Necoffary, That the Forces which are Maintained within this Our Kingdom

are Maintained within this Own Kingdom for the Defence and Security thereof, be k pt in grea Order and Defetiquine; And that Own Subjects may not faifer by any Deforders on Michinaviour of any Officers or Seldiers within Our Pay and Entertainment, We have thought his hereby withless Own Royal Will and Pleasure, That in what Place four any of Our Forces shall Pass or Remain, they shall duly by their Dunters, wind shall not, upon any Presence whathever, Refes or Avoid the same: To which Purpose, We do including that your the Arrival of any Regiment, Troop is Company, in any Garifon, Town or Place, Publication be immediately made by Sound of Trumpet or Beat of Drum, and Notice given to the Chief Magistrate or Civil Officer, Teatno Officer or Soldier be Trusted in their Quarters beyond the Rates that have been, or shall be Presented by Ast of Parliament, and that according to the said Rates, the Quarters the Rates that have been, or shall be Prescribed by Ast of Parliament, and that according to the Said Rates, the Quarters shall be Duly Paid and Anjwered.
