Privy Council Office, 9th April, 1918. THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT, 1918.

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council the Draft of an Order in Council prescribing, for England and Wales, and for Ireland, forms and dates for the purposes of the Representation of the People Act, 1918.

And notice is hereby further given, that copies of the proposed Draft Order in Council can be obtained by any Public Body in England and Wales, or in Ireland, from one of the undermentioned branches of His Majesty's Stationery Office, viz.:—Imperial House, Kingsway, London, W.C.; 1, St. Andrew's Crescent, Cardiff; 37, Peter Street, Manchester; Messrs. The Draft Order has been published as a Statutory Rule and Order having provisional effect and is numbered 392. The Order in Council of the 4th March, 1918, which is referred to in the said Order, and also contains

registration forms, is numbered 315. The price of each Order is 2d., or, including postage,  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d.

THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT, 1918.

Notice is hereby given, that the Order in Council referred to in the foregoing Notice also prescribes forms and dates for the purposes of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, in Scotland, but inasmuch as Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, does not apply to Scotland, the said Order in Council has been made on the 22nd March, 1918, so as to have full effect, so far as respects Scotland, on and from that date.
