

and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, both in the County of York, and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Brightside and the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, are Cures wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the Inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Brightside, and of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a Separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any Consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purpose of Divine Worship:

"And whereas in pursuance of the power and authority given by an Order of the High Court of Chancery, dated the 1st day of August, 1854, confirming a Scheme for the future application of the income of the Trust Property of the Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of the Town and Parish of Sheffield, in the said County of York, and of an Order of the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, dated the 4th day of March, 1874, in partial variation of the Scheme established by the said first-mentioned Order, the said Burgesses and Commonalty have proposed to appropriate the sum of £200 per annum out of that part of the income of their Trust Property which is applicable to Ecclesiastical Purposes in and towards the Endowment of the District herein proposed to be constituted:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have signified by a Writing, bearing date the 21st day of March, 1918, under our Common Seal, our approval of and consent to the proposed Endowment of the said proposed District:

"And whereas the said Endowment of £200 per annum has been so appropriated as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of Patronage of the said District or New Parish, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned to the Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of Sheffield aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Brightside, and of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, which are more particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written, and are delineated and set forth on the *Map or Plan* hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Margaret, Brightside.'

"And we further recommend and propose

that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, shall, without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be vested in and shall be exercised by the said Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of the Town and Parish of Sheffield, and their Successors.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"All which we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Margaret, Brightside, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District) of Brightside, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, both in the County of York, and in the Diocese of Sheffield, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the centre of Brightside Bridge which carries Weedon Street across the River Don, and extending thence westward along the middle of Weedon Street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brightside Lane and Meadowhall Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Meadowhall Road for a distance of 16 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Colliery Road, and extending thence, first westward, then south-westward, and then north-westward, along the middle of Colliery Road for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Burslem Street, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to the trigonometrical point at or near the centre of the ancient Camp in Wincobank Wood, and continuing thence north-westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the northern boundary of Wincobank Wood, upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Brightside from the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, and also upon the parliamentary boundary of the City of Sheffield, and extending thence, first north-eastward, and then in various directions; along the said parliamentary boundary of the City of Sheffield (thereby following in one part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Brightside from the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, and in another part the boundary which divides the Chapelry of Tinsley, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank), for a distance of 2 miles or thereabouts to the point in the middle of the old course of the River Don where the boundaries of the said Chapelry of Tinsley, the said New Parish of
