

(iii) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any offence committed against any such Order; or

(iv) affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such investigation, legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed as if this Order had not been made.

(2) Every notice which requires an occupier to adopt measures for prevention of the spread of Wart Disease and which has been served under an Order hereby revoked shall have effect as if it were a notice duly served under this Order.

Application of the Order.

18. This Order shall apply to England and Wales.

Short Title.

19. This Order may be cited as the WART DISEASE OF POTATOES ORDER OF 1918.

**CORN PRODUCTION ACT, 1917.
AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD
(ENGLAND AND WALES).**

Notice of an Order proposed to be made under Section 12 (1) (b) of the above Act with respect to "Benefits or Advantages."

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales), duly established and constituted

under Section 5 (1) of the above Act and the regulations made by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries dated the 8th November, 1917, hereby give notice, as required by the Agricultural Wages Regulations, 1918, that they propose to make the following Order under the last mentioned Regulations, that is to say:—

The benefits or advantages which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purpose of any minimum rate of wages for time work which may be fixed under the above Act, are hereby defined to be the supply by an employer to a worker of

- (1) Milk (including skimmed or separated milk).
- (2) Potatoes.

And the value at which they are to be so reckoned for such purpose is hereby defined to be as follows, that is to say:—

- (1) In the case of Milk so supplied without payment the current wholesale price in the district.
- (2) In the case of Potatoes so supplied without payment, the current wholesale price in the district at the time when the maincrop of potatoes were lifted.
